




February Membership Meeting Signal Report



How to get into and use DMR, talk groups and that type stuff. How to access through repeaters and hot spots.



For the foreseeable future, HAM 101, which meets at 6 pm upstairs in room 202 before the monthly member meeting, will be offering Tech Support on the previous month's presentation. This month, Tech Support will focus on DMR programming. Dan, AA4DF, and I will be there to answer any questions and help you get your radio programmed to work on DARC's latest offering, the DMR repeater that replaced 443.700+ Mhz. At a minimum, you will need your radio and a programming cable. Bringing a laptop with your radio's CPS installed will also help us help you to the best ability, but the laptop is optional. I'll also be available to answer questions on installing Winlink and relevant digital modes.

I recently came across a video from the YouTube channel N-O-D-E highlighting a free resource he released a few years ago called The Pinouts Book. The free PDF is loaded with pinouts for all of the common connectors you may come across while tinkering with different electronics.

This month we did some repeater work at the Brunswick site. I'm bad about not taking group photos and will try to do better. I had Adam K4SPB, Joe NS4E, Mark KO4KQA, and Jim KD4FUU helping me with some work. We swapped out the temporary hotspot with the new T-Mobile hotspot. The hotspot has good signal strength inside the building and it is working well for the 443.7 DMR repeater. Since the DMR repeater and the 146.82 repeater are on opposite ends of the building, we ran 2 ethernet runs from one end to the other so both repeaters can share the internet connection. This is in preparation of adding the Allstar controller to the 146.82.

On the personal end of ham radio, I still like my TYT 380's for DMR. The only thing that is annoying about the 380 is that the speaker mic cover breaks after awhile. I found replacement covers on <u>buytwowayradios.com</u> and found a video on how to take the 380 radio apart. Can't wait until the parts arrive. Buytwowayradios.com also has the 2800ma USB C rechargeable batteries for the 380.

I am looking forward to hamfests coming up. The Freefest is on April 12th. Hope to have some eyeball QSO's there. I am also going to Dayton this year. 




When running any digital mode on ham radio we have to have a digital interface to go between the computer and the radio. These can range from simple homebrew designs to full built units designed just for our radio with all connectors which is just a plug and play design. These interfaces allow audio tones to go to the computer from the radio and from the radio to the computer. Tune your radio to the proper frequency and run the software on your computer and you are ready to run a digital mode. You can get your interface parts from Ebay. You can also buy a kit for under \$20 with the parts and printed circuit board to mount them on. For a little more money you can get the kit assembled and mounted in a case. You can even get the interface assembled with connector for plug and play with your radio. If you are looking for a digital interface to run digital modes check out the ones on Ebay. Do a search for "ham radio digital interface".

Amateur Hardware Update

Many amateurs are now buying small Morse code keys and paddles for portable use. They usually have the new high strength magnets on them to attach to the radio you are using in the field. A good base for your keys to mount on your desk can be hard to find. The good news is we can use a block of steel to use our keys on our desk. The best plate to buy is the professional steel bench block. These are normally used for jewelry work. The steel blocks are available as round, square, or rectangular steel blocks. They come with or without a plastic base on the bottom. These plates are also available in different sizes and thickness. The finish on these blocks are very good with most being chrome plated. The price for these plates are under \$20. If you are looking for a nice steel base for your keys or paddles check these out. Do a search for "STEEL BENCH BLOCK".

Delta Club BOD Meeting Minutes - March 4, 2025

Minutes of the Delta Amateur Radio Club Board of Directors Meeting - March 4, 2025

Present: President Joe Plunk, NS4E, Vice-President Tyler Henley, KQ4QEV, Secretary Perry Hayes N4GJ, Director of Training Joe Lowenthal, WA4OVO, Director of Programs Adam White, K4SPB, Director of Meetings and Special Events, Scott Adams KM4PMU, Director of Publications Mike Harrison, KM4MRW, Repeater Trustee Dan Fleek, AA4DF.

Absent: Immediate Past President Ty McMahan, KX4MQ, Treasurer Jim Martin, KD4FUU.

Guests: None

The Delta Amateur Radio Club (DARC) Board of Directors (BOD) met on March 4, 2025, via a ZOOM video conference call. The President and Secretary were present. President Joe Plunk, NS4E, called the meeting to order at 6:30pm

Secretary Perry Hayes, N4GJ, called the roll and declared a quorum.

Perry Hayes discussed his minutes of the February DARC Membership Meeting, which had been circulated to the BOD via email. Director of Training Joe Lowenthal, WA4OVO, made a motion to accept the minutes, which was seconded by President Joe Plunk, NS4E. The motion passed unanimously.

Treasurer Jim Martin, KD4FUU, was ill and could not attend the meeting.

President Joe Plunk presented the new and renewal membership applications that were received since the February BOD meeting. Perry Hayes made a motion to accept all of the applications, which was seconded by Director of Programs Adam White, K4SPB. The motion passed without opposition.

Joe Plunk presented the Treasurer's Report. There was a discussion about bills that were expected during the month of March. Joe Plunk said that the DARC's CD (with an account number ending in 8503) was renewed and will mature on 10/22/25.

Perry Hayes made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report, which was seconded by Director of Publications Mike Harrison, KM4MRW. The motion passed unanimously.

Director of Programs Adam White discussed the programs that will be offered at the 6 o'clock hour and at the Membership Meeting on March 11th.

Repeater Trustee Dan Fleek, AA4DF, said that a team worked on the 443.700 DMR repeater over the weekend. The amplifier was installed and is working well. Dan also changed the Brandmeister DMR master server on the repeater.

Dan and his team are still working on the linking for the National Weather Service nets. Plans are to purchase another Raspberry Pi device and an audio card for around \$175. Analog linking to the DMR NWS nets will be available on the 146.82 and 146.625 repeaters.

Director of Publications Mike Harrison announced that he may have found a replacement. There was a discussion about involving this person in the preparation of the March issue of *Sparks*.

Joe Plunk discussed a meeting that he had about Field Day 2025 with Fred Miller KS2X (President of Nashoba Amateur Radio Club) and Rick Kanschat N0KYN (President of MARA). Field Day will be held on June 28-29. The regular location at the Germantown Municipal Park and Pavilion has been reserved for this year's event. The BOD agreed to join forces with Nashoba and MARA again this year.

Joe Plunk discussed Memphis FreeFest, which will be held on April 12th at Bartlett Station Municipal Center - 5868 Stage Road in Bartlett.

Adam White reported on the results of the Programming Survey, which is offered to the DARC membership.

Looking ahead, Joe Plunk said that the Huntsville Hamfest will be held August 16th and 17th. Planning will begin soon for the annual DARC Bus Trip on August 16th. Joe Lowenthal said that he would contact Cline Tours about the price of the bus for this year.

Joe Plunk thanked Joe Lowenthal for the New Ham Letters, repeater lists and other materials he prepares for students and new hams. Joe Plunk also thanked Joe Lowenthal for all that he does for ham radio in the Mid-South.

Joe Plunk asked if any BOD members had additional reports.

President Joe Plunk, Vice President Tyler Henley, KQ4QEV, Secretary Perry Hayes, Director of Programs Adam White, Director of Meetings and Special Events Scott Adams, KM4PMU, Director of Publications Mike Harrison and Repeater Trustee Dan Fleek had no additional

reports. Immediate Past President Ty McMahan and Treasurer Jim Martin were absent, and made no further reports.

Director of Training Joe Lowenthal said that three students from the Extra Class License Class had passed their exams. Two students will retake the exam at a later date. There are 16 students enrolled in the current Technician Class License Class and 11 attended last night's meeting. The class will not meet on March 10th. Joe said the class was going well.

One of the students in the Technician Class is a principal in the Houston area. She discovered that her office manager was a ham, and they are making plans to form a Ham Radio Club at their school.

Joe Plunk said that there were still three vacancies on the BOD. Volunteers are needed to fill the positions of Public Information Officer (PIO), Club Historian and Club Counsel. Anyone interested should see a BOD member for more information.

There being no further business, President Joe Plunk said he would entertain a motion to adjourn. Perry Hayes made a motion to adjourn, which was seconded by Dan Fleek. The motion passed without opposition.

President Joe Plunk, NS4E, welcomed everyone to the meeting. He asked everyone in attendance to introduce themselves.

Secretary Perry Hayes, N4GJ, called the roll of the Board of Directors (BOD) and declared a quorum.

Billy Freeman, WL4B, made an announcement about Tennessee Baptist Disaster Relief's West Tennessee Regional Training, which will be held March 7-8 at Germantown Baptist Church.

Eric Mills, KX4B, made an announcement about the origins of Morse Code.

Rick Tillman, WA4NVM, made an announcement about Memphis FreeFest, to be held on April 12, 2025.

Joe Plunk asked for a motion to accept the Secretary's minutes of the January Membership Meeting and February BOD meeting, as published in *Sparks*. Ham Hilliard, W4GMM, made the motion, which was seconded by Randy Redd, KQ4HJH. The motion passed unanimously.

Joe Plunk asked the members of the BOD if they had any reports.

Vice President Tyler Henley, KQ4QEV, said he enjoyed hearing activity on DARC's repeaters, and was excited about the new DMR repeater.

Secretary Perry Hayes had no additional report.

Ham Hilliard, W4GMM, made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report, as published in Sparks. The motion was seconded by Ned Savage, KA4BLL. The motion passed without opposition.

Director of Programs Adam White, K4SPB, reminded everyone to complete a Program survey.

Director of Meetings and Special Events Scott Adams, KM4PMU, had no additional report.

Director of Publications Mike Harrison, KM4MRW, reminded everyone that he is seeking a replacement.

Director of Training Joe Lowenthal, WA4OVO, said that the Extra Class License Class has concluded, and 2 of the students passed their exams. A Technician Class License Class will meet via ZOOM on Monday nights from February 24th to April 7th (no class on March 10). 14 students are enrolled in the class.

Joe Lowenthal circulated a card for Pat Lane, W4OQG. Joe said everyone was welcome to send correspondence to Pat at his home address (good on QRZ).

Repeater Trustee Dan Fleek, AA4DF, said that the 443.700 DMR repeater is up and running well. Dan plans to hold training sessions on programming DMR HTs. Allstar will be added to the 146.82 repeater, to provide linking during National Weather Service nets. NWS has nets during weather events, and a regularly scheduled net on the first day of each month. The NWS nets are held on Brandmeister DMR talkgroup 314431 (NWS Memphis), available on DMR hotspots and TS1 of the W4BS DMR repeater.

Dan said a team would also be performing upgrades and testing at the Germantown 146.625 repeater site. Linking to NWS weather nets will be available on 146.625.

John Reiners, KN4BVH, is planning a weekly DARC DMR net. More information to follow. The net will meet on Brandmeister DMR talkgroup 314447 (New Memphis Metro), available on DMR hotspots and TS2 of the 443.700 W4BS DMR repeater.

Note:

As of April 19, 2022 there is a \$35 FCC application fee for new hams, renewals, Vanity callsigns, etc except for license upgrade, systematic callsign issue, name, address or email changes. This is in addition to the \$15 ARRL VEC FCC exam fee.

The new Technician ARRL Ham Radio License Manual is the Fifth Edition with question pool that becomes effective July 1, 2022 for four years.

The current ARRL General Class License Manual is the Tenth Edition with question pool that became effective July 1, 2023 for four years.

The current ARRL Extra Class License Manual is the Thirteenth Edition with question pool that became effective July 1, 2024 for four years.

As of late 2019, expired Amateur Radio license holders can get their license back by taking the current Technician exam and show proof of their previous license class. A previous Advanced Class licensee will only be able to get a General Class license.
