Amateur Hardware Update

Many amateurs look for a simple effective antenna for portable HF use. One antenna you can use is the end fed antenna. End fed antennas typically use a Balun to match the radio to the antenna. A 9 to 1 or a 49 to 1 Balun is used. End fed antennas can be a half wave for the length of the radiator. You can carry predetermined lengths of wire ready to use on your band of choice. Some end fed antennas are designed with a reel as part of the assembly to wind your wire on. End fed systems can come with only a box with the connectors and Balun. On these you supply your own wire. These are usually pulled up to a height by insulated line. They can be set up in different configurations based on available spots to hang it where you are running your station. These systems can be bought for under \$50 You can do a search on Ebay for "end fed antenna".










EFHW Antenna Configurations

The Delta Amateur Radio Club (DARC) Board of Directors (BOD) met on July 1, 2025, via a ZOOM video conference call. The President and Secretary were present. President Joe Plunk, NS4E, called the meeting to order at 6:33pm

Secretary Perry Hayes, N4GJ, called the roll and declared a quorum.

President Joe Plunk thanked everyone that was involved in Field Day.

Joe Plunk asked if there were any objections to the Secretary's Minutes of the June Membership Meeting, which were circulated by email. There were no objections. The minutes will be submitted to the membership at the July meeting.

Treasurer Paul Broom, KY4MX, presented the membership applications that had been received since the May BOD Meeting. Perry Hayes moved to accept all of the applications, with a second by Repeater Trustee Dan Fleek, AA4DF. The motion passed unanimously.

Director of Training Joe Lowenthal, WA4OVO, said that the memorial service for Jim Martin was held in Virginia today. Joe asked everyone to take a moment and lift up Jim's family.

Vice President Tyler Henley, KQ4QEV, made a motion to untable the June Treasurer's Report (for transactions during the month of May), with a second by Perry Hayes. The motion passed without objection.

Treasurer Paul Broom presented the June Treasurer's Report. Perry Hayes made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report, which was seconded by Tyler Henley. The motion passed unanimously.

Treasurer Paul Broom presented the July Treasurer's Report (for transactions during the month of June). Director of Training Joe Lowenthal, WA4OVO, moved to accept the Treasurer's Report, which was seconded by Tyler Henley. The motion passed without objection.

There was a discussion about bills that were expected to be presented during the month of July. Joe Plunk thanked Josh Cunningham, KQ4IOS, for taking charge of the refreshments at Field Day this year.

Joe Plunk discussed the presentation topics for the July Membership Meeting, which he received from Director of Programs Adam White, K4SPB. The last opportunity for ordering Ed Fong antennas will be at the July meeting.

Repeater Trustee Dan Fleek, AA4DF, said he needed to replace a coax connector on the 224.420 repeater. The APRS antenna at the Methodist North repeater site was destroyed by lightning, so he and Joe Lowenthal are looking for an economical replacement. Dan will make arrangements with Jelly Thompson, N4HLT, to visit the Germantown repeater site and replace the audio board on the 146.625 repeater. Dan reminded everyone that the monthly National Weather Service Net will be held tonight (the first day of the month) on Brandmeister DMR talkgroup 314431.

Joe Plunk asked everyone to submit their articles for Sparks to Director of Publications Jonathan Urschel, KO4WAQ, as soon as possible. Joe asked anyone with Field Day photos to send those to Johnathan and himself.

Nashoba Amateur Radio Club President Fred Miller, KS2X, joined the BOD for an after-action debrief of this year's Field Day activities. There was a general discussion about what went well, what didn't go well, and what could be changed or added next year.

Director of Training Joe Lowenthal said that 9 riders have paid for the Huntsville Bus Trip, and 1 check is in the mail. Another 20 riders are needed for the trip to be economically worthwhile.

There was a discussion about publicizing the bus trip.

President Joe Plunk said that he appreciates the BOD's commitment to the club, and the giving of their time. Joe said Field Day was a blast and he is looking forward to the Huntsville Hamfest, Bikes Blues and BBQ, Swamp Stompers and other events coming up on the schedule.

Joe asked if any other BOD members had comments or reports.

As of April 19, 2022 there is a \$35 FCC application fee for new hams, renewals, Vanity callsigns, etc except for license upgrade, systematic callsign issue, name, address or email changes. This is in addition to the \$15 ARRL VEC FCC exam fee.

The new Technician ARRL Ham Radio License Manual is the Fifth Edition with question pool that becomes effective July 1, 2022 for four years.

The current ARRL General Class License Manual is the Tenth Edition with question pool that became effective July 1, 2023 for four years.

The current ARRL Extra Class License Manual is the Thirteenth Edition with question pool that became effective July 1, 2024 for four years.

As of late 2019, expired Amateur Radio license holders can get their license back by taking the current Technician exam and show proof of their previous license class. A previous Advanced Class licensee will only be able to get a General Class license.
