

What Makes a Peacemaker?

This definition applies to the role of a Community Health Worker that is given the professional title of a **Peacemaker** at Wisdom Projects, and compensated as an employee within a peacemaking organization. A peacemaker continually demonstrates the very best attributes of CARE, which we define as an acronym in the following manner.

CARE	A peacemaker cares enough to always be and do the very best work for peace and wellness at all times, demonstrating the highest levels of maturity, professionalism, attentiveness, and detail.
ACCOUNTABILITY	A peacemaker holds her/him/their self to the highest levels of accountability, never making the same mistake twice, apologizing and making amends whenever possible, and ensuring that everyone with whom she/he/they engages is also held to the highest standards of accountability.
RESPECT	A peacemaker respects her/him/their self and their colleagues at all times. Respect recognizes that we represent the best of our families and communities. Peacemakers also respect the law and all community values, principles, policies, and procedures while always carrying out these values at all times.
EXCELLENCE	A peacemaker is committed to excellence as they learn the best practices and knowledge that represent nonviolence, safety, and wellness.
