# **Director's Note**

In this classic comedy, Oscar Wilde has created a superficial fiction that transcends mere farce. All is purely surface, purely play. Appearance and style are treated as essential, not just by the dual identities of the young fellows-abouttown, but by the butlers, the matriarch, the ingenues, that dragon-of-propriety the governess, and the clergyman. Convention is exposed and celebrated as wholly artificial. The ceremonies of social life are quite exploded: death, birth, engagement, marriage, celibacy, fidelity, must all be arranged into an aesthetic pattern which satisfies the egotists who inhabit the story, and who are drawn with the disarming innocence and ruthless tunnel-vision of children. Our performers bring you Wilde's absurdist dream, and the play's celebration of high artifice makes an appropriate finale to his career as a dramatist.

#### Marti Hinckley — Stage Manager

Marti is a performance director and has been performing, directing, and more for decades. She was born in Chicago, Illinois. Marti was introduced to theater and improv at John Belushi's Art Center at the College of DuPage. She loves to share her talents in many artistic ways: from Chicago to San Francisco, and now Boise. 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
