
The next **Extra** license class will probably start in early January 2026. The nest **Technician** license class will probably start mid to late February 2026.




August Membership Meeting Signal Report

Program's Corner Submitted by Adam White, K4SPB

I was recently building a geographic information system (GIS) application for a soon-to-be announced club project and noticed that several members of the club, including myself, were plotted in the wrong location. Joe, NS4E, pulled location data by querying QRZ.com's application programming interface (API). This was confusing to me because the address on QRZ is a reflection of the FCC's database. I went digging in my profile and found that QRZ has a separate page that does not automatically update when your address changes. If you want to check that yours is set correctly, the process is convoluted but fast.

Go to the QRZ.com homepage and log in. Hover over your callsign in the top right corner and click "Account". Now go back to that menu and this time click Edit (callsign). Now you'll see a load of setting options. The fourth one down is "Map, Grid Square, and **coordinate** settings". Here you can either enter your coordinates or your 6 digit grid square and the other will autofill. Using the 6 digit grid square will place a pin in the center of that grid. Unfortunately, the site does not support an 8 digit grid. If you want to share your location more accurately, you can find coordinates by right clicking your location on Google Maps.

If you've moved since you created your QRZ account, please take a moment to check this and update it. It would help the club as we work on this mapping project.

Last month, Ryan K0RET, Adam K4SPB, and I went to Methodist North to work on the roof. Adam and I replaced the APRS antenna and got the digipeater back on the air. 

Packet Update

Many times we need topographical data for locations. You may want to know the height of a spot you plan on operating from. When I was looking for land to build on, I had to buy USGS maps for the areas I was looking at. I did not want to build on a low spot that flooded and wanted enough height above surrounding terrain for my antennas to work well. Today with the internet we can go to the USGS website and look at maps for free. They have a function where you just put in your address and it comes up. You can adjust the map like you want it and take a screen shot or print it.

Amateur Hardware Update

Amateurs may want to monitor their radio station while working around the house. Older radios do not have this option. A cheap simple way I found is to use a wireless baby monitor. The monitor has a transmitter with a plug in power supply. The receiver has batteries to make it portable. The battery supplied with mine is rechargeable with the included charger. The receiver is small and includes a belt clip. The battery last about 8 hours before recharging is needed. I can use it monitor nets and calling frequencies on the band for activity and propagation. No wires to run. You just hook it up and it works. The system I bought was a VTECH. The price was under \$20. If you need to monitor your station remotely check out his easy to use option.

A Brief History of the Huntsville Hamfest Bus Trip

If you have ever listened to the nightly nets on the .82 repeater during the months of June, July, or August; I am certain you have heard the announcement regarding the bus trip to the Huntsville Hamfest. While we can almost recite the announcement regarding the fare, the Danver's biscuits, and being able to rest your weary feet, how many of you know much about the history of this trip over the years?

As it turns out, this trip originated in 2007 or 2008 and was organized by the fine folks over at MARA. Back then the trip was done with a local bus company in Bartlett before they were bought out by Cline. About those Danver's biscuits we all crave, well in the early years of this trip Lane Morris N4GMT used to cook all the breakfast biscuits for those going on the trip. Another interesting tidbit is that back then the fare was only \$47.00 and the trip averaged just under 50 people.

Joe Lowenthal WA4OVO began organizing the trip in 2009. In an effort to make things more convenient, he tried having 2 pickup points, 1 at Ellendale Church of Christ and the other at Germantown Baptist. This was eventually abandoned as the time it took for the bus to get from Ellendale to Germantown was much longer than anticipated.

When asked if any of these trips were "Eventful?" Joe mentioned one of the years, the bus ran out of fuel on its way back just outside of Walnut, MS. The area had some really high grass on the shoulder, so everyone had to stay on the bus or face getting eaten up with chiggers. Thankfully the driver was able to contact someone, and they brought enough diesel to get the bus to a filling station in Walnut.

Delta Club BOD Meeting Minutes September 2, 2025

Minutes of the Delta Amateur Radio Club Board of Directors Meeting - September 2, 2025

Present: President Joe Plunk, NS4E, Vice President Tyler Henley, KQ4QEV, Secretary Perry Hayes N4GJ, Treasurer Paul Broom, KY4MX, Director of Programs Adam White, K4SPB, Director of Meetings and Special Events, Scott Adams KM4PMU, Director of Publications Johnathan Urschel, KO4WAQ, Director of Training Joe Lowenthal, WA4OVO, Repeater Trustee Dan Fleek, AA4DF, Club Historian John Reiners, KN4BVH.

Absent: None.

Guests: Josh Cunningham, KQ4IOS.

The Delta Amateur Radio Club (DARC) Board of Directors (BOD) met on September 2, 2025, via a ZOOM video conference call. The President and Secretary were present. President Joe Plunk, NS4E, called the meeting to order at 6:42pm

Secretary Perry Hayes called the roll and declared a quorum.

President Joe Plunk said that he really enjoyed the Huntsville Hamfest. He especially enjoyed speaking with the ARRL officials who were in attendance.

Director of Meetings and Special Events Scott Adams resigned from the BOD. Joe Plunk and the BOD thanked Scott for his many years of dedicated service. Joe Plunk asked if there was any opposition to him appointing Josh Cunningham to fill the vacancy. There were no objections.

Joe Plunk appointed Josh Cunningham as the new Director of Meetings and Special Events. Josh was welcomed by the President and the BOD.

Secretary Perry Hayes said he did not receive any corrections to his minutes of the August DARC Membership Meeting, which were circulated by email. Joe Plunk asked if there were any objections to presenting the minutes to the membership at the September meeting. There were no objections.

Perry Hayes presented the membership applications that had been received since the July BOD meeting. The list was prepared by Treasurer Paul Broom. Perry Hayes made a motion to accept all of the applications, which was seconded by Vice President Tyler Henley. The motion passed unanimously.

Treasurer Paul Broom presented the Treasurer's Report.

Paul said that he renewed the club's Certificate of Deposit, with an account number ending in 8481.

Perry Hayes made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report, which was seconded by Director of Publications Johnathan Urschel. The motion passed without opposition.

Joe Plunk asked if any additional bills were expected during the month of September. No BOD members were aware of any additional bills.

Director of Programs Adam White discussed the topics for the September "Ham 101" session and Membership Meeting.

President Joe Plunk said that the repeater team made a visit to the Methodist North site recently. The antenna donated by Johnathan Urschel was installed and is working well. APRS and the 220 repeater are now operational. Ryan Turner, K0RET, also installed a Meshtastic node at the site.

President Joe Plunk said that the Bylaws Committee had no report.

There was a discussion about forming a Nominating Committee, in preparation for the November BOD elections.

Director of Publications Johnathan Urschel asked everyone to submit their articles for *Sparks* as soon as possible.

Joe Lowenthal said that the bus trip to the Huntsville Hamfest broke even, financially, thanks to a contribution made by an anonymous donor. 29 people paid for the trip and 28 of them rode on the bus. Other members also made donations to support the trip. The club made \$146 through sales at the Hamfest.

There was a discussion about how the donations to the bus trip should be reflected in the DARC's budget accounts. There was a consensus that the donations should be applied to the account for the Huntsville Bus Trip, and not treated as general donations to the club.

Johnathan Urschel discussed the prizes that he purchased for the drawings at the November membership meeting.

Paul Broom moved to approve the list of prizes, which was seconded by Perry Hayes. The motion passed unanimously.

There was a discussion about buying supplies to make power cables, which would also be given away as prizes in November. Joe Plunk recommended that the BOD approve the purchase of the supplies, to pay for the supplies from the BOD's discretionary fund, and to limit the amount spent to \$100.

Perry Hayes made a motion, which was seconded by Tyler Henley. The motion passed without opposition.

Repeater Trustee Dan Fleek suggested that the DARC consider setting up a tent and operating radios at the Bartlett Firefighters 43rd Annual Pancake Breakfast, to be held from 7-11am on October 25th at The Venue at Bartlett Station, 5868 Stage Road.

There was enthusiastic support for Dan's idea. The BOD agreed to recommend DARC's participation in the event to the membership.

Joe Plunk said that the Bluff City Blues Ride is also scheduled in October (October 11). DARC has traditionally supported this event.

Joe Plunk asked if any BOD members had additional reports.

Director of Training Joe Lowenthal said that a General Class License Class is tentatively scheduled to begin on November 3rd. The class would meet on 6 Monday nights, ending on December 8th. The location of the class has not been finalized at this time.

Joe Lowenthal also said that the DARC listing on the AARL website needed to be updated, because the list of club officers is not current. Joe Plunk said he would make the necessary updates.

Repeater Trustee Dan Fleek said that the APRS digipeater is now operational at the Methodist North repeater site. Dan said that a Meshtastic node had also been installed.

There being no further business, President Joe Plunk said he would entertain a motion to adjourn. Perry Hayes made a motion to adjourn, which was seconded by Johnathan Urschel. The motion passed unanimously.

President Joe Plunk adjourned the meeting at 7:38pm.

The next regular meeting of the Delta Amateur Radio Club Board of Directors is scheduled for Tuesday, October 7, 2025 at 6:30pm, via Zoom.

Minutes of the Delta Amateur Radio Club Membership Meeting - August 12, 2025

President Joe Plunk welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Secretary Perry Hayes called the roll of the Board of Directors (BOD) and declared a guorum.

Joe Plunk asked everyone to introduce themselves and to talk about the person who gave them their start in amateur radio.

He said that the ARRL and the hobby can grow by everyone recruiting one new ARRL member, by approaching a public library with an ARRL book set, by reaching out to area scout troops, by approaching schools about the STEM aspect of amateur radio, by reaching out to the FRS and GMRS communities and by hams introducing the hobby to their friends.

There being no further business, President Joe Plunk said that he would entertain a motion to adjourn. Josh Cunningham, KQ4IOS, made the motion, which was seconded by Perry Hayes. The motion passed unanimously. President Joe Plunk adjourned the meeting at 8:35 pm.

The next regular membership meeting of the Delta Amateur Radio Club is scheduled for Tuesday, September 9, 2025 at the Mid-America Baptist Theological Seminary, beginning at 7:00pm.

As of April 19, 2022 there is a \$35 FCC application fee for new hams, renewals, Vanity callsigns, etc except for license upgrade, systematic callsign issue, name, address or email changes. This is in addition to the \$15 ARRL VEC FCC exam fee.

The new Technician ARRL Ham Radio License Manual is the Fifth Edition with question pool that becomes effective July 1, 2022 for four years.

The current ARRL General Class License Manual is the Tenth Edition with question pool that became effective July 1, 2023 for four years.

The current ARRL Extra Class License Manual is the Thirteenth Edition with question pool that became effective July 1, 2024 for four years.

As of late 2019, expired Amateur Radio license holders can get their license back by taking the current Technician exam and show proof of their previous license class. A previous Advanced Class licensee will only be able to get a General Class license.
