AMATEUR PACKET UPDATE

Many more companies are coming online with kits for amateur radio. One new c ompany from China is the KN-Q7 40 meter SSB transceiver. This comes in kit form with the parts and case. The small QRP unit runs on 12 volts DC. The power output is 10 W PEP. The frequency range is set and is about 20 kilocycles from the VXO tuning. The front panel has frequency adjust, IF gain which works like a volume control and the microphone connector. It will run a dynamic or electret microphone. The rear panel has SO -239 connector, power connector, and speaker output. This unit is a small cheap way to get QRP portable on 40 meter SSB. To find out more information on this Chinese kit just google KN -Q7.

AMATEUR HARDWARE UPDATE

Many times we hook up our test equipment to output ports on our radios to check for proper operation. Making connections with a set of scope or me ter probes can be hard. On RCA style male connectors it is hard not to short the leads when hooking up leads. Since a lot of older radios tend to use the RCA type connector for external keying, speaker output, RF output, and aux jacks I made up a custom adapter to allow for easy hookup to these ports with test equipment. I used male and a female RCA connectors wired up in parallel along with a couple of alligator clips that are also wired to the center and ground connections of the RCA connectors. This allo ws me to just plug into a male or female RCA output and



then hook up my test leads to the meter or scope probes. The adaptor works well and makes troubleshooting older radios a lot easier.

Advanced study of *The ARRL Ham Radio License Manual, product* #0977/ISBN 978-0-87259-097-7 (red-brick colored cover) is strongly suggested as well as study of the 396 questions and answer Technical Class License question pool. Barnes & Noble Booksellers may have this manual. You can purchase it online from www.msars.com, www.arrl.org/catalog or on Amazon.com. The list price is \$29.95 (which includes a CD). The older ARRL Ham Radio License Manual, Second Edition was priced at \$24.95, but did not have a CD.

The current Technician License question pool, which was approved by the NCVEC on February 1, 2010, can be seen at http://www.nc.vec.org/page.php?id=356. Testing for this question pool started July 1, 2010.

Practice tests are highly recommended. The www.qrz.com website is free. To access the sample tests, go to www.qrz.com. From the QRZ home page click on RESOURCES in the blue band on the top right. Then click on 2010 Technician Exam Practice Test. When you start answering the questions, it will show you if you answered correctly or not with CORRECT! or SORRY BUT THAT ANSWER IS NOT CORRECT. Statistics are kept below the test question at This Quiz with the number of questions answered correctly and the percentage correct. Also shown is the number of questions answered correctly from the 396 questions of the question pool. It keeps track of your correct answers on subsequent tests. Below the This Quiz line is Questions in This Test, that is a list of the 35 question numbers of the current test. If answered correctly, the question number radio button turns green. If answered incorrectly, it turns red.

GOOD EVENING: This is calling this session of the DELTA CLUB'S TRAFFIC AND INFORMATION NET. This net is affiliated with the ARRL and the NTS and is organized to pass traffic in and out of the mid - south area, in addition to providing information about club events and amateur related top ics. This net meets nightly at 8:00 p.m. CT except the second Tuesday of the month on the 146.82 W4BS repeater and requires a pl. tone of 107.2 Hz. All stations will refrain from transmitting without being acknowledged by net control.
