About the Peninsula's *WATER SUPPLY* !

The topic of water supply on the peninsula is a bit of a touchy one these days with planned expansion of water lines and added demand on an already overtaxed system. But, the bottom line for visitors is this:

1)The water comes from a spring on the mainland, is treated and pumped across (under) the Placencia lagoon. It is potable, considered safe to drink from the tap and, in my opinion, some of the best 'tasting' water I've experience. But, we do recommend filtering for drinking.

2)The water supply is severely overtaxed with all the growth and construction which means we often have very poor water pressure and occasional outages. Fortunately, RVs come with their very own backup water tank and we **HIGHLY** recommend keeping them filled at all times.

When you made your reservation at RVBelize, we likely sent a welcome packet that included two possible routes to the park when coming from the northern Belize border.

One (The Coastal Rd) is about getting here quickly and efficiently (as efficiently as Belize Time allows, anyway). The other is our favorite drive in the world (literally) and we recommend you **ABSOLUTELY** take the time to experience the awesome beauty of it if your schedule allows.

Something to note, however, is that The Hummingbird can be hard on brakes and, depending on your rig's size and abilities, you may want to pass on the breathtaking views.
