## CRIMINAL INJUSTICE

With several Woodsiders in attendance, The National Lifers of America held a rally Friday at the State Capitol in support of the Second Look Sentencing Act. Laura Eufinger offered a recap:

Woodside member Jamie Meade spoke by phone at the rally and was also instrumental in writing the Second Look Sentencing Act, which would automatically require a review of a life sentence after the inmate has served a specified portion of the sentence. This is so much better than just warehousing people forever with no redemptive purpose.

Jamie's speech highlighted the service formerly incarcerated people can give to their communities if released: going to law school, becoming college professors, advocating for and helping the newly released adjust to life. (Jamie himself has earned multiple degrees and is now a "Member in Discernment" preparing for ministry in the UCC under the endorsement of Woodside.)

Other issues were addressed and other folks told their stories. One women, after decades in prison, was released at age 52 with no skills to enable her to get a job. A man who now helps the formerly incarcerated missed the years while his daughter was growing up. Now he has had to deal with that daughter's murder. Still he hangs onto his belief in the power of redemption and that people can change their lives.

We are proud of Jamie and the other organizers, and stand with them in the fight for incarceration reform.
