SKYWATCHING EVENTS

Throughout 2012, I've been providing information on must -see skywatching events, as listed by <u>Scientific American</u>. Don't miss the last events of 2012.

Dec. 13-14: Geminid meteor shower

If there is one meteor display guaranteed to put on a very entertaining show it is the <u>Geminid meteor shower</u>. Now considered by most meteor e xperts to be at the top of the list, surpassing in brilliance and reliability even the August Perseids.

Bundle warmly against the winter chill; you can start observing as soon as darkness falls on the evening of Dec. 13 as Gemini starts coming up above the eastern horizon and continue through the rest of the night. Around 2 a.m. when Gemini is almost directly overhead, you might see as many as two meteor sightings per minute ... 120 per hour! And the moon is new, meaning that it will not be a factor at all.

Dec. 25: Christmas evening and Jupiter

On Christmas, many will be looking skyward and wondering what that brilliant silvery "star" is hovering just above the waxing gibbous moon. It's not a star (or Santa returning to the North Pole), but the largest planet in our solar system, Jupiter, serving as a sort of holiday ornament with our nearest neighbor in space to cap off a year of interesting and predictable sky events that we all can enjoy!

AMATEUR PACKET UPDATE

When we put up antennas for communications we always need hardware to insure the installation goes smoothly. DX Engineering has come out with a complete hardware line of accessories to help make antenna installations better and safer. They have a line of saddle clamps made from aluminum so they do not rust; also heavy duty saddle clamps made of cast aluminum. They include stainless steel hardware. They have also designed a line of resin support blocks to allow mounting tubing to a flat surface. DX Engineering has also designed a set of band clamps with a welded stud to allow mounting after you clamp it to your round tubing. AMATEUR HARDWARE UPDATE

Many times when we work with QRP radios and older QRP rigs, the audio output leaves a lot to be desired. Radio Shack built a speaker amplifier for years that combined a small speaker with an LM386 amplifier IC

in a box. The unit would run on a 9 volt battery or an AC adaptor. It has a volume control on the unit along with a 1/8 jack for audio input. It plays through the built in speaker or has a 1/8 inch jack for hooking up an external speaker. These units were popular and show up used at hamfests a lot. They sold new for about \$10.00. I have bought several over the years and I painted them to match equipment I run them with. They work great for amplifying weak audio to more comfortable levels. Keep an eye out at hamfests as the used ones are cheap.

number (preferably a cell number). Or you can go to the Delta Club webpage www.deltaclub.org click on Training Classes; then click on Technician Class to send an email, or call at 901-683-2701. We usually publish class schedules a month or two in advance. You will be notified by email or phone when the class is set if you send an email informing us of your desire to be in a class.

There is no charge for the class, but re gistration is required. Advanced study of *The ARRL Ham Radio License Manual, product #0977/ISBN 978-0-87259-097-7* (red-brick colored cover) is strongly suggested as well as study of the 396 questions and answer Technical Class License question pool. Barnes & Noble Booksellers may have this manual. You can purchase it online from www.msars.com, www.arrl.org/catalog or on Amazon.com. The list price is \$29.95 (which includes a CD). The older ARRL Ham Radio License Manual, Second Edition was priced at \$24.95, but did not have a CD.

The current Technician License question pool, which was approved by the NCVEC on February 1, 2010, can be seen at http://www.ncvec.org/page.php?id=356. Testing for this question pool started July 1, 2010.

Practice tests are highly recommended. The www.qrz.com website is free. To access the sample tests, go to www.qrz.com. From the QRZ home page click on RESOURCES in the blue band on the top right. Then click on 2010 Technician Exam Practice Test. When you start answering the questions, it will show you if you answered correctly or not with CORRECT! or SORRY BUT THAT ANSWER IS NOT CORRECT. Statistics are kept below the test question at This Quiz with the number of questions answered correctly and the percentage correct. Also shown is the number of questions answere d correctly from the 396 questions of the question pool. It keeps track of your correct answers on subsequent tests. Below the This Quiz line is Questions in This Test, that is a list of the 35 question numbers of the current test. If answered correctly, the question number radio button turns green. If answered incorrectly, it turns red.

The 35-question FCC exam will be given at the end of class by a Volunteer Examiner (VE) team. There is a \$15.00 ARRL VEC FCC exam fee.
