- 4. What kinds of false gods are worshipped in our culture?
- 5. Elijah brought a challenge to Ahab on behalf of God and asked the assembled people "How long will you waver between two opinions? If the LORD is God, follow him; but if Baal is God, follow him."
  - a. Do you see any parallels of that time to today's world? If yes, what?
  - b. What do you think the people who were assembling thought of the challenge?
