AMATEUR HARDWARE UPDATE

Many times we have small batteries that we want to keep charged up. One way is to use a constant current power supply to feed them. The current limit is set and any battery can be hooked up and over time if good it will take a charge and stay topped off. Constant current battery chargers have been around a long time. By using a three terminal adjustable voltage regulator and a resistor a constant current source can be built. The regulator is an LM317 adjustable unit. The resistor I chose was a 22 ohm resistor for a maximum current of 60 milliamps. This means I can charge any battery pack from 1.2 volts up to 12 VDC that has a capacity of 600 milliamps or greater and leave the unit hooked up all the time. I put mine in a small box with input voltage and output of 60 milliamps labeled. It works well and only requires the two parts and a DC power supply. To find out more just lookup the data sheet for the LM317 regulator chip on the internet.

PACKET UPDATE

Many times when we like to build up our own equipment. They have some QRP rigs for digital modes like CW and PSK31. One thing these pieces of equipment need is a small 12 VDC power supply to run them. You can go out and buy a power supply or build up your own. Power supplies are needed with most new equipment. Learning about how power supplies work and how to repair them can be helpful. RSGB books, (CQ magazine) has a book you can get called the Power Supply Handbook. At 288 pages it contains lots of good information on how power supplies work and how to

build, modify, and repairing power supplies. They also show how to test power supplies. They even have sections on batteries, chargers, and test equipment. If you want to learn about power supplies check out this book from RSGB books. The website is www.cq-amateur-radio.com

TECHNICIAN CLASS

If you are interested in the first amateur license class, Technician, please let us know by sending an email to wa4ovo@yahoo.com with subject line "Technician Class" and give name, email address, and a contact phone number (preferably a cell number). Or you can go to the Delta Club webpage www.deltaclub.org click on Training Classes; then click on Technician Class to send an email, or call at 901-683-2701. We usually publish class schedules a month or two in advance. You will be notified by email or phone when the class is set if you send an email informing us of your desire to be in a class.

There is no charge for the class, but registration is required. Advanced study of *The ARRL Ham Radio License Manual, Second Edition, product #0830* (red manual with 2 pictures on front cover verses 3 pictures on older version) is strongly suggested as well as study of the 396 question and answer Technical Class License question pool. Barnes & Noble Booksellers may have this Second Edition manual. You can purchase it online from www.arrl.org/catalog.org/catalog.org/ on Amazon.com. The list price is \$24.95.

The new Technician License question pool, which was approved by the NCVEC on February 1, 2010, can be seen at http://www.ncvec.org/page.php?id=356. Testing for the new question pool started July 1, 2010.

Practice tests are highly recommended. The www.qrz.com website is free. To access the sample tests, click on Main Menu to the right of the Search button on the QRZ Home Page. Scroll down and click on Practice Amateur Radio Exams. Click on Start Test to enter QRZ Practice Test Center. Click on Technician 35 Questions. Click on Wait For Correct. (This feature gives you the ability to answer again to get the correct answer if you miss the first time. On each answer it will either show Wrong Answer or Correct.) Click on Begin Test. Statistics are given at the top of the screen with the number of Completed questions, the Accuracy percentage, and the Overall percentage of questions completed on the test. Be sure to study multiple QRZ tests. The first test is only the first question from each of the 35 subgroups of the question pool. The second test is only the second question from each of the 35 subgroups, and so on. It is recommended to take at least 15 of the sample tests to be able to see all 396-question pool questions.

A very good site is <u>www.hamtestonline.com</u>. It costs \$74.95, but it is good for 2 years for the Technician, General and Extra Class tests. There are a number of other free sample-test sites. The following are some other ham radio practice exam sites:

The 35-question FCC exam will be given at the end of class by a Volunteer Examiner (VE) team. There is a \$15.00 ARRL VEC FCC exam fee.
