Practice tests are highly recommended. The www.qrz.com website is free. To access the sample tests, scroll down and click on Practice Tests on the left side of the QRZ home page. Another site is www.hamtestsonline.com. It costs \$49.95, but it is good for 2 years for the Technician, General and Extra Class tests.

The 35-question FCC exam will be given at the end of class by a Volunteer Examiner (VE) team. There is a \$14.00 ARRL VE Exam fee.

Power Supply Recall

Per the ARRL Home Page:

US Government Recalls RadioShack Power Supplies (Jul 3, 2008) -- On July 2, the US Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), in cooperation with RadioShack, announced a voluntary recall of 13.8 V dc power supplies. The CPSC said that consumers should stop using these power supplies immediately, as the "power supplies are wired incorrectly, posing electrocution and fire hazards." No injuries have been reported in conjunction with the power supplies that were sold in RadioShack stores nationwide from October 2004-January 2008 for between \$50 and \$85. Manufactured in China, the CPSC said that the recall involves RadioShack 13.8 V DC Power Supplies, catalog numbers 22-507 and 22-508 with date codes from 08A04 through 01A08. Date code format is MMAYY where MM is the month and YY is the year. The catalog number and date code are located on the back of the power supply. Power supplies with a green dot on the product and the product's packaging have already been repaired and are not included in the recall. The CPSC recommends for consumers to unplug the recalled power supply immediately and take it to any RadioShack store for a free repair. Registered owners of the recalled power supplies will be mailed a notice. For additional information, contact RadioShack at 800-843-7422 anytime, or visit their Web site. Link to this item

AMATEUR PACKET UPDATE


Hendricks QRP kits has several radio kits on the market. One of their newest is the portable field radio. This kit is designed by Steve Weber who has come out with a lot of QRP kits in the past. The kit has all surface mount components pre-mounted. It includes all the parts , P.C. board , case and knobs to build the radio. It is a VFO controlled 3 band unit that covers 40, 30, and 20 meters at about 3 to 5 watts output. The mode is CW only. The unit is very small and portable and has a place for internal batteries. The unit also has a memory keyer built in and a digital readout of frequency. This radio also has another plus in that it is the cheapest kit of this kind around. The unit cost is \$200.00 for the kit. The power use is also very low on this kit at about 50 MA. The unit will also work at low voltages like 9 vdc. They sell an optional small paddle kit for the unit for \$40.00. The unit has pushbutton tuning with scan and lots of other features for the price. AMATEUR HARDWARE UPDATE

Many amateurs use computers as part of their station setups. Currently there is a lot of software out written for the amateur community. We have programs for logging, testing, and digital modes. Sometimes these are written by other amateurs who offer them free on the internet. One unique program I found was written in France. It is called Ehocw. This program will allow you to send and receive morse code. This is nothing new as other have had this capability. This program will decode morse code on the computer screen if you want to. The best feature of this program is the memory keyer built in. You can actually hook up your paddles to the computer via the joystick or the serial port of the computer. It also has a bunch of memory slots you click on to send a message you have stored. The paddles hooked up to the computer means you do not need an electronic keyer circuit in hardware. It also allows you to practice sending with your computer and a set of paddles. I hooked mine to the serial port of the computer. A female 9 pin D shell connector and hooking up three wires for common, dit, and dah was all that was required. The program lets you adjust your code speed and listen on your computer speaker system. You can also hook up a line to key your transmitter to send the code over the air. The web address for the free download is <http://www.f8eho.net/eng/>


