CLASS IN PROGRESS

Basic Electronics Class 7-08 – September 27 – November 8, 2008

Basic Electronics Class 7-08 started on Saturday, September 27th with 14 enthusiastic students. The course is a preparatory bridge between the General Class license and Extra Class course. This class is using *The ARRL Understanding Basic Electronics* book. It covers the mathematics required for Extra Class exam as well as most of the electronics. Dean Honadle N2LAZ is the primary instructor. Dean has 10 years teaching electronics in the Navy, as well as 20 years at State Tech. Bill Stevens KI4TQA is assisting.

There is no charge for the class, but registration is required. Advanced study of *The ARRL Ham Radio License Manual* is highly suggested as well as study of the 392 question and answer Technical Class License question pool. Memphis Amateur, 1465 Wells Station Rd, 683-9125 is a local ham radio store that sells the manuals.

Practice tests are highly recommended. The www.qrz.com website is free. To access the sample tests, scroll down and click on Practice Tests on the left side of the QRZ home page. Another site is www.hamtestsonline.com. It costs \$49.95, but it is good for 2 years for the Technician, General and Extra Class tests.

The 35-question FCC exam will be given at the end of class by a Volunteer Examiner (VE) team. There is a \$14.00 ARRL VE Exam fee.

AMATEUR PACKET UPDATE

Many times we want to put up antenna for use on the HF bands to work digital modes. These may be low enough on the band that we need a cheap antenna that will get the job done. One of the cheapest antennas today is a wire type antenna. It can be a Zepp or dipole ETC . vertical antennas and beams all work well but wire is still the cheapest way to go. One company called DX Engineering has kits for wire antenna at a really good price. They sell a universal wire antenna kit for under \$20.00 . They also sell connectors and baluns. For accessories they have are rope to support the wire elements and ladder line supports. DX engineering also sells multiband wire antennas for about \$50.00 . AMATEUR HARDWARE UPDATE

Many times we build up our own antennas. By doing this we learn more about propagation and antenna theory as well as saving money. It also allows us to have back antennas ready to deploy in times of emergency. One of the most common antenna types to build up is the wire antenna. The dipole is one of the most popular as it can be built for a particular band and trimmed for a good match. We either run coax or ladder line from our radios out and up to the antenna. At the antenna we have to hookup the two connections to our wires of the dipole etc. Some folks make their own connection point out of a piece of scrap plastic but manufacturers make this part to make it easier to homebrew a wire antenna. Some are molded plastic with a strain relief made for ladder line. Others have an SO239 connector built in. They also have a way to hang up the antenna with a ring or hook. There are many different styles for this connectors. Some also include a balun as part of the units. You can buy one of these and build up different types of antennas to try them out.


