

AMATEUR PACKET UPDATE

Hams build kit radios for fun and to operate. Lots of QRP (low power) kits are on the market. A low cost Morse code transceiver for the 40 meter band is now made in China. The cost is under \$6.00 for the whole kit. This includes instructions, all parts needed, and the printed circuit board. The kit even has the 3.5 MM jack for the key, a barrel power connector, and the headphone jack along with a BNC connector to hook up to an antenna. The rig is a direct conversion receiver along with a transmitter that puts out 1.2 watts from a 12 VDC supply. This circuit is a copy of the famous PIXIE QRP radio amateurs have been building and playing with for years. The rig operates on 7.023 MHZ. This is a great simple project to get into kit building without spending a lot of money. For 5 to 6 dollars and free shipping this is a great deal. The picture shows components included, and parts list on the left -and the completed transceiver with all parts installed on the right side of the picture. An included LM386 chip must be plugged in the socket to complete the radio. Kit can be found on Ebay using search keywords "pixie qrp radio".

One American company building ham radios and accessories is Palstar. They have a line of automatic and manual antenna tuners. They carry a balanced line antenna tuner as well. Palstar sells a full line of antenna tuner parts so you can build your own tuner. Their inductor is built on a ceramic coil form with silver plated parts for good conductivity. Palstar also has an HF transceiver they sell. The TR30A transceiver they designed was the best new product at the 2013 Dayton Hamvention. They also have dummy loads and speakers. NOTES OF POSSIBLE INTEREST

Charles D. Pigue II is a professional safe and vault technician. Mr. Pigue offered interested Delta Club members his technical advice on the subject of potential Electro Magnetic Pulse (EMP) and the potential effects on electronic safe locks typically found on higher-end gun/home storage safes. You may have heard of one such brand of dial based lock named Sargent and Greenleaf (often abbreviated to simply show "S&G")

Just in case some of the members have their ham equipment or guns locked up in a gun safe with an S&G electronic lock, here are some published reports* stating their locks (specific models tested) meet or exceed the highest government EMP test requirements. That being said, as a professional Safe and Vault technician, I would still recommend any locks guarding your Ham equipment or guns, be of a mechanical design or one that incorporates both a mechanical and electronic opening in which there are a few on the market.
