The next **General** license class will start in November 2025 The next **Extra** license class will start January 2026.


Huntsville Hamfest Bus Trip – August 16, 2025


May Membership Meeting Signal Report

We will take your reservation money (cash or check) at the June or July Delta Club meetings as well as at Field Day, June 28/29th.



Many of us have used APRS on amateur radio. We have APRS weather stations setup. We also have mobile APRS stations updating their locations constantly. One internet application will allow you to monitor activity anywhere in the world. I can set the map to my area where I can see mobiles and weather stations around me. By clicking on the stations I can see the weather conditions. I can also watch mobile APRS moving around the area. You can also look at station information, raw packet data, and other data. No program is required. You just go to the website to get all the information. I just set up a shortcut on my main computer screen to access the site. Amateur Hardware Update Submitted by James Butler, KB4LJV

Using online SDR receivers on the internet is a great way to have a receiver to monitor the amateur bands. I can log into a receiver anywhere in the world. It works great for AM shortwave stations, Ham SSB, and CW. I was able to receive digital signals but had no way to decode them. I could use another computer and send audio to that one and run digital software like WSJTX for FT8. I found a software package from VB-CABLE. It is a virtual audio cable

that that lets you connect audio from one application on you computer to another. I installed the software and could now run an SDR receiver on the screen along side of WSJTX. I set up WSJTX to receive audio from the SDR and now I can receive and decode digital signals with one computer on the same screen. Using this software I can now monitor digital signals on the band. I can select an SDR at a distant location, listen to and decode my own digital signals. I transmit from my home station for signal strength and quality. They have a free basic package on their website. They also sell advanced packages for a donation. The newest package I got works from windows XP thru Windows 11. The Delta Amateur Radio Club (DARC) Board of Directors (BOD) met on June 3, 2025, via a ZOOM video conference call. The President and Secretary were present. President Joe Plunk, NS4E, called the meeting to order at 6:38pm

Secretary Perry Hayes, N4GJ, called the roll and declared a quorum.

President Joe Plunk, NS4E, announced that he appointed Paul Broom, KY4MX, to serve as Treasurer, due to the untimely passing of Jim Martin, KD4FUU. Paul has agreed to serve as Treasurer for at least 6 months. Director of Training Joe Lowenthal, WA4OVO, moved to

Joe Lowenthal added the W4BS station to the ARRL Field Day Station Locator.

There was a discussion about food and drinks at this year's event. Dan Fleek will be cooking and Josh Cunningham, KQ4IOS, will be working with Scott Adams on the snacks and drinks. Scott will not be able to attend this year. Since MARA will not be participating, DARC may have to spend more than normal on food and drinks. If the cost of refreshments goes over budget, the BOD will ask the membership to adjust the budget.

There is no charge for classes, but the student is responsible for the purchase of the license manual and the \$15 ARRL FCC examination fee. The FCC implemented a \$35 Administration Fee on April 19, 2022.

As of April 19, 2022 there is a \$35 FCC application fee for new hams, renewals, Vanity callsigns, etc except for license upgrade, systematic callsign issue, name, address or email changes. This is in addition to the \$15 ARRL VEC FCC exam fee.

The new Technician ARRL Ham Radio License Manual is the Fifth Edition with question pool that becomes effective July 1, 2022 for four years.

The current ARRL General Class License Manual is the Tenth Edition with question pool that became effective July 1, 2023 for four years.

The current ARRL Extra Class License Manual is the Thirteenth Edition with question pool that became effective July 1, 2024 for four years.

As of late 2019, expired Amateur Radio license holders can get their license back by taking the current Technician exam and show proof of their previous license class. A previous Advanced Class licensee will only be able to get a General Class license.

- **4.** In Under Download Authorizations screen, highlight your callsign in the My Authorization area at the bottom left.
- 5. Click on ADD to right of the highlighted callsign.
- **6.** Highlight your callsign in Authorization to Download and then click on Download on bottom right of screen.
- 7. If pop-ups are blocked, click on Allow One
