

Some of the newest modes for Amateur radio operation are digital modes. To operate digital modes in the past we needed additional hardware boxes costing hundreds of dollars. Now many modes can be done with your home computer for free. One of the new great programs for using the newest digital modes is "Fldigi." This software package can be downloaded and run on your computer to allow you to use these new modes. Some of the modes supported are CW, HELL, MFSK, MT63, PSK, BPSK, RTTY, THOR, THROB, WEFAX, and NAVTEX. The program works well and is a free download. See the <u>Beginners' Guide to</u> Fldigi, the <u>Users Manual</u>, and go <u>here</u> to download the software.

Huntsville Hamfest Bus Trip -- August 20, 2016 Submitted by Joe Lowenthal, WA40V0

DARC is sponsoring a 50-passenger bus trip to go to the Huntsville Hamfest on August 20, 2016. There is a graduated scale fare for the bus trip. The fare is \$55 if paid by May 31, 2016. The fare is \$65 if paid by June 30, 2016, and \$75 if paid after June 30th. The fare includes the \$8 hamfest entry ticket. There will be biscuit sandwiches, water, sodas, chips, and fruit on the bus going to Huntsville and whatever is left for the trip back.

If you drive to Huntsville, you'll pay about \$33 for gas, \$8 for the hamfest ticket, \$5 for parking, about \$10 for breakfast en route, and probably more than \$10 for dinner on the way back. Not only is that more than the ticket price through the end of June, but you can sleep on the way back, an endeavor frowned upon if you're driving.

There are no refunds, but you can sell your seat to someone else if you cannot go. Let me know.

Cash or checks will be accepted for payment. Make checks payable to Delta Amateur Radio Club. You can pay at a meeting. You can also send your check to Joe Lowenthal, WA4OVO, 6675 Ashbridge Cove, Memphis, TN 38120. Please include your name, callsign, cell phone number, and email address. **Reservations will be on a first come, first <u>paid</u> basis.**

The bus will leave Ellendale Church of Christ, 7365 Highway 70, Bartlett, TN, at 6:00am on August 20th. A second pickup point will be at Germantown Baptist Church, 9450 Poplar Avenue at Johnson Road, Germantown, TN, at approximately 6:30am. The bus will leave Huntsville immediately after the 4pm door prize drawing and return to Germantown Baptist Church approximately 7:30pm and Ellendale Church of Christ at approximately 8:15pm.

Ellendale Church of Christ has asked us to park in the larger parking lot on the west side of the building to leave the east side open for church activity parking. The pickup point at Germantown Baptist Church will be on the east side of the church (toward Collierville) just north of the baseball diamonds and south of the gym (called the CORE) between the gym and the baseball diamonds to the front.

Last Month's Program

Larry May, K4QZF, presented the March program on Logbook of The World (LoTW). He explained that LoTW is the ARRL's computer-based, secure process for confirming QSOs. The price is very good: it's free to amateurs world wide. In terms of confirming QSOs for awards, LoTW and QSL cards are equivalent, and either or both may be used for ARRL awards. Security is guaranteed through electronic certificates and the use of public/private encryption keys.

Larry told us the LoTW software is called Trusted QSL (TQSL) and is neither difficult nor time consuming to set up. He provided a link to <u>download and install TQSL</u>. You will find a Release Notes file at the same URL.

Like many hams, I've read QST articles on LoTW, but prior to Larry's program, I had at least as many questions as answers, and some of the statements that I had read or heard about LoTW were wrong. For example, as Larry pointed out in about six different ways, there are no fees to use LoTW. This was quite important, as a ham who decides to earn the Worked All States certificate will spend at least \$50 (and likely more) to obtain a QSL card from each state. Keep in mind that the ARRL charges a small fee for awards, irrespective of the manner in which QSOs are confirmed.

In subsequent discussions with Larry, he said he uses PSK31 for most of his contacts (the majority of which are DX) and his rate of confirmed QSOs with LoTW is 38%, but unlike QSL card confirmations, each LoTW confirmation is free.

Thanks, Larry, for an excellent presentation.

We will operate from 0900 CDT to 1500 CDT on April 30, 2016. Remembering Sultana On April 27, 1865, towards the end of the Civil War, the steamboat Sultana exploded and sank while traveling up the Mississippi River, killing an estimated 1,700 people. The event remains the worst maritime disaster in US history (the sinking of the Titanic claimed 1,512 souls). Although this disaster took a huge toll, few know the story of the Sultana's sinking.

2016 FreeFest Submitted by Dan Lasley, NE7JN

If you are in the habit of reading Sparks when it arrives in your email in-box, this month you will have plenty of time to get ready for 2016 FreeFest!

What is FreeFest? It's a hamfest sponsored by <u>Mid-South Amateur Radio Association</u> (MARA). It will be in operation from 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM on Saturday, April 9, 2016.

What's free about FreeFest? Admission and just about everything else except for concessions and additional raffle tickets. Even the first raffle ticket is free!

Where is it? 5868 Stage Road in Bartlett, just east of the railroad tracks. Parking (also free) is in the large parking lot west of Walgreens, then walk across the small bridge and look for crowds entering the building. The FreeFest link has a map in case you haven't been there before. The talk-in frequency is 147.03 MHz with a PL tone of 107.2 and a +600 KHz offset.

What will I see at FreeFest? The better question is what won't you see! You'll find ham equipment vendors large and small, individuals selling nearly anything you can imagine that's ham related and some things that aren't ham related (check out the Aim Light table!). Most of the action takes place inside, but with the cooperation of the good-weather gods, some vendors will be outside as well.

The Lancaster/Marston Corner Submitted by Dan Lasley, NE7JN

The Lancaster/Marston Corner refers to the works of Don Lancaster and Ray Marston, both of whom published extensively in various electronics magazines and in other publications. This column will cover wide-ranging topics in electronics but won't be limited to Lancaster and Marston; we'll cover other authors as well.

In last month's <u>Sparks</u>, I presented 40 topics that Ray Marston had written about in Radio-Electronics and Electronics Now magazines. This month I want to talk about operational amplifiers, abbreviated as "op-amps." Just what the heck is an op-amp? The grand old master of analog digital design, Robert Pease, defined it simply and succinctly:

"An operational amplifier is called that because it can perform just about any operation according to what feedback components you put around it."

In part one of his Op-Amp Cookbook series (more on that below), Ray Marston said op-amps "... can be used to make precision AC and DC amplifiers and filters, oscillators, level switches, and comparators, etc." Marston summarizes the functionality of op-amps perhaps a bit too briefly, as they also serve as the basis of adders, subtractors, integrators, differentiators, and probably dozens of other building blocks as well.

I looked at fifteen different on-line op-am tutorials and selected three for this month's column. The tutorials range from entry level to intermediate to advanced. Let's look at the <u>entry level</u> tutorial first. If you are curious about op amps but are just beginning to learn about them, I suggest you skip the frequency response and bandwidth sections and read through each of the dozen op-amp tutorials at this site.

If you've had some experience with op-amps, see part one of Ray Marston's <u>Op-Amp</u> <u>Cookbook</u> series. Marston covers well a wide variety of op-amp circuits. Don't miss <u>part</u> <u>two</u>, <u>part three</u>, or <u>part four</u>. Each is well written and loaded with op-amp circuits.

If you are interested in reading an advanced description of the care and feeding of op-amps, see <u>"Op Amps For Everyone"</u>. Written by professionals at Texas Instruments, this free 464-page book is a treasure trove of information on designing op-amp circuits. It's not for the faint of heart, but you don't have to be a rocket scientist to pick up valuable insights into op-amp design.

Next month I'll cover a book by Joseph J. "Joe" Carr, K4IPV (SK). The book is "Mastering Oscillator Circuits Through Projects & Experiments" and is available from the public library, call number 621.381533 C311m.

What's Cooking? Submitted by Dan Lasley, NE7JN

I was sorting through some old <u>Arizona Highways</u> magazines recently and found a recipe for Rattlesnake Chili in the January, 1994, issue. This recipe is by Patricia Myers, food editor for the Arizona Republic-Phoenix Gazette newspapers. The magazine article "... guarantees that her recipe will toughen anyone's hide." We'll see!

Rattlesnake Chili

1 to 2 pounds ground rattlesnake, armadillo, chicken, or turkey
1 medium onion, chopped
3 cloves garlic, minced
2 6-ounce cans tomato puree
1 tablespoon ground cumin
1/2 12-ounce can beer
2 4-ounce cans diced green chiles
4 tablespoons ground red chiles or chili powder
Salt and pepper to taste
Optional: 2 16-ounce cans pinto beans

In a skillet, brown choice of ground meat with onion and garlic. Put in a large pot or electric slow-cooker, adding remaining ingredients. In a pot, bring to a boil, then reduce heat and simmer 45 minutes to an hour. In a slow-cooker, on low setting, cook six hours or overnight. Serves 6.

Sadly, I was completely out of ground rattlesnake today so I substituted a bit over two pounds of chopped-up skinless chicken thigh fillets with the fat removed. I'm not a fan of garlic, as most dishes have much more than I care for, so I omitted garlic. I'm not opposed to beans or beer in chili but I used neither in my first attempt at this recipe. I followed the remainder of the recipe closely with one exception.

Those of you who have been reading this column know I have a secret ingredient for most of my cooking: lots and lots of jalapeno peppers! Given the Southwestern nature of this month's recipe, I added a 7.5 ounce can of <u>chilpotle</u> peppers, chopped up.

I have tried *many* chili recipes over the years; they covered the gamut of the good, the bad, and the ugly. Ms. Myers, your recipe didn't toughen my hide, even with the added chilpotle peppers, but it's the best chili I've ever made!

DX News Submitted by Dan Lasley, NE7JN

In *DX News* I'll relay information for those of you who like to work DX. Most of this information is a digest of emails from the ARRL DX Bulletin, the ARRL Contest Update, and the ARRL Letter. Yes, some of it may be a bit cryptic. No, it isn't rocket science. If you're interested but don't understand the terminology, ask a ham friend who works DX.

While we aren't on the best part of the sunspot cycle for working DX, that doesn't mean DX doesn't exist, even on 10 meters. Most of my recent 10 meter contacts have been in call districts 6 and 7 and in Central and South America. I recently worked OE3DIA in Austria on 17 meters with a signal so strong he could have been around the corner rather than 5,105 miles away. I made this contact with 100 watts on a 40 meter wire dipole about 21 feet off the ground. When propagation conditions are good, you don't need a kilowatt, a tower, or a four-element beam!

Here are a few DX targets. The <u>VKOEK</u> link below is amazingly detailed and very useful.

HEARD ISLAND, VK0. A large group of operators will be QRV as <u>VK0EK</u> from March 20 to April 10. Activity will be on 160 to 10 meters using CW, SSB and RTTY. QSL via MOURX. <u>Club Log</u> reports Heard Island is the fifth most wanted entity on their <u>DXCC Most Wanted List</u>.

BAHRAIN, A9. Special event call sign A9110RR is QRV until the end of the year to celebrate the 110th anniversary of the ITU Radio Regulations. QSL direct via A92AA.

EUROPEAN RUSSIA, UA. Special event station R100IA celebrates the 100th anniversary of the Russian air force and air traffic control. QSL via RZ5D. [Dates of the event not given.]

The <u>ARRL National Parks on the Air</u> event runs during all of 2016 to mark the 100th anniversary of the National Park Service.

Special event stations in Russia will be on the air from March 16 until June 16 and will provide awards and certificates. Each RT73-prefix station represents a historical figure in the area of telecommunications or electronics.

A recent ARRL Contest Update provided the quote in the following paragraph. "RF quiet" information is important because if you have a lot of QRM generated inside your QTH, you won't work'em if you can't hear'em!

"Tony, N2TK, found better basement lighting performance after replacing his fluorescent shop lights with Commercial Electric #54103161 35 W, 3200 Lumen LED fixtures from Home Depot. Each fixture cost about \$40 in his area. Besides more light output than the two-tube T12 fixtures they were replacing, they were also RF quiet as indicated on his Elecraft P3. He also was "inspired" to replace 400 W of incandescent lighting in his garage. Four of the newer LED fixtures supply more light than his old setup, with a net savings of 260 W."
