We're so excited to meet our campers! Here are a few things to help you prepare for camp.



Schedule & Logistics

Drop off for camp is 7:50- 8:00 am. Pickup is promptly at 12:30 pm. Our camp activities begin promptly after drop off, so please arrive on time. *Please do not speed through the Triskelee property. Children, cars, and even animals will be active on paths and roadways.

If you arrive before 7:50 am please remain in your car as we will still be setting up and will not be ready for guests yet.

Please drive around to the back of the red barn and join us on the lawn at our new pavilion.

Follow the signs for event parking.

We know it may be enticing to walk around to see the animals during drop off or pick up, but please make these transitions brief so we can keep the flow of traffic, both cars and foot traffic, safely overseen and managed. If you are interested in a formal tour of the property and animals, tours are available on many weekends. A brief goodbye to your child, even if they may be uncertain about drop-off, is very helpful to supporting your child's confidence in their camp experience.

Please exit out of the second gate that leads past the rose bushes and down the length of the Farm School fence line. It is an automatic gate opening toward your vehicle. Make sure you stop at the red sign.

Please pick up promptly at 12:30 pm. Children will be tired and ready for pick up!

We will have a mini farm market in which you and the campers may purchase many of the farm products they may have tried or learned about.

Please leave promptly so staff may clean up and get ready for the next day.

Camp children are expected to be independent with their toileting. If there is anything that would be beneficial for us to know about your child's toileting, please let us know.

Supplies for Camp

- Small Backpack
- Water bottle. We will have a refill station but no cups.
- Healthy and hearty snacks and lunch.
- Closed-toed shoes and comfortable clothes. We will be walking in the fields, so please encourage your children to wear tall socks to protect their legs.
- Please dress for the weather. Majority of activities will be under cover but not in a heated area.



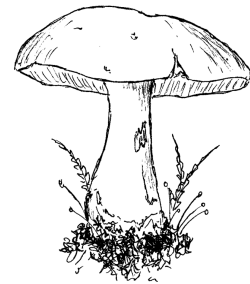
Behavioral Policy & Expectations

At Triskelee Farm, we want to ensure the safety of the children and staff, as well as our animals and the natural environment while adventuring during camps. Please see the following outline of our behavioral policies, and our approach to supporting children while facilitating an authentic connection to each other, the animals and nature. Please don't hesitate to let us know if you have questions.

Children are asked to stay with the group, follow directions, and maintain a safe physical and emotional connection with other people and animals while exploring at camp.

We support children in their endeavors with these aims by:

- Maintaining realistic expectations of children.
- Providing clear and simple limits.
- Planning and preparing an environment that facilitates a caring atmosphere.
- Providing appropriate activities that keep children engaged.
- Modeling appropriate and respectful behaviors and use of language.
- Redirecting inappropriate behaviors toward desired outcomes.
- Giving children choices.
- Encouraging children to work together to solve problems.
- Providing logical and natural consequences for children's actions.
- Guiding children away from an escalated situation until they are able to calm down and address the problem.
- We do not have capacity for one on one support.



Behavior that jeopardizes the safety of the children or the animals, or falls outside the scope of our behavioral policy cannot be supported. If your child is not complying with our behavioral expectations, you will receive a phone call and be asked to pick your child up. We want this to be a joyful time for all!
