

FOP 44 Retirees

In 1980, retired Dayton police officers - members of Capt. John C. Post Lodge No. 44 - along with several retired police officers from other agencies in Montgomery County, formed a group that regularly met at the local Lodge. It did so to unite in friendship, to encourage mutual ideas, to promote the retirees' welfare and to safeguard the lawful rights and benefits of the retirees' pensions. On July 15, 1980, the retired police officers adopted a simple Constitution as the foundation for their association. The FOP 44 Retirees' meetings are held at 7:30 p.m. on the third (3rd) Tuesday of the month at the FOP 44 Lodge Hall, located at 4275 Powell Road in Huber Heights.
