Waste Condominium Guide: Disposal of Bulk Items, Furniture, and Chemical Construction Materials

1. Purpose

To maintain the cleanliness, safety, and regulatory compliance of the condominium property, all residents and contractors must follow the procedures below for disposing of **bulk items**, **furniture**, and **chemical construction materials**.

2. Definitions

- **Bulk Items**: Large household items that cannot fit in standard garbage bins, such as mattresses, sofas, chairs, tables, dressers, appliances, and fixtures.
- **Furniture**: Includes all residential furnishings intended for seating, sleeping, dining, or storage (e.g., beds, couches, wardrobes, desks).
- **Bulk Construction Materials**: Includes drywall, lumber, tiles, bricks, insulation, piping, fixtures, and similar debris from renovations.
- **Chemical Construction Materials**: Includes paints, varnishes, sealants, thinners, adhesives, cleaning solvents, and any substances labeled hazardous or flammable.

3. Disposal Practices

- Do **not** place bulk items or construction materials in regular trash bins, recycling containers, or in common areas.
- Do **not** abandon items in hallways, stairwells, service areas, or outside near the building perimeter.
- Do **not** pour chemical substances down drains or toilets

4. Bulk Item and Furniture Disposal

- Residents must arrange for bulk item pickup through:
- A private hauling service at their own cost, or The Town of Surfside Pulblic Works at 305-299-3280 or access https://www.townofsurfsidefl.gov/departments-services/public-works/about-public-works
- Notify the Building Manager and Board of Directors **at least 48 hours in advance** to coordinate use of service elevators.
- Items must only be placed in designated bulk-up areas **on the scheduled day**, not before.
- Mattresses **sealed in plastic** before removal to comply with health standards.

5. Construction and Renovation Debris

All bulk construction materials must be removed from the property by the contractor or resident. Use of the building's garbage bins or dumpsters is **not permitted**.

6. Disposal of Chemical Construction Materials

Chemical waste must be disposed of through **certified hazardous waste collection facilities** or **municipal hazardous waste programs**.

Storage of hazardous chemicals in the storage unit of the building is not allowed.

- South Dade 23707 SW 97th Avenue, Homestead, FL 33032 (Gate B)

The locations of the landfills are as follows:

- North Dade Landfill <u>21500 NW 47th Ave, Miami, FL 33055</u>
- South Dade Landfill 23707 SW 97th Ave, Homestead, FL 33032 (Gate A)

7. Contractor Responsibilities

Unit owners are responsible for ensuring their contractors comply with all disposal rules. Contractors must:

- Remove waste materials daily,
- Keep hallways and service areas clean,
- Not using building bins for debris disposal.

8. Non-compliance may result in:

- Removal of unauthorized items at the owner's expense,
- Suspension of construction privileges,
- Legal or administrative actions for repeat violations.
