AMATEUR PACKET UPDATE

Many of us run digital modes on amateur radio, Morse code, PSK 31, AMTOR, and RTTY are just a few. These modes can do very well with low power because of their narrow bandwidth used for sending the data. QRP digital can mean worldwide communications when conditions are right on the bands. One good piece of test equipment we need is a good SWR and watts meter. This lets us make sure we are putting out the power we should be and also make sure we are matched for our antenna to get the best signal out. New radios do not like high SWR values and cut back power or on simple rigs blow the final. MFJ Enterprises has come out with a nice new addition to their line of test equipment. They have a new small QRP SWR/POWER meter for 1.8 to 50 MHz. The unit reads power levels up to 5 watts and beyond. The model 813 can read power levels down to 100 milliwatts. Most manufacturers do not offer a QRP version of their wattmeters. The other good thing about the 813 is the price of under \$40.00. If you are interested in a small QRP SWR/POWER meter for under \$40.00 with a 1 year warranty check out this one from MFJ. Their website is www.mfjenterprises.com

AMATEUR HARDWARE UPDATE

Many times when running QRP we build up transmitters. Using a homemade receiver or older receiver completes the system for transceiver operation. Sometimes receivers are not as sensitive as they could be and need a little help. One way to improve the performance is to add a preamp. Ramsey Electronics has a small 16 dB preamp board kit for RF use. The unit will amplify from 100 KHz to 1.3 GHz. It can be used on shortwave and ham radio receivers, TVs, and even frequency counters to improve performance of the unit. The kit includes a small PC board and all components needed to build the kit. It runs on 12



to 15 volts DC and draws about 30 milliamps of current. I built mine up in a surplus case painted in Heathkit colors. I mounted a power switch on the front panel and installed in and output connectors on the back for hookup to the antenna and the radio. When I tried it on my old Radio Shack receiver a signal went from S3 to S8 when I ran the preamp. Ramsey's kit number is SA-7 for the preamp kit. The kit cost about \$20.00. If you are looking at a way to improve receiver performance for older radios or a homebrew project check out the preamps at Ramsey Electronics. Their web address is www.ramseyelectronics.com/

We usually publish class schedules a month or two in advance. You will be notified by email or phone when the class is set if you send an email informing us of your desire to be in a class.

There is no charge for the class, but registration is required. Advanced study of *The ARRL Ham Radio License Manual, product* #0977 / *ISBN* 978-0-87259-097-7 (red-brick colored cover) is strongly suggested as well as study of the 396 question and answer Technical Class License question pool. Barnes & Noble Booksellers may have this manual. You can purchase it online from www.msars.com, www.arrl.org/catalog or on Amazon.com. The list price is \$29.95 (which includes a CD). The older ARRL Ham Radio License Manual, Second Edition, was priced at \$24.95, but did not have a CD.

The current Technician License question pool, which was approved by the NCVEC on February 1, 2010, can be seen at http://www.ncvec.org/page.php?id=356. Testing for this new question pool started July 1, 2010.

Practice tests are highly recommended. The www.qrz.com website is free. To access the sample tests, click on Main Menu to the right of the Search button on the QRZ Home Page. Scroll down and click on Practice Amateur Radio Exams. Click on Start Test to enter QRZ Practice Test Center. Click on Technician 35

Questions. Click on Wait For Correct. (This feature gives you the ability to answer again to get the correct answer if you miss the first time. On each answer it will either show Wrong Answer or Correct.) Click on Begin Test. Statistics are given at the top of the screen with the number of Completed questions, the Accuracy percentage, and the Overall percentage of questions completed on the test. Be sure to study multiple QRZ tests. The first test is only the first question from each of the 35 subgroups of the question pool. The second test is only the second question from each of the 35 subgroups, and so on. It is recommended to take at least 15 of the sample tests to be able to see all 396-question pool questions.

The 35-question FCC exam will be given at the end of class by a Volunteer Examiner (VE) team. There is a \$15.00 ARRL VEC FCC exam fee.

There is no exam for this class. The class has been held in the September-November time frame.
