It has come to our attention that a client in WA has received a phone call from someone claiming to be from My Aged Care. The caller asked for \$25 and bank details to register the client for My Aged Care.

That this is NOT how My Aged Care operates – there is no cost to register. You should report any suspicious activity to family, or service providers so that they can notify relevant authorities.

If you receive a call from anybody where you did not initiate the contact, DO NOT GIVE THEM ANY INFORMATION.

Just hang up, regardless of what threats they may make.



CLIENT PAYMENT OPTIONS



We can offer clients alternatives such as monthly invoicing to our client or a relative. The account can be paid via a bank transfer or direct deposit into our bank account.

Alternatively, a direct deposit of a set amount can be made at monthly intervals. With this method, periodic adjustments can be made for extra or cancelled meals.

We are currently transferring to an online accounts and recordkeeping system, so these facilities will be very easy to implement.
