Here, you'll explore lush trails, glide through jungle waterways, and experience the extraordinary biodiversity of the Peruvian Amazon, a perfect introduction to the country's natural wonders.

From the rainforest, you'll soar into the Andes to uncover the rich legacy of the Inca Empire. After acclimating in Cusco, you'll visit ancient ruins and traditional Andean villages in the Sacred Valley, then board the Vista Dome train to Aguas Calientes. A highlight of the trip awaits with a guided tour of majestic Machu Picchu, followed by the optional hike to Huayna Picchu. You'll also have time to explore at your own pace and enjoy the charming town nestled at the foot of the ruins.

Your journey concludes in the high plains of Lake Titicaca, the world's highest navigable lake, where centuries-old traditions endure. A luxury train ride from Cusco to Puno offers a scenic transition through dramatic Andean landscapes. In Puno, you'll experience the cultural richness of the lake's floating islands before returning to Lima. With the perfect balance of nature, culture, and history, this itinerary offers a complete and unforgettable experience of Peru — from its mystical jungles to its sacred mountaintops.

Day 1 – July 29th, 2026: Welcome to Lima, Peru

From the moment we arrive in Lima, our exclusive representative will greet us at the airport and take us by private transport to our hotel. Then we will have all day to relax and enjoy the beauty of Lima and its surroundings.

Day 2: Lima to the Amazon (Puerto Maldonado)



4 Days & 3 Nights Amazon Cabaña | Superior

Explore the Amazon!

After breakfast, we depart on our flight to Puerto Maldonado. Our Peru Amazon Adventures begin when we get picked up at the airport. From here, we take a 45-minute boat ride along the Madre de Dios River to reach the wonderful Inkaterra Reserva Amazonica. After a short briefing, you can settle into your beautiful cabaña and then have lunch in the dining room.

In the afternoon, we meet our highly experienced jungle guide and choose from the various excursions available at the lodge. You can head off on a guided walk along the rainforest trail system to explore the Amazon Basin, passing by incredible trees such as the shihuahuaco and the strangler fig, observing huge numbers of colorful birds and exotic insects.

Later, you can go on the Twilight River excursion, a guided boat ride on the Madre de Dios River. During the excursion, you can see the incredible change in the jungle as the sun sets, and the nocturnal world comes alive. After dark, we can look for nightjars, owls, capybaras, and large caimans. Returning to the lodge, you can then enjoy a delicious dinner in the main dining room. Afterwards, relax in your cabaña or head out into the grounds to experience more of the rainforest and the cacophony of the magnificent jungle sounds at night.



Day 3: Lake Sandoval, Canopy Walk, and Anaconda Walk Canopy Walk and Anaconda Walk (Optional Lake Sandoval Visit)

After breakfast, we'll head out to the famous Lake Sandoval in the Tambopata National Reserve. We can take canoes out onto the beautiful Oxbow Lake, which is home to endangered giant river otters, red howler monkeys, red-bellied macaws, anacondas, side-neck turtles, black caimans, and more.

After exploring the lake, we'll head back to the lodge for lunch. Then we can go on the amazing Inkaterra



Canopy Walkway and the Anaconda Walk. The Canopy Walk takes us up a 29-meter-tall tower into the treetop realm. Stretching for more than a quarter of a mile, the walkway takes you through the canopy on a suspension bridge network linking eight observation platforms. From this awe-inspiring vantage point, we'll look out for toucans, woodpeckers, trogons, monkeys, and the three-toed sloth.

Next, we can go on the Anaconda Walk! This walkway traverses a 200-meter-long wooden bridge over the aguajales swamps, where we can see a huge array of amphibians, birds, mammals, trees, and other jungle flora. There's also the possibility of spotting snakes – perhaps even the massive anaconda. When we return to the lodge for dinner, you can enjoy the daily nature presentation in the Eco Center.




Day 4: Gamitana Creek, Local Farm & Night Excursion Gamitana Creek, Local Farm and Night Excursion

Today we'll head out to Gamitana Creek, located about 25 minutes by boat from the lodge. Here we can explore the rainforest for about 1.5 hours, heading along the banks of a winding, dark-water creek. Wildlife is abundant in these waters and along the banks, where piranhas, caiman, turtles, and birds all live.

Heading back downstream, we'll visit the Gamitana Farm for a short, guided tour, where you'll see how the local farmers grow fruits and vegetables. We'll then return to the lodge for lunch and afterwards set off on the Hacienda Concepcion excursion, during which we can see more than 200 different plant species and learn how they are used to make all kinds of things, including traditional jungle medicine.

Next, we can go on a 30-minute canoe trip to look for turtles, sungrebes, nightjars, and exotic herons.



In the evening, you can take part in the Rainforest by Night excursion through the Inkaterra Ecological Reserve. This two-hour trip takes you into the forest to experience the wonderful nocturnal world in the jungle and the amazing sounds that accompany it.

If you have time before your flight, we can visit the butterfly house, where you can see a stunning array of colorful butterflies, some small and some as large as your hand. You can learn all about the life stages of these beautiful insects and walk among them as they flutter around. Then we'll take you to the airport or your hotel in Puerto Maldonado.

Day 6: Cusco City Tour - Free time to Explore

Private Excursion | Half-Day Cusco City Tour Our Cusco day trip begins in the morning, heading first to the imposing Inca fortress of Sacsayhuamán, perched on a hill above Cusco. Here, you will witness some of the finest examples of Inca masonry and construction, including enormous boulders that were meticulously cut and perfectly fitted to form the walls. After exploring Sacsayhuamán on our Cusco tours, we will climb the hill to Qenqo, one of the most intriguing archaeological sites of the Inca civilization.



This enigmatic sanctuary, whose name in Quechua means "labyrinth" or "zigzag," offers visitors a fascinating mix of history, spirituality, and architecture. From here, you will also enjoy beautiful panoramic views of Cusco. Next, on our Cusco excursions, we visit the Tambomachay Archaeological Complex.

The exact purpose of this site is unknown, but it may have functioned, at least in part, as an Inca spa. Incan hydraulic engineering is evident here, with a series of aqueducts, canals, and waterfalls running through the terraced rocks. We then continue to the wonderful Koricancha, adjacent to the Church of Santo Domingo. According to chroniclers writing during the period immediately following the Spanish conquest, the Koricancha was the most sacred and important temple in the Incan Empire. Its walls were covered in gold, and life-size statues of plants and animals, all made of pure gold and silver, decorated its rooms and hallways. Sadly, this wealth was stripped away by the Spanish conquistadors.

However, it remains a magnificent temple, and your Cusco private tour guide will show you details that you would almost certainly miss if you visited without a guide. After visiting the Koricancha, we will head to the Cusco Cathedral, located in the Plaza de Armas. Built between 1560 and 1654 on the foundations of an existing Inca temple, this spectacular cathedral houses many works of art from the Cusco School of painters, and its main altar and pulpit are covered in gold and silver reliefs. Look closely, and you will also see elements of indigenous religious symbolism incorporated into the church by the natives who worked on its construction, such as the carved head of a jaguar on the doors. Finally, our guide will bid farewell, offering restaurant recommendations for a delicious meal (not included) or providing directions on how to return to your hotel.

Day 7: Cusco to Machu Picchu by Train! (Cusco Altitude 3,399 m / 11,152 ft)

Private Package | 2 Nights Machu Picchu by Train

Our tour starts in Cusco, where we will be picked up at 9 am and taken to the train station to board the train to Aguas Calientes (also known as Machu Picchu Pueblo). The train leaves at approximately 11:30 a.m. The two-hour train ride is a memorable experience in itself, as we pass through river canyons and rolling hills. traditional villages and breathtaking Andean landscapes before reaching the gateway to Machu Picchu.

Aguas Calientes is the gateway to Machu Picchu, sitting in a deep gorge at the foot of the mountain on which Machu Picchu stands. It is a beautiful town that mixes traditional life with a huge tourist infrastructure, with a multitude of markets, souvenir shops, hotels, and restaurants. It's also largely pedestrianized, making it a fun place to explore on foot. Aguas Calientes is surrounded by jungle-covered mountains and cliffs, and the Urubamba River flows right by the town. Aguas Calientes is also surrounded by hot springs, and when we

arrive, you will have plenty of time to relax and enjoy a dip in one of the steaming natural springs. You will also have time to walk around the city and explore the colorful markets and the general bustle of this unique Peruvian settlement.

It's an early start the next day, so we'll make sure you're settled in your hotel and all set for your first visit to Machu Picchu.

Day 8: Machu Picchu in all it's Glory!

For the best experience at Machu Picchu, we'll wake up early in the morning so we can get to the citadel in good time. You'll have time for breakfast first, and then our guide will pick us up from the hotel at around 5:40 a.m. Then we will walk to the starting point of the bus, a trip of approximately 45 minutes to the citadel of Machu Picchu.

We'll then pass through the gates into the Machu Picchu archaeological site. Here we'll begin our guided walking tour with an experienced and highly knowledgeable guide. Our tour of Machu Picchu will last about two hours and will take you to all the most famous and most spectacular parts of the extensive archaeological



complex. These include the House of the Guardian, Intihuatana, Temple of the Sun, Sacred Plaza, and other key locations. (It will depend on the circuit that the Ministry of Culture determines) And as we walk around, we'll have spectacular views across the agricultural terraces of Machu Picchu and across to the surrounding mountains and plunging gorges.

When we finish our tour of Machu Picchu, we'll take the bus back down to Aguas Calientes, where you can relax.

Day 9: Machu Picchu in the Morning – Return to Cusco in the Afternoon

Our day begins early in Aguas Calientes with breakfast at the hotel before boarding the bus up to Machu Picchu around 6 AM. The 30-minute ride takes you to the entrance in time for your scheduled hike to Huayna Picchu, typically between 7 and 8 AM. This steep but rewarding trail offers panoramic views over Machu Picchu and the surrounding Sacred Valley. The hike takes about 1.5 to 2.5 hours round-trip, depending on your pace. It's a challenging but unforgettable experience, especially in the early morning when the site is less crowded and the light is ideal for photography.

After completing the Huayna Picchu hike (optional), we'll have time to explore more of the Machu Picchu citadel. After your visit, take the bus back down to Aguas Calientes, where you can enjoy lunch (not included)

and rest before boarding your train back to Poroy in the

afternoon.

Our local representative will assist with our 30 to 40-minute transfer (13 km / 8 miles) from Poroy Train Station (3,486 m / 11,437 ft) to our hotel in Cusco (3,399 m / 11,152 ft), ensuring a smooth and comfortable arrival.



Most travelers do not need a visa for tourist visits up to 90 days. Check your country's visa requirements before travel.

What is the currency in Peru?

The currency is the Peruvian Sol (PEN). USD is widely accepted in tourist areas, but it's advisable to carry local currency for smaller purchases.

What languages are spoken in Peru?

Spanish is the official language. Quechua and Aymara are also widely spoken in the Andes. English is common in tourist areas.

What are some famous Peruvian dishes to try in the country?

Ceviche, lomo saltado, anticuchos, and causa limeña are must-tries.

What is altitude sickness, and how can I avoid it?

Cusco is at 3,400 meters above sea level. To avoid altitude sickness, acclimatize upon arrival, stay hydrated, and avoid heavy meals and alcohol.

What are the top attractions in Cusco?

Visit Sacsayhuamán, Qorikancha, San Pedro Market, and the vibrant San Blas district.

What should I know about visiting the Sacred Valley?

The Sacred Valley features archaeological sites like Pisac, Ollantaytambo, and Moray. It's also ideal for cultural experiences with local communities.

Can I use my credit card in Peru?

Credit cards are widely accepted in urban areas, but carry cash for rural locations.

What are some cultural customs I should be aware of?

Greet with a handshake or cheek kiss, respect local traditions, and ask permission before photographing people.

What souvenirs can I buy in Peru?

Look for alpaca textiles, silver jewelry, ceramics, and Peruvian coffee or chocolate.
