



Happy *Garifuna Settlement Day*!

The 19th of November is a public and bank holiday in honor of the arrival of the Garinagu to the shores of Belize in 1802. A culture that originates in St. Vincent, they migrated to Central America after uprising against British colonizers and facing persecutions and injustices. Among the first free emigrants to settle in Belize, the Garinagu settled in the southern parts of the country in places such as Dangriga, Hopkins, Barranco, Punta Gorda and our very own Seine Bight Village. Celebrations including parades, reenactments and all-night drumming will likely be heard all along the peninsula for the 24 hours surrounding this holiday.
