STARS AND STRIPES SPECIAL EVENT HONORS AMERICA'S MILITARY

The historical Stars and Stripes Museum in Bloomfield, Missouri, birthplace of the Stars and Stripes Military Newspaper in 1861, will join forces with area amateur radio clubs to honor America's military around the world. Two local amateur radio clubs plan to operate a special event amateur radio station on June 8th and 9th and have received a special call sign "W0S" from the FCC for this event. The station will be calling "CQ", the internationally known signal to alert other amateur radio operators around the world to call in. Stations that respond to the "CQ" will have the opportunity to learn about the museum, its activities, and the newspaper which is sent to military personnel around the world. Operators making contact with the special event station can receive a special certificate with a picture of the museum and information about its programs. Amateurs collect these certificates as part of their personal history with amateur radio and to confirm their contact with the Stars and Stripes Special Event Station. It is not uncommon for amateur radio operators to make contacts with far away places as Africa, Australia, Asia, Europe and the Middle East. The museum hopes that some of the military personnel stationed around the world will get to talk to the folks back home and become more aware of the Museum's support of our troops. The Bootheel and the SEMo Amateur Radio Clubs invite the public to come by the museum on highway 25 South of Bloomfield to tour the museum and see amateur radio in operation.

AMATEUR PACKET UPDATE


One thing we always look for is a good source of parts to use in building our radio projects. RF connectors, non inductive resistors, high voltage capacitors, and meters are just a few of the parts we may need. MFJ Enterprises has just started to sell electronics parts for amateurs. For the first time I have seen they actually show these parts in their new 2007 catalog. They now have 4 pages of electronics replacement parts. They also include high voltage transformers, tubes, along with high voltage variable caps they use in their antenna tuners. You can also buy their roller inductor by itself along with a full set of knobs. They carry a line of high power RF rotary switches for projects. AMATEUR HARDWARE UPDATE

Many times we want very small extra morse code keys we can carry in our pocket or just use for the fun of it. Tiny morse code or spy keys have been made through the years. MorseX has sold a small straight key for several years now. One source of small keys I never thought about was toy keys. These have been made through the years and show up on Ebay from time to time. One example I have seen is the G.I. Joe key that went with his radio pack setup. A couple that I found were actually given as prizes in boxes of cereal in the 1950s. These little keys were known as the Rin Tin Tin keys because they had that name printed on them. These had mechanical clickers on them so you could practice morse code. By removing the clicker and putting in a ball point pin spring on the front of the key I was able to make it function like a real morse code key. Heavy duty aluminum tape at the back and two screws provided the contacts for the key. The logic was reversed with this setup with the contact being closed when the key was not in use so I used a small relay so I could reverse that logic so the relay contact would close when I pressed the key. The picture shows my modified key along side of an unmodified key. Keep an eye out for these on Ebay. They are collectable and a lot of fun to play with.


