PACKET UPDATE

Newer radios coming on the market are now being built up as Software Defined. The same is true for some of the more sophisticated hardware for amateurs. Software Defined means that instead of having a circuit board with components wired to do a function they put a computer on the board and program it to do the same function. The advantage is if you need to update the functions of the board you can do it by just changing the software in the computer instead of buying a whole new board. Most manufacturers going to this usually offer updates for free via the internet so you always have the latest functions on your gear. Ten Tec is big on this for their new radios. Rig expert has just come out with their newest interface for the digital modes. This unit connects to the computer with just one USB cable. No power supply is needed as it runs from power supplied by the USB cable. The sound card is built in the unit which means you can still run your computer sound card for other tasks. You can even run multiple radios by plugging in two units on the same computer. The unit called the "NAVIGATOR " can also be upgraded with free flash rom updates for the interface from the company. You will see this type of construction will become more common on the radios and interfaces we buy in the future. For more information on the NAVIGATOR check out their website at www.rigexpert.com

AMATEUR HARDWARE UPDATE

Many times we want to operate portable using Morse Code. This may be for field day activities or just for emergency use. One of the items that gets the most abuse is our Morse Code keys. They are out in the open and can get knocked around and damaged. Looking at all the military keys for sale on Ebay I noticed a lot of them have a cover or shell around them for protection. This is a really nice feature to have. Even if the key always stayed indoors it would still keep dust and dirt off the contacts. Some military keys like this go for up to 100 dollars. This month's project is to make a simple Morse Code key cover to offer protection to our keys. I looked around for a small metal box to put a key in and found a cheap wall mounted electrical switch box. These are available at all the local hardware stores for under 5 dollars. The one I got was made to mount a light switch in. It is made of steel and painted gray. By drilling a couple of holes through the bottom to mount the key and one on the back for the wire it was ready to go. I popped the front knockout off to allow the key to come out the front of the box. I also put some stick on rubber foot pads on the bottom of the box to keep it from slipping around. This worked out great and now I have a key to carry out in the field that will take some rough treatment.
