The Murrieta-Temecula Area Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. is committed to helping young people succeed academically. This includes ensuring that students have access to the financial resources they need to obtain a college education. The chapter offers three (3) types of scholarship awards for which African American students can apply, through the Murrieta-Temecula Area Alumnae Chapter's Scholarship Program.

The scholarships are available to African American students attending a public, private, or parochial high school **within the service areas of: Murrieta, Temecula, Canyon Lake, Hemet, Lake Elsinore, Lake Mathews, Menifee, Perris, San Jacinto, Sun City, Wildomar, and Winchester.** To be eligible to apply for an award, recipients must meet the minimum grade point average associated with the scholarship for which they are applying (based on a 4.0 scale) and have been accepted to, or enrolled in a full-time program at an accredited college, university, or an institution of equivalent accreditation during the 2022-2023 academic year. Verification of enrollment must be provided prior to distribution of scholarship funds.

**\*Children of Murrieta-Temecula Area Alumnae Chapter members are ineligible for an award. \*Applications must be emailed by March 31, 2023.**

- An **official, signed** high school transcript (sent directly from your school representative to committee)
- Two (2) letters of recommendation from any of the following persons (no more than one per category):

- High School Teacher/ College Professor
- High School Counselor
- Organization Sponsor
- High School Principal
- Community Leader
- Minister
- Volunteer Coordinator
- Employer

**Recommendations from family members in the categories above will not be accepted.** It is suggested that you ask the people who are writing your recommendations to comment upon (1) the length of time they have known you; (2) your personal qualities, character, leadership abilities, and/or any special attributes; and (3) why they believe you have the perseverance to succeed at the college/university level. All letters must be on letterhead to be accepted.
