The President's Corner

As everyone knows, there have been issues for quite some time with the 146.82 repeater "kerchunking". The transmitter was temporarily shut down and the repeater is receiving interference from what appears to be a digital signal. To solve the problem, the first attempt was to turn on the 107.2 tone, but there is an issue with activating the tone. The current plan is to install the "new" ICOM repeater as the 146.82 machine and then attempt to correct any issues with the old repeater. We will need to determine if it is repairable or if it has reached its usable life. Unfortunately, when we purchased the ICOM, we didn't buy a new controller. It really doesn't make sense to connect the new repeater to the practical antique controller used by the current 146.82 machine. So, I think we need to discuss buying a new controller for the new repeater. Even if we get the old repeater working properly, we will still need a controller for the ICOM repeater. This indirectly brings up the subject of phone patch availability on the 82 repeater. I know we have dodged the issue for several months about phone patch capability on the 82 machine. Everyone has their own opinion, so gather your thoughts and make your own assessment if we need a phone patch on 82 and if it is worth the expense of a phone line for the repeater. We currently pay slightly more than \$60 per month for a phone line that could be replaced by a 440Mhz link to control the repeater. I think we need to discuss the issues and, if possible, make a decision at next week's meeting.

AMATEUR HARDWARE UPDATE

Many times we operate during emergencies and natural disasters. During these times we may be without power from the power company which means we will be on battery power. Many amateurs have batteries at home for power. One of my emergency batteries is a large lead acid battery. I would put it on my battery charger every month or so to make sure it had a charge. What I needed was a way to automatically keep it totally charged and ready to go when the power went out. I found the answer at a company called Harbor Freight. They sell a small battery maintenance charger that can be hooked up all the time and will automatically keep a full charge on the battery. This works with everything from motorcycle to car batteries. This unit is not made to charge up a dead battery but is designed to keep it at full charge topped off without overcharging and damaging the battery. The unit normally cost about \$10.00 but they put them on sale for \$4.95 during the year. The unit has a status LED and clamps to hook up to the battery. The unit is the Model 42292 Battery Float Charger. Now I know I will have a fully charged battery to use if I need it during an emergency. If you need a good float charger for a great price check this one out from Harbor Freight.





TECHNICIAN CLASS

If you are interested in the first amateur license class, Technician, please let us know of by sending an email to wa4ovo@yahoo.com with subject line "Technician Class" and give name, email address, and a contact phone number (preferably a cell number). Or you can go to the Delta Club webpage www.deltaclub.org click on Training Classes; then click on Technician Class to send an email, or call at 901-683-2701. We usually publish class schedules a month or two in advance. You will be notified by email or phone when the class is set.

There is no charge for the class, but registration is required. Advanced study of *The ARRL Ham Radio License Manual* is strongly suggested as well as study of the 392 question and answer Technical Class License question pool. Barnes & Noble Booksellers sells the manual. You can purchase it online from <a href="https://www.arrl.org/catalog.

Please note that a new Technician License question pool has been submitted by the NCVEC (http://www.ncvec.org/page.php?id=356) for review before publication. Testing for the new question pool starts July 1, 2010.

Practice tests are highly recommended. The www.qrz.com website is free. To access the sample tests, click on Main Menu to the right of the Search button on the QRZ Home Page. Scroll down and click on Practice Amateur Radio Exams. Click on Start Test to enter QRZ Practice Test Center. Click on Technician 35 Questions. Click on Wait For Correct. (This feature gives you the ability to answer again to get the correct answer if you miss the first time. On each answer it will either show Wrong Answer or Correct.) Click on Begin Test. Statistics are given at the top of the screen with the number of Completed questions, the Accuracy percentage, and the Overall percentage of questions completed on the test. Be sure to study multiple QRZ tests. The first test is only the first question from each of the 35 subgroups of the question pool. The second test is only the second question from each of the 35 subgroups, and so on. It is recommended to take at least 15 of the sample tests to be able to see all 392-question pool questions.

Another very good site is www.hamtestonline.com. It costs \$74.95, but it is good for 2 years for the Technician, General and Extra Class tests. There are a number of other free sample-test sites. Just Google ham radio practice exams.

The 35-question FCC exam will be given at the end of class by a Volunteer Examiner (VE) team. There is a \$15.00 ARRL VEC FCC exam fee.

GENERAL CLASS
