

There is no charge for the class, but registration is required. Advanced study of *The ARRL Ham Radio License Manual* is highly suggested as well as study of the 392 questions and answer Technical Class License question pool. Memphis Amateur, 1465 Wells Station Rd, 683-9125 is a local ham radio store that sells the manuals.

Practice tests are highly recommended. The <a href="www.qrz.com">www.qrz.com</a> website is free. To access the sample tests, scroll down and click on Practice Tests on the left side of the QRZ home page. Another site is <a href="www.hamtestonline.com">www.hamtestonline.com</a>. It costs \$49.95, but it is good for 2 years for the Technician, General and Extra Class tests.

The 35-question FCC exam will be given at the end of class by a Volunteer Examiner (VE) team. There is a \$14.00 ARRL VE Exam fee.

### AMATEUR PACKET UPDATE .....

When running digital modes we have a radio and a computer along with software to run the mode we chose. This is the most common way we run digital modes. Small Wonder Labs has brought back their PSK31 kit for 80 meters. It is called the warbler. This kit is a radio transmitter and receiver setup for the frequency range used for PSK31 which is around 3580 KHZ. The unit runs on 12 volts DC and has hookups to hook directly to the sound card of your computer. The transmitter output is low power which is all that is needed for long range communications on PSK31. The kit contains the PC board and board parts for the kit. It hooks to the sound card of your computer and runs popular PSK31 software. If you are looking at a cheap way to get into PSK31 check this one out from Small wonder labs. The cost is \$55.00. ### AMATEUR HARDWARE UPDATE .....

Many of us operate QRP rigs. These are small low power units that allow communications with other amateurs. These units whether they are kit or factory built are designed to be used with stereo headphones when used in the field. When operating at home we want to be able to run a speaker on the radio. Some of these QRP units do not have the audio output power to run a speaker directly. They need and audio amplifier to drive the 8 ohm speakers. As it turns out there is a simple way to get around this problem. Most modern computer stereo speakers are amplified. The units have their on plug in power supply. The standard plug is the small 3.5 mm stereo type. Some of the QRP rigs have this type of mating jack which means you can just plug the amplified speakers in and you are ready to go. Other QRP rigs run a ¼ inch plug. By getting the proper plug in adapter you can plug your computer stereo speakers into any QRP rig for that room filling sound. This makes for comfortable listening for longer periods copying code. Check hamfest and computer supply house for these. They can often be found for under \$10.00 for the two speakers and power supply.


The secondary frequency is the 147.360, +600kHz, 107.2 tone on Methodist North.
