TECHNICIAN CLASS

If you are interested in a Technician license class, please let us know of your interest by sending me an email at wa4ovo@yahoo.com with subject line "Technician Class." Or you can go to the Delta Club webpage www.deltaclub.org; click on Training Classes; and then click on Technician Class to send an email, or call at 901-683-2701. We usually publish class schedules a month or two in advance. You will be notified by email or phone when the class is set.

There is no charge for the class, but registration is required. Advanced study of *The ARRL Ham Radio License Manual* is highly suggested as well as study of the 392 question and answer Technical Class License question pool. Barnes & Noble Booksellers sells the manual. You can purchase it online from www.arrl.org/catalog or on Amazon.com. The list price is \$24.95

Practice tests are highly recommended. The www.qrz.com website is free. To access the sample tests, click on Main Menu to the right of the Search button on the QRZ Home Page. Scroll down and click on Practice Amateur Radio Exams. Click on Start Test to enter QRZ Practice Test Center. Click on Technician 35 Questions. Click on Wait For Correct. (This feature gives you the ability to answer again to get the correct answer if you miss the first time. On each answer it will either show Wrong Answer or Correct.) Click on Begin Test. Statistics are given at the top of the screen with the number of Completed questions, the Accuracy percentage, and the Overall percentage of questions completed on the test. Be sure to study multiple QRZ tests. The first test is only the first question from each of the 35 subgroups of the question pool. The second test is only the second question from each of the 35 subgroups, and so on. It is recommended to take at least 15 of the sample tests to be able to see all 392 question pool questions.

Another site is www.hamtestonline.com. It costs \$59.95, but it is good for 2 years for the Technician, General and Extra Class tests.

The 35-question FCC exam will be given at the end of class by a Volunteer Examiner (VE) team. There is a \$15.00 ARRL VEC FCC exam fee.

AMATEUR PACKET UPDATE

Upgrading our ham ticket is done by taking a test with a question pool by the FCC. These tests are set up with a number of questions taken from a question pool. These are selected by random and given as the questions for a license class. They have an internet site where you can practice taking the test from the question pool. This not only gets you familiar with questions but also gives you practice in taking the test in the format you will see it when you take the real thing. The site is called ham test online. They have a trial period so you can practice taking test. For a subscription fee they allow you to take as many of the random tests you want for a class for 2 years. They have test for all US classes also have tests for the Canadian license. So people can learn better by using this testing method. If you are interested in trying this out check them out. AMATEUR HARDWARE UPDATE

Many amateurs who operate morse code use a paddle for operation. Since the newest keyer chips support iambic operation separate dit and dah paddles are the newest method. This has actually been around since the late early 1960s. The reason is by using these with keyer electronics with both dit and dah memories with auto repeat the hand motion can be decreased using the iambic squeeze keyer method. Paddles before then had only one lever. That is still almost 50 years ago even using the latest keyers you can use these older paddles. These older paddles are seen at hamfests and online at sites like Ebay. Many times you can get these at a bargain price and have a collectable paddle you can use for sending morse code. I bought an older Trac Key paddle off Ebay recently. The price was about \$25.00 because the return spring was missing. I repaired the paddle and cleaned it up. Checkout showed it worked well and a good feel for paddles 50 years old. So if you need a set of iambic paddles do not forget the used market as there were a lot of different styles and brands built over the years.

Where Does the Money Go?

What you get for your membership dues

Recently at a club board meeting I heard a board member comment that he'd been asked what one gets for one's membership dues. We were discussing financial issues at the time of course, and I mentioned that many of our newcomers may not truly be aware of what their membership dues provide.

As we all know, the Delta club is an active club. We provide communications for numerous public service events throughout the year, as well as ongoing support to the National Weather Service Skywarn program. Supporting these efforts requires a variety of tools and systems. Let me briefly talk about them.

At events such as Field Day and Jamboree on the Air we deploy a well equipped antenna support system mounted on a trailer. This system requires maintenance, of course. The trailer must be licensed, essential systems it contains such as tires and brakes maintained, along with rotators and other mechanical systems.

The club operates numerous repeater systems in the Memphis area. We all forget when we pick up that one watt handheld radio that without these repeater systems those little handhelds with the rubber dummy loads wouldn't be worth too much to us. Some of these repeaters require a phone line connection, not just for the ubiquitous autopatch we appreciate, but for actual off air control which meets FCC requirements Repeaters by their very nature are complex systems, and ongoing costs to maintain them and keep them ready must be paid. Duplexers, controllers and feed line aren't cheap. In most cases repeaters such as those the club provides don't feed their antenna systems with regular coaxial cable that can be found at the ubiquitous candy store. Just have a look at prices for 7/8 inch hard line some time.

For the most part we're lucky here in the Memphis area. Owners of broadcast towers and tall buildings in many locales charge premium prices for that high real estate, and get it. Commercial repeater systems want those high spots for their antennas too. But, we in the midsouth are blessed with property owners who understand the public service benefit provided by their friendly local hams. But, even if no rent is paid, we must keep those systems working. Not only do they just benefit those we serve in organized public service events, but they serve every one of us who use them, day in and day out.

You and I have the option of unplugging our gear when that electrical storm is anticipated. Repeater systems don't have that luxury. People depend on them to maintain communications. Sometimes those communications are essential to the saving of life or the protection of property. This makes those controllers and other sensitive electronics vulnerable. When these systems take a lightning hit spares have to be on hand to easily swap in replacing disabled components.

Also, the good folks at the Ellendale Church of Christ provide us easy and convenient access to the meeting site. We have the use of their kitchen facilities to some degree, use of space for VE testing as well as meetings. It behooves us to contribute to the ongoing cost of their operations as well. Add to this liability insurance, post office box rent and other ongoing expenses.

Your membership dues and those extra drawing tickets you buy keep this organization operating in the black. On behalf of your outgoing officers and board members, thanks for your support. Please continue to support the programs and services offered by the Delta Club in the future.





Delta Club 146.82 Net Preamble GOOD EVENING: This is calling this session of the DELTA CLUB'S TRAFFIC AND INFORMATION NET. This net is affiliated with the ARRL and the NTS and is organized to pass traffic in and out of the mid - south area, in addition to providing information about club events and amateur related topics. This net meets nightly at 8:00 p.m. CT except the second Tuesday of the month on the 146.82 W4BS repeater and may require a pl. tone of 107.2 Hz. All stations will refrain from transmitting without being acknowledged by net control. All licensed amateurs are encouraged to participate. Before we begin, is there any station with emergency or priority traffic? (Take immediately) During this net should any station have emergency or priority traffic please use a double break followed by your call sign. Is there an NTS Liaison station on frequency? Is their any station wishing to list formal written traffic? Does any station have announcements for the net? (Eliminate the following sentence unless there are announcements.) Does any station have any questions or need any fills? We will now take check-ins. Are there any stations that are mobile, on battery power, or needing to leave early, if so please come now phonetically with your suffix only and please remember to spread them out?
