President's Corner



DARC Board of Directors Meeting Minutes

May 7, 2019 -- Submitted by Mary Jean Hall KN4FBL

Attendees: Steve Frazier KK4VPT, Bob Van Keuren KM4SEB, Mary Jean Hall KN4FBL, David Jackson KM4SEC, Joe Lowenthal WA4OVO (via phone), Ed Taggard K7EDT, Scott Adams KM4PMU, Len Grice W4MKS and four guests Absent: Bob Vawter KW4RJ, Barry McDonald W5CJ

Steve F. called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. at the Ellendale Church of Christ.

Linda Laseter KJ4CTX updated the board on the progress of the food plans for Field Day since the YLs have volunteered to coordinate food. She asked the board to approve a budget increase from \$600 to \$802.27 (tax included). Planning for 140 meals (50-lunch, 70-dinner, 20-breakfast), that comes out to just \$6.69 per person. The YLs are planning to cook barbeque for lunch, burgers/chicken/hot dogs for dinner, and sausage biscuits/fruit for breakfast. The quote also included snacks, drinks and other utensils (forks, plates, etc.) as well. The previous estimate of \$600 did not include utensils or sodas and accounted for pizza instead of barbeque. Bob V. K. moved to increase the budget allowance from \$600 to \$802.27. Mary Jean seconded the motion. The board unanimously approved it.

Linda Laseter KJ4CTX gave an update on the March of Dimes March for Babies event. She said the event went well with communications but expressed her concerns over the event's smaller size.

David J. read the Treasurer's Report. He is working on filing the appropriate financial forms. He talked with the bank about options to accept credit cards for membership payments, and they recommended it wasn't worth the fee.

Bob V.K. reminded the board that Field Day is June 22-23 in Germantown. Steve F. has volunteered to cover the 80M station.

The board discussed the W4M Event QSL card.

Ed T. said that Rick Tillman WA4NVM would discuss "Getting Started with Amateur Satellites" for the May program.

Joe L. (via phone) discussed logistics for the Huntsville Hamfest bus trip in August. The bus/trip is expected to cost about \$2,500 (\$1,925-bus; \$75-tip; \$300-Hamfest entries; \$100-

biscuits; \$100-Misc. snacks). The board decided on a two-tier ticket system. Anyone who pays to reserve his or her spot in May-June will pay just \$70, and anyone paying after July 1 will pay \$85. A second spouse or family member in the same household can attend for \$50.

The board discussed W4M Event plans and determined that the May 25 on-site event will last from noon to 7 p.m.

The board discussed the review of memberships per the club's bylaws.

Without objection, Steve F. adjourned the meeting at 8:18 p.m. The next Board of Directors meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, June 4, 2019 at 6:30 p.m. at Ellendale Church of Christ.

Call to Order and Opening Remarks

W4M Memphis Bicentennial Event – Planning Meeting Members of Delta Club utilized the program time of the April 9, 2019 meeting to plan the W4M Memphis Bicentennial Event.

The Delta Amateur Radio Club is hosting a special event to help celebrate the City of Memphis Bicentennial Celebration this May. Delta Club has secured the special call sign, W4M, to use from May 17 through May 31. There will be an on-site event on Saturday, May 25, 2019. The actual date for Memphis's Bicentennial is Wednesday, May 22, 2019 but several events are occurring on Saturday, May 25, 2019.

Steve Frazier KK4VPT updated everyone on the current progress: location is secured, event information is on the QRZ page and set to come out in the May issue, and other smaller, completed tasks.

Steve Frazier KK4VPT said that there are no outside outlets located where we will be setup, but it may be a good opportunity for the club to practice and exhibit our ability to be self-sufficient with batteries/generators. He reminded everyone that the plan was to have different club members operate the call sign from home locations throughout the two weeks, and then have the set location on May 25.

Barry McDonald W5CJ updated everyone to the status of obtaining a Logbook of the World account for the event. He is finalizing W4BS registration, and then he will secure the needed information for the W4M event.

Steve Frazier KK4VPT asked for members to submit ideas for QSL card designs and showed some examples of previous ones. Everyone discussed using cards versus certificates and whether to mail or email them.

Ham Hilliard W4GMM said that we would likely get more participants if we tell them during earlier contacts that each person needs to make a set number of contacts, maybe at different times for different operators, to receive a certificate. We could also use this method to encourage them to call in on May 25 to make contact.

Steve Frazier KK4VPT said that Len Grice W4MKS had already started contacting the appropriate people, but anyone with additional ideas should get in touch with him. 
Tech Class 2-19 – February 21-March 28, 2019

HOW TO PRINT YOUR FCC LICENSE

- 1. Go to https://wireless2.fcc.gov/UlsEntry/licManager/login.jsp
- 2. Enter your FCC Federal Registration Number (FRN) and Password
 - a. If you do not know your FRN, go to Search box and click on License
 Click on Amateur; Enter your callsign in Callsign box;
 Your FRN is in center of page after your name
 (If you do not know your Password, click on Contact Tech Support after Forgot your Password)
- 3. In When My Licenses screen comes up, click on **Now** in the green line reading "Change your paper authorization preferences <u>here</u>, or download your official electronic authorizations now"
- 4. In Under Download Authorizations screen, highlight your callsign in the My Authorization area at the bottom left.
- 5. Click on ADD to right of the highlighted callsign.
- 6. Highlight your callsign in Authorization to Download and then click on Download on bottom right of screen.
- 7. If pop-ups are blocked, click on Allow One
- 8. Click Open at bottom.
- 9. Print your License.

Amateur Hardware Update

Since a lot of our equipment runs on 12 VDC we need to make sure the voltage is with in a range that is required. One new product to do this is the "volt tattler". This is a microprocessor that monitors the DC voltage and reports the status. The board has status LED lights to display voltages that are above or below limits that you set. It also has an audio alarm that sends morse code "L" for low voltage alarm and "H" for high voltage alarm. The unit also has a green flashing LED to show the voltage is being monitored. The monitor also has an accessory output header to send a signal to a remote device to alert of the alarm. This low power unit only draws 1 milliamp during normal operation. Voltage is monitored at up to 20 times per second. The cost is \$25 in kit form. It is a cheap peace of mind to protect expensive equipment. To learn more go to QRPKITS. Many time when hooking up our equipment we need to do wiring. Over the years new products have been released to make this job easier. One of these is the "T Splice". This does two important functions to make hookup easier. One is that it provides a clamp on the existing wire which cuts through the insulation and the T Splice also makes a secure contact with the metal wire inside. The other function is to provide a tap to plug a connector into that allows the device
