The next **General** license class will probably start in early November 2024.


The next **Extra** license class will probably start in early January 2025.

Repeater Corner

I finally ordered and received a new Hustler G7-144b antenna. We needed to replace the old, damaged antenna on the APRS digipeater at Methodist North Hospital. Thankfully the bonus



room at the house let me assemble and tune a 15-foot antenna. I then unscrewed some sections so I could get the antenna out of the house, up the elevator at North, and pulled up the side of the top section of the building.

Saturday, Joe and I headed out to Methodist North. Once everything was on the roof, Joe Plunk and I reassembled the antenna, mounted the antenna onto the pipe, and tilted it up to do a SWR test. Test SWR was 1.18. Awesome. We connected the hardline and I went down the ladder, into the elevator room and hooked up the analyzer. SWR was 5. What?! We swapped the hardline for the 220 repeater antenna and boom, 1.18 SWR. We connected the radio to the coax, powered it up and watched it beacon. Joe used his Kenwood TH-D74A to send out some APRS and we verified it on aprs.fi. A successful day fixing the



PACKET UPDATE

Many amateurs practice Morse code to improve their ability to copy and improve speed. One nice program for your computer that will allow you to do this is "CWStudio". This is a free program developed to allow you to practice Morse code using simulated conditions you will encounter while operating on your radio. Versions of this program will run on Windows and Mac computers. The software is small and does not require an install. You can type in your own text to be sent or use the program to play a text file. The program is adjustable for receiver noise and other stations on frequency which makes this a perfect simulation for real world conditions you will encounter. The program will also allow you to save an MP3 audio file to playback later. If you want to do Morse code practice with realistic audio try "CWStudio". The web address is https://cwstudio.sourceforge.net/#/

AMATEUR HARDWARE UPDATE

When we operate older Heathkit QRP or modern QRP rigs audio output can be low. They are normally made to run a set of headphones for operation. If we can add an audio amplifier we can get a louder volume on our headphones or even run a speaker. The LM386 chip can be used to amplify audio. This chip can be bought in a module that is completely built and ready to hook up. A super small version of the amplifier can be installed inside the QRP rig. Slightly larger versions have different connectors for the audio in, audio out, and power supply. These LM386 based amplifiers operate on 3 to 12 volts DC. On Ebay they have many different versions of the LM386 amplifier. To find the style you want, just do a search for "LM386 audio amplifier module".

DARC Board of Directors Meeting Minutes

Delta Club BOD Meeting Minutes - August 6, 2024

Minutes of the Delta Amateur Radio Club Board of Directors Meeting - August 6, 2024

Present: President Joe Plunk, NS4E, Secretary Perry Hayes N4GJ, Treasurer Jim Martin, KD4FUU, Director of Training Joe Lowenthal, WA4OVO, Director of Programs John Reiners, KN4BVH, Director of Meetings and Special Events, Scott Adams KM4PMU, Director of Publications Mike Harrison, KM4MRW, Repeater Trustee Dan Fleek, AA4DF.

Absent: Vice-President Tyler Henley, KQ4QEV (actively serving in the military), Public Information Officer Adam White K4SPB, Immediate Past President Ty McMahan KQ4MQ.

Guests: None

The Delta Amateur Radio Club (DARC) Board of Directors (BOD) met on August 6, 2024, via a ZOOM video conference call. The President and Secretary were present. President Joe Plunk, NS4E, called the meeting to order at 6:30pm

Secretary Perry Hayes, N4GJ, called the roll and declared a quorum.

President Joe Plunk welcomed everyone to the meeting. Joe said he was looking forward to the Huntsville bus trip.

Secretary Perry Hayes asked for a motion to accept the minutes from the July 2024 DARC Membership Meeting, as circulated to the BOD by email, and the July 2024 BOD Meeting Minutes, as published in *Sparks*. Director of Publications Mike Harrison, KM4MRW, made a motion to accept the minutes, which was seconded by Repeater Trustee Dan Fleek, AA4DF. The motion passed unanimously.

Secretary Perry Hayes and Treasurer Jim Martin, KD4FUU, presented the membership applications that had been received since the July BOD meeting. Perry Hayes made a motion to approve all of the membership applications, which was seconded by Director of Training Joe Lowenthal, WA4OVO. The motion passed without opposition.

Treasurer Jim Martin presented the Treasurer's Report. Jim reported that the DARC's charitable organization status with the State of Tennessee was up to date. Jim said he is still waiting to hear from the State regarding DARC's tax exempt status for purchases.

Director of Programs John Reiners, KN4BVH, made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report, which was seconded by Perry Hayes. The motion passed unanimously.

Jim Martin said no regular bills would be due in August. Jim said he anticipated expenditures for the bus trip to the Huntsville Hamfest. Joe Plunk asked if the expenditures were expected to exceed the \$3,000 which is budgeted for the trip. Jim said he did not expect the expenditures to exceed \$3,000, but asked for comments from Joe Lowenthal. Joe Lowenthal said that he did not expect the expenditures to be over \$3,000 and he expected to have a little surplus.

Director of Programs John Reiners presented the program topics for the August DARC Membership Meeting.

Repeater Trustee Dan Fleek reported that the APRS antenna at Methodist North was beyond repair, so he purchased a new one. Dan said that the 220 antenna at Methodist North was taken apart and reassembled. The SWR on the 220 antenna is good, but Dan may need to replace the N connector.

Dan Fleek reported that the 146.82 repeater is still experiencing intermittent noise. He would like to examine the Brunswick repeater site when the repeater is having noise issues. Dan would also like to test and see if he can create any mechanical noise on the repeater. A former Trustee told Dan about some mechanical noise at the repeater site.

Dan said he paid for the APRS antenna himself, and would seek reimbursement from the Club. Joe Plunk said the funds should come from the Repeater line item in the budget.

Joe Plunk said that the Bylaws Committee had no report at this time. Mary Jean Hall, KY4FB, is still looking for members to serve on the committee.

In new topics, Joe Plunk reminded the BOD that Friday (August 9th) was the deadline to submit items to be published in the August edition of *Sparks*. Joe said he was still working with Mike Harrison on streamlining the format of the newsletter. Joe also said that he would like the BOD members to contribute articles to *Sparks*.

Joe Lowenthal reported on the DARC's plans for the Huntsville Hamfest. The bus trip is fully funded. Approximately 21 riders have registered and paid their fare. There was also a substantial gift toward the bus trip from an anonymous donor. An additional \$200 was donated last year, and carried over to this year. DARC will have 2 tables at the Hamfest, near the back door.

The bus will leave Germantown Baptist Church at 6:30am on August 17th. The bus will leave Huntsville after the grand prize drawing, and arrive back in Germantown around 7:45pm.

Joe Plunk asked if the DARC will be selling items at the Hamfest. Joe Lowenthal said that the club would be selling items. Joe Lowenthal and his volunteers will inventory the remaining items and create a spreadsheet. The items themselves will be sorted and placed in bins for transport to Huntsville. Volunteers are needed to help with the transport of DARC's sale items. Volunteers are also needed to work DARC's tables at the Hamfest. Anyone interested should contact Joe Lowenthal.

Joe Plunk said that he was willing to help any BOD members that need training on the Club's Google Workspace.

Joe Plunk also said that he and John Reiners will discuss the Field Day responses from the *Signal Report* survey.

Joe Plunk reported that many of the BOD members who agreed to evaluate the HamClubOnline software suite have been out of town during the summer. Work on the evaluation will resume when these members become available.

A BOD member needed to be excused during the meeting, so President Joe Plunk asked Secretary Perry Hayes to call the roll again. Present were: Joe Plunk, Perry Hayes, Dan Fleek, Jim Martin, Joe Lowenthal, John Reiners and Scott Adams.

There being no further business, President Joe Plunk said he would entertain a motion to adjourn. Jim Martin made a motion to adjourn, which was seconded by Dan Fleek. The motion passed without opposition.

President Joe Plunk adjourned the meeting at 7:13pm.

The next regular meeting of the Delta Amateur Radio Club Board of Directors is scheduled for Tuesday, September 3, 2024 at 6:30pm, via Zoom.

Minutes of Last Month's Club Meeting Submitted by Perry Hayes, N4GJ

Minutes of the Delta Amateur Radio Club Membership Meeting July 9, 2024

The July 2024 Delta Amateur Radio Club (DARC) Membership Meeting was held on Tuesday, July 9, 2024 at the Mid-America Baptist Theological Seminary. The President served as the chair and the Secretary was present. Club President Joe Plunk, NS4E, called the meeting to order at 7:00pm. There were 53 members and visitors in attendance.

Present: President Joe Plunk, NS4E, Treasurer Jim Martin, KD4FUU, Secretary Perry Hayes, N4GJ, Director of Programs John Reiners, KN4BVH, Director of Training Joe Lowenthal, WA4OVO, Director of Meetings and Special Events Scott Adams, KM4PMU, Repeater Trustee Dan Fleek, AA4DF, Public Information Officer Adam White, K4SPB.

Absent: Immediate Past-President Ty McMahan, KX4MQ, Vice-President Tyler Henley, KQ4QEV, Director of Publications Mike Harrison, KM4MRW.

President Joe Plunk, NS4E, welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Secretary Perry Hayes, N4GJ, called the roll of the Board of Directors (BOD). Perry declared a quorum.

President Joe Plunk announced that Vice-President Tyler Henley and Public Information Officer (PIO) Adam White had recently joined the BOD. There was a round of applause for Tyler and Adam. Joe reminded the membership about the raffle tickets that are collected at each meeting. Joe also recognized everyone who passed their FCC amateur radio license exams during the evening's testing session.

In business matters, Joe Plunk asked for a motion to approve the Secretary's Minutes and the Treasurer's Report. Ham Hilliard, W4GMM, made a motion to accept the Secretary's Minutes and Treasurer's Report, as published in the July issue of *Sparks*. There was a second by Don Strahl, KZ4GJ. The motion passed unanimously.

Joe Plunk gave each BOD member an opportunity to make a report.

Joe Plunk made some comments about Field Day, and how much he had enjoyed it. Joe also asked everyone to complete a *Signal Report* survey.

Secretary Perry Hayes had no additional matters to report.

Secretary Jim Martin, KD4FUU, said that three new membership applications and one renewal application had already been submitted at the meeting. Jim thanked Randy Redd, KQ4HJH, and the Mid-America Baptist Theological Seminary for hosting the monthly DARC membership meetings, and for providing classroom space for amateur radio license testing and the Ham 101 class. Jim presented Randy with a donation of \$200 from DARC to the Seminary. Director of Programs John Reiners, KN4BVH, said he would welcome ideas for future programs.

Director of Meetings and Special Events Scott Adams, KM4PMU, had no additional matters to report.

Director of Training Joe Lowenthal, WA4OVO, said that 9 students were enrolled in the current Technician Class License Class. Two of the students passed their Technician exams earlier in the evening. Joe said that riders were needed for the bus trip to the Huntsville Hamfest on August 17th, and reminded everyone that the fare would go up to \$120 on August 1st. Joe also discussed a ham radio presentation he made at the Collierville library on June 15th.

Joe Plunk said he was looking forward to the bus trip, and encouraged everyone to register as soon as possible.

Club Repeater Trustee Dan Fleek, AA4D4, reported that he is now on record with the FCC as the DARC Repeater Trustee. Dan said that the intermittent noise on the 146.82 repeater has improved, and the repeater is receiving well.

Dan reported that he is doing some RF modeling and analysis of the Methodist North repeater site. He asked for volunteers to help take down the antenna on top of Methodist North to examine the connector, and to take down the 220 antenna to inspect it for damage. Dan thanked Barry McDonald, W5CJ, for his assistance.

Public Information Officer (PIO) Adam White, K4SPB, encouraged everyone to share any pictures or videos they have of club activities, especially Field Day.

Joe Plunk said that the Bylaws Committee had no matters to report. Joe encouraged anyone who is interested in serving on the committee to contact Mary Jean Hall, KY4FB. He also encouraged anyone who is interested in serving on the repeater committee to contact Dan Fleek, AA4DF.

Director of Programs John Reiners, KN4BVH, moderated the evening's programs, which focused on Field Day.

Carolyn Horne, KX4QF, gave a presentation about her Field Day CW station. She discussed her preparations for the event, as well as the setup, operation and takedown of the station.

John Reiners presented a slideshow of photographs from Field Day. He highlighted and commented on the various stations that were operating. John said that W4BS made 460 contacts (200 CW, 52 Digital, and 208 Phone) and earned 712 points during the event.

John Reiners and Joe Plunk showed maps that displayed the contacts that were made by our Field Day stations and the propagation of our signals. There was a discussion about the success of the GOTA station.

After a break, John Reiners gave a presentation on Go Bags. John discussed the use of Go Bags for amateur radio, as well as other hobbies and potential emergency situations. John talked about items that could be included in Go Bags, and gave examples of bags available on the market.

Joe Plunk reminded everyone to complete a Signal Report survey before leaving the meeting.

There being no further business, Joe Plunk said he would entertain a motion to adjourn. Ham Hilliard made a motion to adjourn, which was seconded by Dennis Foster, KD4BDU. The motion passed without opposition.

President Joe Plunk, NS4E, adjourned the meeting at 8:24pm.

As of April 19, 2022 there is a \$35 FCC application fee for new hams, renewals, Vanity callsigns, etc except for license upgrade, systematic callsign issue, name, address or email changes. This is in addition to the \$15 ARRL VEC FCC exam fee.

The new Technician ARRL Ham Radio License Manual is the Fifth Edition with question pool that becomes effective July 1, 2022 for four years.

The current ARRL General Class License Manual is the Tenth Edition with question pool that became effective July 1, 2023 for four years.

The current ARRL Extra Class License Manual is the Thirteenth Edition with question pool that became effective July 1, 2024 for four years.

As of late 2019, expired Amateur Radio license holders can get their license back by taking the current Technician exam and show proof of their previous license class. A previous Advanced Class licensee will only be able to get a General Class license.

All classes will be 3-1/4 to 4 hours long for six or seven sessions; one per week on a week night 6:15pm-9:30pm or Saturday day 9am-1pm.

- 2. Enter your FCC Federal Registration Number (FRN) and Password
 - a. If you do not know your FRN, go to Search box and click on License Click on Amateur; Enter your callsign in Callsign box; Your FRN is in center of page after your name (If you do not know your Password, click on Contact Tech Support after Forgot your Password)
- **3.** In When My Licenses screen comes up, click on **Now** in the green line reading "Change your paper authorization preferences <u>here</u>, or download your official electronic authorizations now"
- **4.** In Under Download Authorizations screen, highlight your callsign in the My Authorization area at the bottom left.
- **5.** Click on ADD to right of the highlighted callsign.
- **6.** Highlight your callsign in Authorization to Download and then click on Download on bottom right of screen.
- 7. If pop-ups are blocked, click on Allow One
- 8. Click Open at bottom and Print your License.
