Amateur Hardware Update

Many times we now build up projects using cheap small computer boards. Arduino and Raspberry PI computers allow us to design projects with hardware and software. Buying a board means no case and no protection from shorting out computers. Thankfully Ebay has lots of small computer cases designed just for these computers. Some are 3D printed while others are molded plastic. A new style is made of flat pieces of plexiglass that snap together to make a case. These are slotted out for wire hookups, USB, power supply and inputs and outputs. These cases start at under \$2.00 and do a great job to protect your board. If you get a Raspberry PI or Arduino do not forget the case to protect it. Do a search for "Arduino case" or "Raspberry PI case".

Amateur Packet Update

When running HF, antenna matching is important. SOTABEAMS has a line of light weight antenna baluns for your homemade wire antennas for up to 125 watts of power. You can buy the unit with a 1:1 or a 4:1 balun depending on you matching needs. These are all in the same physical design. There is the balun, a BNC connector for input and two wire posts to make wire connections on the "T" shaped center hanger unit. The unit weighs only 3 ounces. They also sell a line of traps so you can build your own multiband antennas. SOTABEAMS also sells a line of QRP tuners to help you match your radio to your antenna. 
Swamps StompersSubmitted by Ed Taggard K7EDT

As of July 1st, 2017, you must send a copy of or show an ARES membership card to keep from paying the \$25 surcharge for new plates or renewals. If you send a renewal in by mail with the lesser amount and do not include a copy of your ARES membership card, they will return your renewal and check due to insufficient funds.

If you want to become an ARES member, complete an ARES Registration Form FD-98 on the TNARES.com website. The click on Information in the upper right. Scroll down and click on ARES Membership Application: FSD-98.

If you are not an ARES member and you do not want to pay the \$25 surcharge for renewal, you can get a regular plate for no additional charge. You will need a copy of your previous registration or there is an additional \$3 charge.

If a spouse is also a ham, only one of the couple needs to be an ARES member if the auto is registered in both names. If registered in the spouse's name, the spouse must have an ARES membership card.
