Listen Up Veterans, FYI (submitted by Joe Lowenthal WA4OVO)

WASHINGTON, D.C. - U.S. Senator Jim Inhofe (R-Okla.) today praised the passage by unanimous consent of his bill (S.1877) clarifying U.S. law to allow veterans and servicemen not in uniform to salute the flag. Current law (US Code Title 4, Chapter 1) states that veterans and servicemen not in uniform should place their hand over their heart without clarifying whether they can or should salute the flag.

"The salute is a form of honor and respect, representing pride in one's military service," Senator Inhofe said. "Veterans and service members continue representing the military services even when not in uniform. Unfortunately, current U.S. law leaves confusion as to whether veterans and service members out of uniform can or should salute the flag. My legislation will clarify this regulation, allowing veterans and servicemen alike to salute the flag, whether they are in uniform or not. "I look forward to seeing those who have served saluting proudly at baseball games, parades, and formal events. I believe this is an appropriate way to honor and recognize the 25 million veterans in the United States who have served in the military and remain as role models to others citizens. Those who are currently serving or have served in the military have earned this right, and their recognition will be an inspiration to others."

This Bill was passed July 25, 2007. Please pass the word to your fellow veterans.

AMATEUR PACKET UPDATE

Many Computer programs have been written for Ham Radio over the years. Newer programs take advantage of the internet to allow for another way to communicate by using it as the pathway for data or voice instead of the airwaves. A program called CW communicator has been written that allows you to send and receive morse code on your computer with others on the internet. This program allows you connect to a server to see who else is running the program. By setting up a virtual frequency you can then send and receive CW with others. The interface to hook up the key is the DB15 connector which is the joystick port on the computer. AMATEUR HARDWARE UPDATE

Many amateurs that run Morse Code realize that over the years sending code has changed. The first way was the straight key. This worked well but led to fatigue for some and a condition known as "GLASS ARM". Today we know it as repetitive motion syndrome. Of course the bug was a great advancement over the straight key allowing sending to be faster and easier. Iambic or dual paddle operation with an electronic keyer is the method of choice today. One of the other earlier methods used was was called "tapper style". This used two straight keys side by side. Using two fingers you sent dits with one finger and dahs with the other. You can easily build up your own tapper style key easily. I used two doorbell buttons mounted on a board. I wired mine up to run to my electronic keyer with one switch hooked to the dit input and the other hooked to the dah input so I would have automatic dihs and dahs. You can wire up the switches in parallel if you want to do the tapper style to old way manually creating all the dihs and dahs. Give this a try and see if you like it. It makes a good alternative to the straight key.




