Delegate Fee

A reminder the delegate fee increased to \$275 per girl.

Unit Allotments and Information

Delegate Number Request: You will receive a letter to your unit indicating the number of girls sent in year 2019 and asking if you would like to change this number. If a change is requested you will be required to submit that request on or before November 22, 2020. The Committee will then review all delegate requests and make the final allotment.

Girls State Allotments: Allotments notifications will be mailed by the second week of January 2020. We do not automatically assign the same number of delegates that your unit has always received. We do our best to give you the number of delegates that you have requested, but it is based on membership, size of the high schools, mandatory fees paid to Department, the number requested by other units, and space available. You may be put on a waiting list for additional delegate requests. Please be patient. We are usually able to honor all requests but sometimes it is the last week before Girls State begins.

Delegate Selection: Please do not wait until the last minute to choose your delegates. The deadline for delegate selection and payment is **March 28, 2020**. If If we do not receive your information by this time those will be reassigned to alternate units.

Delegate Applications: The registration process is streamlined. We will have information on how to register the delegates in the January packet. You <u>must</u> read and follow the directions in this packet.

Cancellations: If you choose not to use all of your allotment, it will not affect your ability to send delegates next year. Please notify Jennifer Shaw as soon as possible in order to allow alternate delegates to be contacted.

If a delegate is unable to attend and lets us know prior to May 15, 2020, your unit is eligible for a full refund of \$200 or your unit may send an alternate. If it is after May 15th, then your unit may send an alternate but is not eligible for a refund if they do not have an alternate.

Scholarship opportunities: There are two scholarships offered through the American Legion Auxiliary Oklahoma Girls State program. Be sure to promote these through your school counselors. Further details may be found on our website.

- 1) George Nigh Scholarship \$200: For best written legislation.
- 2) Samsung Scholarship: approximately \$1000 (amount varies) state winner, competes nationally for larger scholarship.

Oklahoma Girls State Checkout: We will be holding a closing ceremony on Friday afternoon and the delegates should be checking out by late afternoon on Friday.

Girls State Schedule: The daily schedule for Girls State is not published prior to the Girls arrival. If your unit has any specific questions, please have them contact Jennifer Shaw at jenn.okgs@gmail.com

Unsponsored schools: Many schools do not have an American Legion Auxiliary unit yet there are many deserving young ladies that would like to attend Girls State. A certain number of spots will be reserved for the Department unit. Applicants may submit an application to the Girls State Committee. The Committee will then review and select the attendees from these applications. The sponsorship fee will be the responsibility of the sponsoring school and/or chosen delegate. This opportunity will only be available to schools which do not have a sponsoring American Legion Auxiliary unit.

GIRLS STATE ORIENTATION TIPS

- Holding an orientation for your delegates prior to Girls State helps them to know what to expect and improves the chances that they will arrive and stay at Girls State.
- Orientations should be held at your unit several weeks before Girls State. This allows delegates time to plan and pack accordingly. Also, if the delegate finds that Girls State is not what they expected, the unit has time to find an alternate.
- Encourage former delegates to come to orientation and share experiences.
- Girls State is a patriotic, government program that emphasizes God and Country. There will be prayer and the Pledge to the Flag during each session.
- Each delegate must stay for the entire session. They may not leave and come back. Do not make promises contrary to this policy to any delegate. If a delegate leaves early, she will forfeit all rights to graduate as a Girls State citizen.
- All delegates must have completed their junior year and being going into their senior year of high school.
- Delegates do NOT get to choose their roommates. We intentionally separate them from classmates to ensure fairness in elections, to prevent cliques, and encourage them to make new friends.
- Make sure your delegate knows who sponsored them...the American Legion Auxiliary. A business may have paid their registration fee, and while it is appropriate for the delegate to acknowledge that gift, but the American Legion Auxiliary Unit is the sponsor.
- Stay in touch with your delegate periodically and especially in the week or two prior to Girls State. This help keeps "no-shows" to a minimum and keeps your unit from losing their investment.
- Have alternates available...we're always looking for fill-ins at the last minute.
- Feel free to work WITH your school counselors but do not let them choose the delegates FOR YOU.
- Do not blindly send the delegates you have not met to Girls State. Girls State is building leaders of tomorrow and they must be of high moral character.
- Do not talk someone into going that does not want to be there. They usually end up going home or making their fellow citizens miserable.
