#### **DARC Membership Survey**

How do YOU like to ham? The new year has new Board members, and we want to hear your input on where to go in 2024. Follow the link to give us a piece of your mind! survey before January 9<sup>th</sup> as it will close after the Delta Club Meeting. Please let us know if you have any questions or concerns. We welcome your feedback.

For the last month or so, we have been asking our membership to fill out a membership survey. Now I am pleased to report the results received thus far of that survey. So far,we had 46 responses representing 32.4% of the paid membership. The 46 responses were made up of 35 members and 11 non members. An interesting data point that came out of the survey was that 54.3% of the responses (25) hold their Amateur Extra license! One other interesting item that came out of the survey was that 23.9% (11) of the respondents do not operate HF! So now that


we have some of the interesting things out of the way, lets see what the survey tells us about what the membership is interested in. Lets put a few graphs into this, since as they say, "A picture is worth a thousand words!"

Based on the survey responses the most active emergency service is Skywarn! Please see figure 1. This was followed closely behind by ARES.

Our next item of interest was the responses we received to the question: "What modes of operation are you most interested in?" We received a total of 45 responses to this question and the top two were no surprise: SSB and FM. However, DMR, with 26 responses came in a strong third place. Expect to see more information on this mode. Please see the full results in figure 2.




Figure 3: Which Topics Would Make You Attend a Future Club Event

The last item of interest was the responses to the question: "Which topics would make you attend a future club meeting?" We received 42 responses to this question. The top response, by a good margin, with 33 entries was "How-To Presentations." Based on this clear direction from the responses your leadership team are actively making plans to adjust the activities that are offered. We have taken this directive to mean that you, our members, want more "How to do



things" type of information. Please let us know what you think of this month's program. The complete set of responses are shown in figure 3.

So, based on the results of the survey data we see some clear things that our members are asking us to do in 2024. We are being asked for more programs on "How-To" do things. We are being asked to facilitate and embrace Skywarn. We are being asked to look into digital modes. Based on these clear directions we will be working with the board, the members, and our community to start integrating these items into our meetings and events. We need

### **DARC Board of Directors Meeting Minutes**

DARC Board of Directors Meeting Minutes for January 2, 2024

Attendees: Ty McMahan KX4MQ, Joe Plunk NS4E, Perry Hayes N4GJ, Jim Martin KD4FUU, Joe Lowenthal WA4OVO, Mike Harrison KM4MRW, John Reiners KN4BVH, Scott Adams KM4PMU, Barry McDonald W5CJ and Len Grice W4MKS.

The regular monthly meeting of the Delta Amateur Radio Club Board of Directors (BOD) was held on Tuesday, January 2 at 6:32 PM on a Zoom video conference call, with the President serving as chair and the Secretary being present. President Ty McMahan, KX4MQ, called the meeting to order.

Treasurer Jim Martin, KD4FUU, presented the monthly Treasurer's report. He also went over the 2023 budget, the 2023 actual numbers and the proposed 2024 budget. The 2024 budget will be voted on by the board at the February BOD meeting and presented to the membership of the club during the February membership meeting. Several members asked Jim questions about the budget categories and numbers. Jim said he would be happy to answer any questions from the board in advance of the next BOD meeting.

Jim reported that Ty had been added to the signature cards for the club's bank accounts, and Immediate Past President Mary Jean Hall, KY4FB had been removed.

Secretary Perry Hayes, N4GJ, presented 2 renewal applications and 1 new application for membership. Joe Plunk, NS4E, moved to accept these applications, and the motion was seconded by Mike Harrison, KM4MRW. The motion passed without objection.

Director of Meetings & Special Events Scott Adams, KM4PMU, had nothing to report. He noted that the club purchased a new microphone and related equipment last year for use at the Ellendale Church of Christ. This may have made the actual expenditures for Meetings & Special events to appear higher than usual in 2023.

Director of Programs John Reiners, KN4BVH, discussed the topics to be presented at the next membership meeting.

Director of Training Joe Lowenthal, WA4OVO, said that the Delta Club's Extra Class license class has 7 students registered. A new Technician Class license class is scheduled for late February. The class may be offered via Zoom, should there be a problem obtaining classroom space or if seasonal illnesses are severe this winter.

Repeater Trustee Barry McDonald, W5CJ, had nothing to report.

Public Information Officer Len Grice, W4MKS, had nothing to report. Ty McMahan said that he believed the club needed a better social media presence, and asked Len to look into that. Len Grice resigned as Public Information Officer. Ty accepted Len's resignation.

Director of Publications Mike Harrison, KM4MRW, reported that he was currently editing the January, 2024 edition of the <u>Sparks</u> newsletter. The deadline for submitting information to be published in <u>Sparks</u> is the Saturday before the next scheduled membership meeting. Immediate Past President Mary Jean Hall said that the transition of the club presidency to Ty McMahan was successful.

Vice-President Joe Plunk, NS4E, discussed the results of the recent membership survey. The BOD discussed these results and how they might be applied to the operation of the club and the monthly membership meetings. Joe, NS4E, said he would look into the amount of fees the club is currently paying for internet domain registration and hosting.

President Ty McMahan said that a new format is being introduced for the presentations at Delta membership meetings. There will be different tracks, or topics, which cater to Hams of different experience levels. Ty suggested the formation of a Tech Committee, comprised of members with expertise in electronic technology. Ty asked for the blessing of the board to look into Google G-Suite, a software platform that is normally free for non-profit groups. G-Suite may make it much more easy and efficient for the BOD to perform their tasks and to share information. Joe Plunk made a motion to support Ty's request, which was seconded by Mike Harrison. The motion passed without opposition. Ty also asked for the blessing of the board to look into HamClubOnline (HCO). HCO is a software package designed for all aspects of running an amateur radio club - including maintaining membership lists, tracking attendance at meetings, sending and receiving e-mail, and accepting online payments. Perry Hayes made a motion to support this request, which was seconded by Mike Harrison. The motion passed unanimously.

The Board discussed donating an item to be used as a door prize at the Memphis FreeFest in 2024. Joe Lowenthal suggested donating a LiPo4 battery, as the club has done in previous years. Mike Harrision made a motion to spend up to \$250 to purchase a LiPo battery for this purpose. The motion was seconded by Joe Lowenthal, and passed without opposition.

Ty McMahan, KX4MQ, adjourned the meeting at 9:10 pm. The next regular Board of Directors meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, February 6, 2024 at 6:30 pm on Zoom.

## Licenses Earned in 2023 from Delta Classes

13 Technician 5 General 4 Extra

#### Note:

As of April 19, 2022 there is a \$35 FCC application fee for new hams, renewals, Vanity callsigns, etc except for license upgrade, systematic callsign issue, name, address or email changes. This is in addition to the \$15 ARRL VEC FCC exam fee.

The new Technician ARRL Ham Radio License Manual is the Fifth Edition with question pool that becomes effective July 1, 2022 for four years.

The current ARRL General Class License Manual is the Tenth Edition with question pool that became effective July 1, 2023 for four years.

The current ARRL Extra Class License Manual is the Twelfth Edition with question pool that became effective July 1, 2020 for four years. This question pool will expire on June 30, 2023,

As of late 2019, expired Amateur Radio license holders can get their license back by taking the current Technician exam and show proof of their previous license class. A previous Advanced Class licensee will only be able to get a General Class license.



- 2. Enter your FCC Federal Registration Number (FRN) and Password
  - a. If you do not know your FRN, go to Search box and click on License Click on Amateur; Enter your callsign in Callsign box; Your FRN is in center of page after your name (If you do not know your Password, click on Contact Tech Support after Forgot your Password)
- **3.** In When My Licenses screen comes up, click on **Now** in the green line reading "Change your paper authorization preferences <u>here</u>, or download your official electronic authorizations now"
- **4.** In Under Download Authorizations screen, highlight your callsign in the My Authorization area at the bottom left.
- **5.** Click on ADD to right of the highlighted callsign.
- **6.** Highlight your callsign in Authorization to Download and then click on Download on bottom right of screen.
- 7. If pop-ups are blocked, click on Allow One
- 8. Click Open at bottom and Print your License.

In 2022 ARRL revised their membership commissions to ARRL clubs that process individual ARRL memberships through the club. The club can receive \$15 for new memberships or renewals of past ARRL memberships over two years old. Current renewals generate a \$5 commission. Current ARRL members can renew/extend their ARRL membership at any time. If you renew early, your ARRL membership is extended for the renewal period from the expiration of your current ARRL membership. The club only gets \$5 for each renewal application no matter how many years being renewed.
