

eter Thomas, better known as "Pilot Pete," isn't your average coffee shop owner. At just 19 years old, he opened Pilot Pete's Coffee & Treats inside the Elmhurst Metra Station, blending his passion for coffee with a bigger mission—community kindness.

Inspired by his grandmother June, who brought him along to volunteer at shelters and VA hospitals, Pete grew up knowing the power of compassion. That spirit became the foundation of his business.

In 2015, Pete launched "Coffee With a Purpose" with a simple idea: collect winter coats for people living on Chicago's streets. He expected a few dozen donations—within two days, nearly 3,000 poured in. The response was overwhelming, and the effort hasn't slowed since. Today, his team has distributed over 40,000 coats and winter supplies, along with hot coffee, snacks, and dignity.

Twice a month during the winter, Pete transforms a 26-foot moving truck, shelter stocked with essentials. He and volunteers drive across Chicago, visiting tent communities and offering not just items, but connection. Conversations, smiles, and shared humanity are as important as the coats themselves.

Pete's generosity also extends back to his shop. Every other Friday, 20% of Pilot Pete's proceeds are donated to a customer-nominated charity or family in need. Whether through caffeine or community, his business exists to uplift.

Despite media attention and local praise, Pete remains humble. He credits volunteers, supportive customers, and local partners. For him, it's about showing up, giving back, and reminding others that small acts of kindness can make a big difference.

With a warm heart and a strong brew, Pilot Pete's is more than a coffee shop—it's a daily reminder of the good in people.
