MRC 2020 At A Glace



Looking for a fun way to get our furry friends into the fall spirit and possibly make use of any leftover Halloween pumpkins. Here is an easy recipe for homemade Pumpkin Horse Treats.

Ingredients:

- 1 small pumpkin already baked with flesh removed (or can of pumpkin)
- 1 tablespoon cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon nutmeg (optional)
- 18 oz oats
- ¼ cup molasses or applesauce
- ½ cup brown sugar

Directions:

- Mix the pumpkin flesh with the other ingredients in a large bowl
- Spoon out in evenly sized balls on a cookie sheet.
- If the mixture is too runny, add more molasses for binding.

Bake 12 to 15 minutes at 375°F.

MRC History Lesson -

In January of 1960, a group of 13 people gathered together to form a club. They were known as the Milton-Edgewood Riding Club. The group met at the Milton Gun Club and used that building and grounds for almost 3 years. During this time they built a small arena and some times would practice drill in the Merrill's pasture. In April 1963, the president Howard Thackeray, announced that the Valley Riding Club in Puyallup was for sale. The club was growing and needed a permanent home. They purchased the Valley Riding Club grounds on a 15 year contract, and renamed it Meridian Riding Club. They held a barn dance at the Old Mill, and hundreds of people attended. They were able to raise \$2000 that day and that is what paid the down payment on MRC. In 1976, they held a mortgage burning party right here and celebrated the Meridian Riding Club having a permanent home for family and horse lovers to enjoy for future generations.
