





January Membership Meeting Signal Report





I just completed a portable battery backup system built for use in emergency situations. Last spring I purchased a battery powered weed trimmer. I selected one with a 40V 4 Ah battery with the idea that I would create this battery backup system. I purchased a battery cradle that was compatible with the battery, an 8V - 40V to 13.8V 25A regulator, a battery level indicator, a USB outlet plug with voltmeter, a cigarette lighter plug, and an Anderson Power Pole dual output plug. I purchased a second 40V 6Ah battery. I put all these items plus the battery charger in a Fat 50 Cal Ammo Can. This system should deliver 25Ah at 13.8V. I will perform endurance testing in May to see how well this performs.


Packet Update

The company also allows you to run lots of different Linux operating systems. The Linux systems you can run include Zoran, Unbuntu, and others. You

can also run the Kodi Media operating system. You can run the MAC OS Emulator if you want to. Amateur Hardware Update

Many times during contests, continuous calling on the air will wear out your voice. I built up a digital voice recorder years ago that works but took a lot of parts. A new completely built up printed circuit board has now come out to do this function. The ISD1820 is a small circuit board that has the recorder/ playback chip, a microphone for recording, speaker-out terminals with a small speaker for playback, and all the buttons to record and playback the message. The board allows you to play the message back one time at the push of a button. Another button allows you to go in the loop mode to constantly repeat the message until it is stopped. You can change the message at any time by pressing the record button. The voice message can be up to 10 seconds long which is perfect for a custom CQ call. The best thing is the price for under \$5 for the unit. If you want to play with a voice recorder for contests try this board out. Do a search on Ebay for "ISD1820".

The Delta Amateur Radio Club (DARC) Board of Directors (BOD) met on February 4, 2025, via a ZOOM video conference call. The President and Secretary were present. President Joe Plunk, NS4E, called the meeting to order at 6:40pm

Secretary Perry Hayes, N4GJ, called the roll and declared a quorum.

New Business

Secretary Perry Hayes presented his minutes of the January 2025 Membership Meeting.

Director of Training Joe Lowenthal, WA4OVO, made a motion to accept the Secretary's Minutes, which was seconded by Repeater Trustee Dan Fleek, AA4DF. The motion passed unanimously.

Joe Plunk presented the membership renewal applications that have been received since the January BOD meeting.

Director of Programs Adam White, K4SPB, made a motion to accept all of the membership applications, which was seconded by Dan Fleek. The motion passed without opposition.

Treasurer Jim Martin, KD4FUU, presented the Treasurer's Report.

Jim reported that the Club's Small Business Certificate of Deposit (with an account number ending in *8503) matures on 2/23/25. The consensus of the BOD was for Jim Martin to have the authority to roll over the CD at the best interest rate possible.

Perry Hayes made a motion, which was seconded by Joe Lowenthal. The motion passed unanimously.

Director of Publications Mike Harrison, KM4MRW, made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report, which was seconded by Vice President Tyler Henley, KQ4QEV. The motion passed without opposition.

There was a discussion about any bills and reimbursement requests expected in February.

Board Reports

Director of Publications Mike Harrison asked everyone to submit their articles for *Sparks* as soon as possible. There was a discussion about Mike's update of the club website and the *Sparks* newsletter.

President Joe Plunk and Secretary Perry Hayes talked about the membership renewals that the club has received.

Director of Programming Adam White, K4SPB, discussed the program topics for the February membership meeting.

Repeater Trustee Dan Fleek, AA4DF, reported that the 443.700 DMR repeater was up and running. The repeater has been performing well and many hams have used it. There was a discussion about holding a DMR net.

Dan will visit the Germantown repeater site soon to make upgrades. Visits to the Methodist North and University of Memphis repeater sites are also planned.

Joe Plunk recognized Dan Fleek for his outstanding work on the DMR repeater project.

There was a discussion about the feedback to the *Signal Report* and *Programming* surveys that are offered to the membership. Possible topics for Ham 101 and monthly programs were discussed.

Treasurer Jim Martin said that he updated the proposed budget after the BOD meeting in January. He discussed a change to the amount budgeted for the Memphis FreeFest donation.

Jim will submit the budget for publication in *Sparks* and will be ready to present the budget at the February membership meeting.

Perry Hayes made a motion to accept the proposed budget, which was seconded by Tyler Henley. The motion passed without opposition.

There was a discussion about future events on the 2025 calendar, Memphis FreeFest, other area hamfests, plans for the Ham 101 class and Field Day.

Additional Reports

President Joe Plunk, Secretary Perry Hayes, Treasurer Jim Martin, Directory of Meetings and Special Events Scott Adams, KM4PMU, Director of Publications Mike Harrision and Repeater Trustee Dan Fleek had no additional reports.

Immediate Past President Ty McMahan, KX4MQ, was absent, and made no report.

Director of Programs Adam White said that many members showed interest in Winlink after his presentation in January. He may offer a Ham 101 class on installing Winlink software at the February meeting.

Director of Training Joe Lowenthal said that a Technician Class license class will start on February 24th and meet via Zoom on six Monday nights from 6:15-9:30pm. There will not be a class on March 10th. FCC testing will be offered on March 31st, with the location to be determined.

Joe said 5 students were finishing the Extra Class license class, and two have already passed their exams. FCC testing for the class will be offered at the February DARC meeting.

There was a discussion about Volunteer Examiner Coordinators and DARC possibly offering electronic FCC testing in the future.

There being no further business, President Joe Plunk said he would entertain a motion to adjourn. Mike Harrison made a motion to adjourn, which was seconded by Joe Lowenthal. The motion passed without opposition.

President Joe Plunk adjourned the meeting at 7:56pm.

The club makes \$5 for each renewal and \$15 for each new membership application. Anyone interested may fill out an application and make their check payable to Joe. Joe will pay the ARRL by credit card.

Joe asked to take a moment in memory of SK Barry McDonald, W5CJ. Barry's visitation will be held at Collierville First Baptist Church on Friday, January 17th at 10:00am. The memorial service will be held at 11:00am. Joe said that Barry will be sorely missed.

Joe Punk agreed that Barry McDonald would be sorely missed. He asked everyone to observe a moment of silence.

Repeater Trustee Dan Fleek, AA4DF, reported that the new DMR repeater has arrived. Dan needs to get the internet and some cabling installed at the site. Dan has registered with RadioID.net and has obtained a talkgroup from Brandmeister.

The DMR repeater will be on 443.700 MHz with a +5 MHz offset. The repeater will use Color Code 1. Timeslot 1 will offer dynamic linking, and will also have The National Weather Service Memphis talkgroup (314431) statically linked. The New Memphis Metro (TG 314447) and Tennessee Statewide (TG 3147) talkgroups will be statically linked on timeslot 2.

Hams in the area can start using TG 314447 on their hotspots. Dan will make an announcement on Facebook and the Delta Club's Information Net when the repeater goes active. Tests of the repeater could start in a couple of weeks.

Dan said some improvements will be taking place at the 146.625 repeater site in Germantown. Dan is swapping the repeater for an ICOM FR3000 and upgrading the audio controller. The repeater will have more power and probably more range. The repeater will sound much better when linked to the weather nets.

Dan plans on making those same improvements to the 146.82 repeater. Dan will also install Allstar/Echolink, which can be used to connect 146.82 to the weather nets.

Joe Plunk said that the BOD has approved contracting with Mobile Citizen to provide internet service for the Brunswick repeater site. There is a \$35 activation fee and a one-time fee of 264.83 for the hardware. The service costs \$120/year for non-profit entities. Joe passed a hat so that members could make a donation toward the costs of getting internet service at the repeater site. \$456.00 was generously donated.

Mary Jean Hall, KY4FB, said that a few members had expressed interest in serving on the Bylaws Committee. The committee hopes to start meeting in the next few months. Anyone interested in serving on the committee should contact Mary Jean.

Joe Lowenthal said the Club had a power supply, amplifiers and keyers for sale.

Steve Frazier, KK4VPT, said the Swamp Stomper race will be held at Shelby Forest on Saturday, January 18th. The radio team will meet at 6:00am at the General Store. Everything is covered, but Steve would welcome more volunteers. Interested people should contact Steve. The team will be using the 146.82 repeater.

There was a short break after the conclusion of business.

Director of Programs Adam White, K4SPB, gave a presentation on Winlink Global Radio Email, and How to Connect. Winlink is a network of amateur radio and government stations that provide worldwide radio email using radio pathways where the internet is not present. It supports email with attachments, position reporting, weather and information bulletins, and is well-known for its role in interoperable emergency and disaster relief communications.

Adam has a Radio Message Server (RMS) on VHF now (144.990 MHz), and plans to have an HF server up soon.

Joe Plunk asked everyone to complete a Signal Report survey and a Programs Survey.

Joe Plunk said Winter Field Day will run from 4:00pm on Saturday, January 25 to 10:00pm on Sunday, January 26. Joe said that Vice-President Tyler Henley, KQ4QEV, may be getting an informal group together for Winter Field Day. Interested parties should listen for announcements on the Delta Club Information Net.

Joe Plunk asked everyone to renew their memberships, and to invite a new person to join the club.

There being no further business, President Joe Plunk said that he would entertain a motion to adjourn. Bob O'Grady, KO4ZCJ, made a motion to adjourn, which was seconded by Bill Flanigan, KK4VPS. The motion passed without opposition. President Joe Plunk adjourned the meeting at 8:27pm.

The next regular membership meeting of the Delta Amateur Radio Club is scheduled for Tuesday, February 11, 2025 at the Mid-America Baptist Theological Seminary, beginning at 7:00pm.

Note:

As of April 19, 2022 there is a \$35 FCC application fee for new hams, renewals, Vanity callsigns, etc except for license upgrade, systematic callsign issue, name, address or email changes. This is in addition to the \$15 ARRL VEC FCC exam fee.

The new Technician ARRL Ham Radio License Manual is the Fifth Edition with question pool that becomes effective July 1, 2022 for four years.

The current ARRL General Class License Manual is the Tenth Edition with question pool that became effective July 1, 2023 for four years.

The current ARRL Extra Class License Manual is the Thirteenth Edition with question pool that became effective July 1, 2024 for four years.

As of late 2019, expired Amateur Radio license holders can get their license back by taking the current Technician exam and show proof of their previous license class. A previous Advanced Class licensee will only be able to get a General Class license.
