- 2. Go to OnLineFiling box, Click on LOG IN
- 3. Enter your FCC Federal Registration Number (FRN) and Password
 - a. If you do not know your FRN, go to Search box and click on License Click on Amateur; Enter your callsign in Callsign box;


Your FRN is in center of page after your name


- b. If you do not know your Password, click on Contact Tech Support after Forgot your Password
- 4. In When My Licenses screen comes up, Clink on Now in the green line reading "Change your paper authorization preferences <u>here</u>, or download your official electronic authorizations <u>now"</u>
- 5. In Under Download Authorizations screen, highlight your callsign in the My Authorization area at the bottom left.
- 6. Click on ADD to right of the highlighted callsign.
- 7. Highlight your callsign in Authorization to Download and then click on Download on bottom right of screen.
- 8. If pop-ups are blocked, click on Allow One
- 9. Click Open at bottom.
- 10. Print your License.

Amateur Hardware Update

Many times we like to build up our own equipment. New radio transceiver kits are available from many companies. One company offering the most radio for the dollar is HF SIGNALS. They offer a CW/SSB transceiver that operates from 3 to 30 MHZ. They call it the "micro" bitx. It has dual VFOs, RIT, CW Keyer and much more. The output is about 10 watts. The unit also works as a general coverage receiver. The micro controller is the Adruino Nano. The analog receiver has a 45 MHZ roofing filter and 8 crystal SSB filter. The radio can also operate digital modes like PSK31. The best part of this kit is the main board is completely assembled and tested in India by a collective of women. All toroids are hand wound and also mounted on the board. You mount the display, controls, etc., in your own case and wire them up. Amateurs have wired these up and had a working radio in under 5 hours. They even include a microphone for SSB. This kit offers so much and is so popular they are trying to keep up with the order volume. If you want to build a small all in one QRP rig check this one out.
