AMATEUR PACKET UPDATE



When operating packet radio we normally use 2 meter or 440 Mhz. Wouxum, a Chinese company, has started selling their dual band mobile radios here in the US. The model theysell is the model KG-UV920P-A. They offer 50/40 watts out on 2 meters and 440. They also have adjustable power levels, 999 memory channels, FM broadcast radio reception, and a dual display along with many other features. The radios also have a great price at under 300 dollars. AMATEUR HARDWARE UPDATE

Many times when sending out your call over and over again in a contest, it will wear out your voice. Newer radios have a voice recorder to allow you to record a message and send it out automatically. It digitizes a short message that can be played back over and over. I found a nice voice card on Ebay that will do this function. The board allows up to 10 seconds of speech to be recorded and played back. The unit will run on 3 to 5 volts DC. It has a built in microphone on the board for recording. The output is 2 terminals to which you can hook up a speaker. You can hook it directly into your radio by using a resistive divider network to lower the output level. The board uses the ISD1820 IC chip. It has simple controls on



the board and can be hooked up for microprocessor control. Just go to Ebay and search for "voice recorder board". I got mine for under \$5.00 with free shipping.


TECHNICIAN CLASS

If you are interested in the first amateur license class, Technician, please let us know by sending an email to wa4ovo@arrl.net with subject line "Technician Class" and give nme, email address, and a contact phone number (preferably a cell number). Or you can go to the Delta Club webpagewww.deltaclub.org click on Training Classes; then click on Technician Class to send an email, or call at 901-628-4318. We usually publish class schedules a month or two in advance. You will be notified by email or phone when the class is set if you send an email informing us of your desire to be in a class.

There is no charge for the class, but registration is required. Advanced study of *The ARRL Ham Radio License Manual, Revised Second Edition* with sample test CD, product #0977, ISBN 978-0-87259-097-7 (red-brick colored cover) is strongly suggested, as well as study of the 396 question and answer Technical Class License question pool. You can purchase it online from www.msars.com, www.arrl.org/catalog, on Amazon.com, or possibly Barnes & Noble booksellers.

The current Technician Class License question pool, which was approved by the NCVEC on February 1, 2010, can be seen at http://www.ncvec.org/page.php?id=356. Testing for this question pool started July 1, 2010 and is valid through June 30, 2014.

Practice tests are highly recommended. The www.qrz.com website is free. To access the sample tests, go to www.qrz.com. From the QRZ home page click on RESOURCES in the blue band on the top right. Then click on 2010 Technician Exam Practice Test. When you start answering the questions, it will show you if you answered correctly or not with CORRECT! or SORRY BUT THAT ANSWER IS NOT CORRECT. Statistics are kept below the test question at This Quiz with the number of questions answered correctly and the percentage correct. Also shown is the number of questions answered correctly from the 396 questions of the question pool. It keeps track of your correct answers on subsequent tests. Below the This Quiz line is Questions In This Test, that is a list of the 35 question numbers of the current test. If answered correctly, the question number radio button turns green. If answered incorrectly, it turns red.



The 35-question FCC exam will be given during the class by a Volunteer Examiner (VE) team. The ARRL VEC FCC exam fee is \$15.00.

This AuxFog contains valuable information for ARES, RACES, MARS, and CERT communicators. The AuxFog is also available for download (like the attached) at http://www.publicsafetytools.info/auxfog/start_auxfog_info.php

Auxiliary Communications Field Operations Guide (AUXFOG) The Auxiliary Communications Field Operations Guide (AUXFOG) is a reference for auxiliary communicators who directly support backup emergency communications for State/local public safety entities or for an amateur radio organization supporting public safety.

This reference guide contains information about AuxComm best practices, frequently used radio frequencies, Mutual Aid channels as well as tips and suggestions about auxiliary emergency communicators integrating into a NIMS ICS environment to support communications for planned events or incidents. It can serve as a reference both for auxiliary emergency communicators and public safet communications professionals. You can download the AUXFOG by clicking on the hyperlink to the left and save it to your own storage device. It will only download as a PDF.

While printed copies are not available from DHS, you may download an electronic copy to print as many hard copies as desired. Please note that if you modify the document in any way, such as by adding information specific to your organization or area, you must remove the DHS seal unless you receive permission from the DHS Office of PublicAffairs to use it.
