#### PRESIDENT'S CORNER

**Happy May to all!** This month's article is going to be short and **SWEET**...literally.

Being in the South, at one time or another we've all been called "Honey". I'm infamous for greeting folks with a "Baby", "Sugar" or "Honey" and the OM (W5VAA) knows he's in trouble when I st art building a "Honey-Do" list. But have you ever given any real thought to the unique food, HONEY?

Honey (pron.: /h̄mi/) is a sweet food made by bees using nectar from flowers. The variety produced by honey bees (the genus *Apis*) is the one most commonly referred to, as it is the type of honey collected by beekeepers and consumed by humans. Honey produced by other b ees and insects has distinctly different properties.



☐ Honey has approximately the same relative sweetness as that of

Now a few facts about honey that you may not know...

granulated sugar.
☐ Most microorganisms do not grow in honey because of its low water activity of 0.6. However, honey sometimes contains dormant endospores of the bacterium <i>Clostridium botulinum</i> , which can be dangerous to infants.
□ Bees carry an electrostatic charge whereby they attract other particles in addition to pollen, which become incorporated into their honey; the honey can be analysed for radioactive particles, dust and particulate pollution.
☐ Ripe honey, has a long shelf life, and will not ferment if properly sealed.
□ Below 5°C, the honey will not crystallize and, thus, the ori ginal texture and flavor can be preserved indefinitely. At very low temperatures, honey will not freeze solid. Instead, as the temperatures become colder, the viscosity of honey increases.
☐ In ancient Egypt, honey was used to sweeten cakes and biscuits, and was used in many other dishes.  Ancient Egyptian and Middle Eastern peoples also used honey for embalming the dead.
☐ In 2012, China, Turkey, and Ukraine were the top producers of natural honey. Significant regional producers of honey include United St ates of America (ranked fourth worldwide) and Russia (ranked fifth worldwide). Honey consumption per capita per year exceeds one kilogram in some countries like Austria

#### TEN USES FOR HONEY

- **1. Relieve Hangovers.** Had a little *too* much fun last night? A few tablespoons of honey, which is packed with fructose, will help speed up your body's metabolism of alcohol.
- **2. Heal Wounds, Cuts, Scrapes & Burns.** Don't reach for the Neosporin the next t ime you cut or burn yourself simply apply honey to the affected area. Honey works as a natural antiseptic.
- **3. Soothe Sore Throats and Coughs.** Combine honey with the juice of one lemon and drink. It works like a wonder!
- **4. Moisturize Dry Skin.** Honey is a fantastic moisturizer, especially on dry patches, like your elbows or hands even your lips! Rub onto your dry, patchy skin and let it sit for about 30 minutes before washing off. Honey also makes a great lip balm!
- **5. Condition Damaged Hair.** Honey is a great natural conditioner. You can simply add a teaspoon of the stuff to your regular shampoo to smooth your damaged locks. You can also combine it with olive oil for a deeper conditioning. Let it soak for 20 minutes with your hair wrapped in a towel before shampooing as usual.
- **6. Have an Amazing Bath.** Relax your body and soak your skin in a soothing bath. Add 2 tablespoons of honey to 1 cup of hot water and let it dissolve for about 10 minutes. Add 2 or 3 drops of lavender essential oil and add it to your b ath.

#### A FEW HONEY INFUSION RECIPES . . .

#### WARMING SPICE HONEY

- 1 cup honey
- 3 cinnamon sticks
- 1 teaspoon whole cloves
- 3 pieces star anise
- 6 cardamom pods
- 1. Bring honey and spices to a boil, then reduce heat and simmer for five minutes.
- 2. Remove from heat and let sit for up to 24 hours.
- 3. Reheat, strain and cool.

#### ROSE PETAL HONEY

Use fresh rose petals, but be absolutely sure that the flowers have not been treated with pesiticide. You can also try this recipe with dried lavender flowers —use 2 tablespoons dried lavender buds in place of the rose petals.

1 cup honey

½ cup fresh rose petals

- 1. Bring honey to a boil, remove from heat and stir in rose petals.
- 2. Let sit for four hours, return to a boil, then strain and cool.

#### **GINGER LIME HONEY**

- 1 cup honey
- 8 slices fresh ginger
- 2 limes, zest only
- 1. Bring all ingredients just to a boil in a small saucepan, then reduce heat to low and simmer for five minutes.
- 2. Remove from heat and let sit for ten minutes. Strain and cool.

#### TART FIG HONEY

- 1 cup apple cider vinegar
- 1 cup honey
- 2 cups dried figs, quartered
- 1. Combine ingredients in a saucepan and bring to a boil.
- 2. Reduce heat to a low simmer and cook for 30 minutes, stirring occasionally.
- 3. Remove from heat, cool, and strain.

#### HOT PEPPER HONEY

- 1 cup honey
- 2 jalapenos, quartered, or 2 teaspoons crushed red pepper flakes

- 1. Combine ingredients in a saucepan and bring to a boil.
- 2. Reduce heat to a low simmer and cook for 30 minutes, stirring occasionally.
- 3. Remove from heat, cool, and strain

#### AMATEUR HARDWARE UPDATE

One problem we all have at home is trying to listen to our HTs without them falling over or getting knocked a round. What is need is a large platform that the HT can be attached to make it stable. Although you could build one out of wood, an easier way is to reuse something you might throw away. When you buy a new LCD TV they usually come with a separate base sect ion you can attach to TV. Most people now use a separate mount to attach the TV to the wall. The old "stand" then gets thrown in the trash. A small bracket will allow the HT to attach to the unused stand. You now have a very stable platform for your HT which will keep it vertical and in place. With old LCD TVs being replaced, these old stands can be reused for holding HTs.

There is no charge for the class, but registration is required. Advanced study of *The ARRL Ham Radio License Manual, product* #0977/ISBN 978-0-87259-097-7 (red-brick colored cover) is strongly suggested as well as study of the 396 questions and answer Technical Class License question pool. Barnes & Noble Booksellers may have this manual. You can purchase it online from <a href="www.msars.com">www.msars.com</a>, <a href="www.msars.com">www.arrl.org/catalog</a> or on <a href="Amazon.com">Amazon.com</a>. The list price is \$29.95 (which includes a CD). The older ARRL Ham Radio License Manual, Second Edition was priced at \$24.95, but did not have a CD.

The current Technician License question pool, which was approved by the NCVEC on February 1, 2010, can be seen at <a href="http://www.ncvec.org/page.php?id=356">http://www.ncvec.org/page.php?id=356</a>. Testing for this question pool started July 1, 2010.

Practice tests are highly recommended. The <a href="www.qrz.com">www.qrz.com</a> website is free. To access the sample tests, go to <a href="www.qrz.com">www.qrz.com</a>. From the QRZ home page click on RESOURCES in the blue band on the top right. Then click on 2010 Technician Exam Practice Test. When you start answering the questions, it will show you if you answered correctly or not with CORRECT! or SORRY BUT THAT ANSWER IS NOT CORRECT. Statistics are kept below the test question at This Quiz with the number of questions answered correctly and the percentage correct. Also shown is the number of questions answered correctly from the 396 questions of the question pool. It keeps track of your correct answers on subsequent tests. Below the This Quiz line is Questions in This Test, that is a list of the 35 question numbers of the current test. If answered correctly, the question number radio button turns green. If answered incorrectly, it turns red.
