MARS ARMED FORCES DAY CROSSBAND EXERCISE May 8, 2010

This year the MARS Armed Forces Day crossband exercise will be Saturday, May 8, 2010. The Memphis MARS contingent will operate Saturday from the Mariana, AR Corps of Engineer Huxtable Pumping Station which is about 60 miles from the Mississippi River and I-40.

Setup will begin on Friday, May 7th. We will caravan from the Poplar Plaza Kroger gas station parking lot at 7am to the Mariana, AR Corps of Engineer Huxtable Pumping Station location where we will set up a 3-element beam on the roof with three long-wires off the sides. A forward position about a half mile down stream will also be setup so we can operate on the same bands without interference. Lunch of Firehouse sub sandwiches, chips and drinks will be provided. Usually, we leave about 3pm to get back to Memphis before 5.

Saturday, May 8th, we leave the Kroger gas station parking lot at 6am. Hopefully, we will be operating by 8am until sundown (about 8pm). Lunch and continued eating will be hotdogs and hamburgers. (No actual dinner.)

Both Friday and Saturday's lunches will be provided by Mid-South Amateur Radio Association (MARA).

Anyone is welcome to come. You do not need to be a MARS member, or even a licensed ham to help operate (under the supervision of a ham). You may want to bring some cold non-alcoholic drinks.

Directions to Huxtable Pumping Station are as follows:

From the I-40 Mississippi River Bridge go west on I-40 to the Hughes Exit 265 (prox 20 miles) in Arkansas.

Turn left at exit ramp stop sign onto US 79.

Go prox 34 miles to AR Hwy 121 at the levee before Mariana.

Turn left onto Hwy 121.

Go prox ½ mile and veer to the left off levee continuing on Hwy 121.

Go prox 8 1/2 miles

Turn right onto gravel Lee County Road 513.

Go prox 1 mile. You're at the pumping station.

What the courtesy tone tells you

When using the 146.82 repeater you've probably noted that the courtesy tone it emits when you unkey changes at times. Its default tone is three different pitches, on the usual musical scale we'd call them 3 5 and 8. This indicates that everything's quite normal in the world. But, depending on time of day or need these can change automatically, or be changed by control operators. Those of us who learned old school ham radio can interpret the other signals it gives us quite easily as learned the International Morse Code. For those who didn't learn code, however, they might be difficult to interpret. Since it's again the season of tornado watches and similar activities here's a quick key to deciphering them. Sky warn: IF all is functioning normally with the control hardware and software the courtesy tone can be switched to the letter W, i.e. dih-dah-dah or one short, two longs all using the same pitch, the same pitch used for the Morse ID in

fact. When you hear the one short two longs as a courtesy tone you can be assured that Sky warn net is in session, or soon will be.

Net: during the regular 8:00 P.M. net when all is operating correctly the repeater's courtesy beep changes to a single tone transmitting the letter n, i.e. dah-dit or one long one short. This tells you that a net is in session, or soon will be.

Daily drive time: During morning and afternoon drive times, the usual hours for commuters, the courtesy tone is a single tone transmitting the letter d, i.e. dah-dih-dit, one long, two shorts. This reminds users of the machine to "drag their feet" just a bit in case somebody needs to report an accident or summon emergency assistance. Some repeaters that change the courtesy tone to indicate drive times may also shorten the time out timer. I'm not sure if the 146.82 does, but it's a nice gentle reminder for those of us using the machine during drive time to hold up a minute in case a breaking station needs to get in.

I hope my quick key to deciphering our main repeater's courtesy tones helps you.

AMATEUR HARDWARE UPDATE

Many times we buy used amateur equipment. Older QRP rigs along with newer rigs commonly use a barrel type power connector. This is because they were common and QRP rigs do not need a connector that can handle a large current like the big rigs. These come in a couple of different versions The 2.1 mm and the 2.5 mm sizes. A lot of other electronic equipment also uses this type of connector. I noticed that the plug in wall wart transformers use the types of connectors. This means when the electronics gets thrown away we can cut off these barrel connectors and reuse them by making power supply cables for our radios. These connectors typically have wire connections already made with molded connectors. We can just cut the wire at the transformer and have a connector with about 2 to 3 feet of wire ready to hook up to our power supply. Get a fused cigarette light power plug and we can use our surplus barrel connector and wire to make a mobile power supply cable. All of the QRP kits I build I use the barrel type connectors. I bought the older Drake tr22 2 meter radio and it uses a barrel connector for 12 volt power input on the back. I used one of my extra connectors to make a power supply cable for it. With so many older wall warts I just cut the cables off and keep them handy for homemade power cables when needed.

PACKET UPDATE

Many times we try different antenna on the amateur bands. Different designs work differently depending on location and how much room you have to put it up. Designs get popular for a while and then fall off in use as newer designs are introduced. One design that is now being built by several manufacturers is the 43 foot vertical. This is a 43 foot tall ground mounted pole that used for 160 to 5 meters. This length is selected so that with a required antenna tuner it can work the different bands. One advantage of the antenna is its long length. It has to be heavy duty though to make sure it can handle high winds. MFJ Enterprises now makes a version of this type of antenna. It weighs about 20 pounds and goes up in about an hour. The main advantage is it can go up where you do not have room for other designs that take up more space. If you have a tuner and you are looking for a space saving antenna to work all bands check out this design.

We usually publish class schedules a month or two in advance. You will be notified by email or phone when the class is set.

There is no charge for the class, but registration is required. Advanced study of *The ARRL Ham Radio License Manual*, 2nd *Edition, product #0830* (red manual with 2 pictures on front cover verses 3 pictures on older version) is strongly suggested as well as study of the 396 question and answer Technical Class License question pool. Barnes & Noble Booksellers may have this 2nd Edition manual. You can purchase it online from www.arrl.org/catalog or on Amazon.com. The list price is \$24.95.

The new Technician License question pool, which was approved by the NCVEC on February 1, 2010, can be seen at http://www.ncvec.org/page.php?id=356. Testing for the new question pool starts July 1, 2010.

Practice tests are highly recommended. The www.qrz.com website is free. To access the sample tests, click on Main Menu to the right of the Search button on the QRZ Home Page. Scroll down and click on Practice Amateur Radio Exams. Click on Start Test to enter QRZ Practice Test Center. Click on Technician 35 Questions. Click on Wait For Correct. (This feature gives you the ability to answer again to get the correct answer if you miss the first time. On each answer it will either show Wrong Answer or Correct.) Click on Begin Test. Statistics are given at the top of the screen with the number of Completed questions, the Accuracy percentage, and the Overall percentage of questions completed on the test. Be sure to study multiple QRZ tests. The first test is only the first question from each of the 35 subgroups of the question pool. The second test is only the second question from each of the 35 subgroups, and so on. It is recommended to take at least 15 of the sample tests to be able to see all 392-question pool questions.

Another very good site is www.hamtestonline.com. It costs \$74.95, but it is good for 2 years for the Technician, General and Extra Class tests. There are a number of other free sample-test sites. Just Google ham radio practice exams.

The 35-question FCC exam will be given at the end of class by a Volunteer Examiner (VE) team. There is a \$15.00 ARRL VEC FCC exam fee.
