#### Basic Electronics 5-09 October 3-November 7, 2009

The Basic Electronics class, which is a bridge between the General Class license and the Extra Class license, is to begin on October 3rd for 6 Saturdays from 9am to 1pm. Dean Honadle N2LAZ is the instructor. Dennis Foster KJ4BDU will assist.

The course text is the ARRL's *Understanding Basic Electronics*, First Edition, Seventh Printing 2006 or later (ISBN 0-87259-398-3), ARRL Order No. 3983. Each student will need a scientific calculator. The suggested calculator is the Casio fx-260 solar calculator. The calculator can be purchased at Walmart for \$8.88 plus tax.

Memphis Amateur, 1465 Wells Station Rd, 683-9125 is a local ham radio store which may have the manuals. Barnes & Noble also sell the manuals.

Practice tests are highly recommended. The <a href="www.qrz.com">www.qrz.com</a> website is free. To access the sample tests, scroll down and click on Practice Tests on the left side of the QRZ home page. Another site is <a href="www.hamtestonline.com">www.hamtestonline.com</a>. It costs \$59.95, but it is good for 2 years for the Technician, General and Extra Class tests.

The 35-question FCC exam will be given at the end of class by a Volunteer Examiner (VE) team. There is a \$15.00 ARRL VEC FCC exam fee.

#### AMATEUR PACKET UPDATE .....

Many times Amateurs like to build up their own QRP circuits. We often build small QRP transmitters, Receivers, and accessories to use in the shack. Morse code transmitters and receivers are the easiest to build. On the internet there are a lot of sites that have useful information and circuits for amateurs. One site is QSI.net which has lot of good information. They have several transmitters for 80,40,20,15, and 10 meter from 400 milliwatts to 7 watts out. They also have diagrams for simple sensitive receivers you can build. On the accessories page they have a 2 amp 12 volt DC power supply you can build. They even have an antenna section for simple easy to build HF and VHF antennas. They include a HF antenna build from 300 ohm twin lead antenna line. #### AMATEUR HARDWARE UPDATE .....

Many times we need to have protection for our gear and equipment when we are on the go. Over the years the military has developed cases for their stuff. Military cases are built to be very strong and many times waterproof. One example is the 30 caliber ammo case on the surplus market. It is made of painted steel. It has a strong hinged lid that can be removed. It is soldered all around to be waterproof. The top has a full gasket to seal up and keep out the elements. Since these are usually OD green they can be repainted to any color you want. They make a great way to store emergency supplies for use when we need them. They also make sure our equipment gets where it needs to go without getting damaged. The other nice thing is the price. These surplus cases cost about \$5.00 to \$6.00 on the surplus market. You can buy larger ones and they even have some made on fiberglass instead of steel. These things are made to last a long time and are very tough. The one in the picture I painted orange and use to store my gel cell batteries and charger for emergency use. Pick up some of these for your storage and transport needs. They are a bargain.




