AMATEUR PACKET UPDATE

Many times we need batteries to run our equipment portable. The most common size I need is AA. On older HTs when the battery pack goes bad it cost a lot for a new oneother. If you have the pack that uses AA batteries you can use it with rechargeables. I found a source of cheap nickle metal hydride batteries on Ebay that are made in China. They can cost as little as 80 cents each including shipping if you check Ebay for the best price. It does take about 2 to 3 week to arrive, but for the great price I can wait. I have bought about 24 so far for my HT battery packs and they work great. The capacity varies from 2500 milliamp hours to 3000 milliamp hours depending on the manufacturer. If you need rechargable batteries check out Ebay for the best deals

AMATEUR HARDWARE UPDATE

Many of us use digital modes with our radio and a computer. The new computers allow us to work any digital mode like morse code, RTTY, PSK31, AMTOR, and PACKET by using the sound card to receive the radio audio to decode and using the sound card output to make the tones for that mode. Companies have been building and selling the sound card interface for years for this. This month's project is the sound card interface which allows you to run all those digital modes with the proper software. I had been running the super simple interface that just used resistors to attenuate the signal on the lines between the sound card and radio.



There are more complex interfaces which use the RS-232 port to key the radio for these modes and for morse code keying. Some use opto-coupler chips to isolate the radio keying lines from the RS-232 port. Really nice ones use isolation transformers to isolate the audio between the radio and computer. I built up the deluxe version with all the features. I even added adjustments for the audio going to and from the radio along with a speaker to hear what was on the frequency. For extra safety I added a switch which keeps the computer from keying up the rig unless I want to transmit. The interface works well and can be built up as fancy as you want. On the internet they have lots of sites showing diagrams for the various ways you can build up your own interface from simple to deluxe. Building your own can save money on the interface.

The text to be used in the class is *The ARRL Understanding Basic Electronics Second Edition*. The suggested calculator is the Casio fx-260 solar calculator, which can be purchased at Wal-mart for about \$10. The instructors are Dean Honadle N2LAZ and Alan Proffitt AE5RX. Both have years of experience teaching electronics. Dean taught electronics in the Navy for 10 years and another 10 years at State Tech. He has a Masters degree in mathematics. Alan has a Masters and PhD in instrumental sciences and taught in the Engineering Department at the University of Memphis.

Or you can go to the Delta Club webpage www.deltaclub.org click on Training Classes; then click on Technician Class to send an email, or call at 901-683-2701. We usually publish class schedules a month or two in advance. You will be notified by email or phone when the class is set if you send an email informing us of your desire to be in a class.

There is no charge for the class, but registration is required. Advanced study of *The ARRL Ham Radio License Manual, product* #0977 / *ISBN* 978-0-87259-097-7 (red-brick colored cover) is strongly suggested as well as study of the 396 question and answer Technical Class License question pool. Barnes & Noble Booksellers may have this manual. You can purchase it online from www.msars.com, www.arrl.org/catalog or on Amazon.com. The list price is \$29.95 (which includes a CD). The older ARRL Ham Radio License Manual, Second Edition, was priced at \$24.95, but did not have a CD.

The current Technician License question pool, which was approved by the NCVEC on February 1, 2010, can be seen at http://www.ncvec.org/page.php?id=356. Testing for this new question pool started July 1, 2010.

Practice tests are highly recommended. The www.qrz.com website is free. To access the sample tests, click on Main Menu to the right of the Search button on the QRZ Home Page. Scroll down and click on Practice Amateur Radio Exams. Click on Start Test to enter QRZ Practice Test Center. Click on Technician 35 Questions. Click on Wait For Correct. (This feature gives you the ability to answer again to get the correct answer if you miss the first time. On each answer it will either show Wrong Answer or Correct.) Click on Begin Test. Statistics are given at the top of the screen with the number of Completed questions, the Accuracy percentage, and the Overall percentage of questions completed on the test. Be sure to study multiple QRZ tests. The first test is only the first question from each of the 35 subgroups of the question pool. The second test is only the second question from each of the 35 subgroups, and so on. It is recommended to take at least 15 of the sample tests to be able to see all 396-question pool questions.
