



Camp Information

We're so excited to meet our campers! Here are a few things to help you prepare for camp.

- Farm Camp runs Monday-Thursday: each day we will be discussing and learning about a different animal or aspect of farm life!
- Circus Camp runs Monday-Friday. Each day they will be learning different aspects of Circus activities. Friday will be performance day. Performance time TBD
- Camp starts at 8:30 am (drop-off) 8:45 activities begin and ends at 12:00 pick-up until 12:15 pm. Please arrive on time.
- The front gate will be opened in the morning at 8:30 am. Please park in front of the red barn. You may walk your child to the field to join the other campers and start some fun activities.
- Send kids in closed-toed shoes and comfortable clothes. We will be walking in the fields. Expect to walk through dirt, sticks, animal droppings.
- Apply sunscreen before they arrive and pack if you want them to reapply.
- Pack lots of snacks and a water bottle (we will have backup snacks, and a water refill station).
- There will be sun exposure. Please dress for the sun, send sun hats.
- On hot days we will be playing with water. You may want to bring a towel or change of clothes for the car ride home. We will not be changing clothes at camp.
- We know it is enticing to walk around and see all of the animals during drop off or pick but please make your drop off or pick up quick for the benefit of everyone. Feel free to book a tour online!
- Please exit out of the second gate by the goats. It is an automatic gate opening toward your vehicle. Make sure you stop at the red sign.
- Due to the nature of being on a farm, we have behavioral expectations in order to ensure safety for your child as well as our animals. We will call if your child is not adhering to our safety farm rules. Please see the following for behavioral policies.

Expectation:

Staying with the group, following basic directions, no hitting or chasing the animals.

Behavioral Policy

- Maintaining realistic expectations of children based on knowledge of child development.
- Providing clear and simple limits.
- Planning an environment that facilitates a caring atmosphere.
- Providing appropriate activities that keep children engaged to prevent challenges.
- Modeling appropriate and respectful behaviors.
- Redirecting inappropriate behaviors toward desired outcomes.
- Giving children choices between two appropriate alternatives.
- Encouraging children to work together to solve problems.
- Encouraging children to use their words to solve problems or to elicit peer cooperation.
- Providing logical and natural consequences for children's actions.
- Guiding children away from the situation until they are able to calm down and address the problem.

We can not tolerate behavior that will jeopardize the safety of the children or animals. If your child is not complying with our behavioral expectations, you will receive a phone call and be asked to pick your child up.
