

PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

Dear Lincoln Alumni,

School year 2009-2010 has been dominated by budget concerns. Currently, the Des Moines School District is planning on a worst-case scenario that estimates more than \$30 million may have to be cut from the budget for 2010-2011. Across-the-Board budget cuts of \$3.3 million in 2008-2009 and \$17.5 million in 2009-2010 were mandated by the governor. Every effort was made to ensure that services and educational programs for students were left intact during the last two across-the-board cuts. Staff

reductions are inevitable for 2010-2011. For Lincoln, the budget crisis will result in reductions of 14.5 regular classroom teaching positions, two clerical positions, and one associate position. Our administrative staff will be reduced by two Vice Principals and one Dean of Students. Special Education will be reduced by one teaching position. The last budget crisis in 2004-2005 resulted in ten full time positions being cut at Lincoln. Every program, service, department, and staff person in the Des Moines School District has been examined for possible areas to reduce and/or cut for 2010-2011. Work will continue on the District Budget right up to April 15, 2010 when the budget must be submitted to the state. The financial situation in the Des Moines Public Schools is shared by school districts across the state and the nation.

Even as budget concerns are addressed, day-to-day school life goes on at Lincoln Main and Lincoln South. I have described to you in previous newsletters how the entire ninth grade was relocated to Lincoln South (the former Kurtz Junior High Building) in 2006-2007 to make way for the renovation and remodeling work at Lincoln. The first class that started at Lincoln South will graduate this year and we are very proud of their academic and activity record. We created a College Bound Rails Wall ("College Wall") along the main floor south hallway. Students whose names are listed have been accepted at the university below which their name is listed. The College Wall is a joint project of the Art Department, the Industrial Arts Department, and the Counseling Department aimed at encouraging students to continue their education after high school. Dr. Patricia Tice, Counselor and Scholarship Chairperson, spearheaded the project.

Beginning April 5, the school day will be lengthened by 20 minutes in order to make up four of the six snow days experienced this school year. The remaining two snow days will be made up at the end of the school year on June 9 and 10. Our smaller Learning Community Houses of 125-150 students at Lincoln South and our Career Interest Academics at Lincoln Main along with daily Advisory activities continue our efforts

to keep all students in school and on track to graduate at the end of four years. Our fall and winter athletic teams represented Lincoln in a fine manner, instrumental and vocal music students performed well, and mock trial, drama, speech/debate, dance, art, and clubs continue to define what best represents the complete educational experience at Lincoln High School.

Phase I of the Lincoln Vision Campaign at Hutchens Stadium has been completed at a cost of \$696,019.84. Grant awards from Polk County and Prairie Meadows along with Alumni contributions and in-kind donations were used to successfully complete Phase I. The dedication of the Phase I project was held September 11, 2009. The local, state, and national economic conditions continue to be a major challenge for the Vision Campaign. In light of current economic conditions, the Vision Campaign organization is looking at cost effective measures to achieve the goals of the Phase II Community Center in existing areas of the main building. For example, a modest expenditure of \$881.50 in December, 2009 converted a locker room in existing space to a functioning weight room for our athletes and P.E. students. We are also looking at converting our current small gym to a dedicated wrestling facility. The focus of the Vision Campaign continues to be on facility improvements for all present and future students and the continuation of Abraham Lincoln High School as a focal point of pride for our school community.

Class Night will be Thursday, June 3, 2010, at 7:00 p.m. in Bowen Round House Arena. The program features the presentation of academic awards and honors earned by the Class of 2010. The Lincoln Class night traditions involving the Class Key, Plaque, Ribbon Cutting, and Presentation of Roses will all be continued by the class of 2010. Commencement will be held at Veterans Memorial Auditorium on Saturday, June 5 at 9:00 a.m. Graduation from Lincoln continues to be a very special, memorable event in the lives of our students. You, as alumni, are welcome to attend these events and share this once in a lifetime event that binds all the graduates of Lincoln High School.

Thank you for your support and continued interest in Abraham Lincoln High School. ■

ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT:

BILL BACKSTROM, CLASS OF 1948 BY SUZANNE GUESS, '81



If you've been to a Lincoln girls softball game in the past 30 years, then you've likely seen, talked to, or handed your money over to **Bill Backstrom '48**. In fact, if you've been to any Lincoln sporting event or alumni event in the last 30 years, you've noticed Bill front and center. He is "Mr. Lincoln," after all.

Bill's history with Lincoln goes back to the time when grades seven through twelve were housed in Lincoln Main. In high school, Bill was the team manager for all sports at Lincoln except for tennis and golf. Not just any student could have a key to the school, but Bill did. His dedication to the school extends beyond athletics to Alumni Association and Foundation activities. In 1991, the Alumni Association barely had enough money to cover expenses and

little left over to award student scholarships. But Bill and his friends Marge White '39 and Melio Tonini '32 resurrected the organization, grew its membership, worked hard at fundraising, and established the Alumni Foundation which now awards an average of 17 scholarships per year. To recognize his contributions and dedication to the school, Bill was inducted into the first Lincoln High School Hall of Fame class in 1992. He gets regular calls to represent Lincoln at college athletic signings and to meet with state and federal officials.

Bill's dedication to all things Lincoln is unwavering. Friend Everett Chandler '27 commented, "I never saw anybody who was more dedicated to Lincoln High School than Bill." Ask Bill's wife Mary (Moore) '50 about Bill's enthusiasm for the school and she'll tell you that they spent their first night as a married couple at Bill's class reunion. "We got married during the day and went to his reunion that night," she says. His classmates gave the newlyweds a rolling pin as a wedding gift, and Mary commented, "To this day I still have that rolling pin!" Mary likely hid the rolling pin from daughter Cheryl (Backstrom) Moureau '79, who had to threaten her dad to make sure he would show up to walk her down the aisle on her wedding day instead of attending

the Senior Banquet to award scholarships. Pals **Jack Copic '65** and **Skip Timmons '53** stepped in to help avoid disaster by awarding the scholarships in Bill's absence.

Bill and Mary will celebrate their 52nd anniversary in May 2010. They are lifelong south side residents and extended their legacy with a new generation of Lincoln students: Cheryl (Backstrom) Moureau '79, Karen (Backstrom) Steward '80, Steve '82, and Linda '82. Bill and Mary also enjoy traveling. If they won the lottery, "Well, we've already been on 11 cruises so we'd go on another," Bill says. Hopefully that cruise wouldn't conflict with any scheduled Lincoln events because Bill might just have to pass.



"I enjoyed my time at Lincoln High School," Bill says. It shows in his continued support of the school and all of its activities. ■

SCHOLARSHIPS

Thanks to the generosity of many ALHS alumni and friends, the ALHS Alumni Foundation awards scholarships to deserving Lincoln seniors each year. A summary of available scholarships follows:

ALHS Alumni Association Scholarship

The Alumni Association offers annual scholarships in the amount of \$1,000 each. The number of scholarships awarded varies yearly based on the interest earned on the Foundation Endowment. We hope to award at least 15 scholarships in 2010.

Named Scholarships

Elizabeth C. Vencil Chandler Memorial Scholarship

Four (4) four-year scholarships (\$1,500 per year) are awarded **every four years**, beginning in 2007, based on the applicants' GPA and financial need. The next scholarships will be awarded in 2011.

Neff Family Scholarship

Two (2) four-year scholarships (\$1,250 per year) are awarded **annually** to graduating seniors who intend to declare a major course of study in science or mathematics.

Ray Townsend Scholarship

Five (5) \$1,000 scholarships are awarded to graduating seniors based on the applicants' GPA and financial need. The scholarship has been renewed for 2010.

Jim and Ralph Wilson Scholarship

One \$1,000 scholarship is awarded **annually** beginning in 2009, based on the applicant's GPA and financial need.

Studebaker Elementary School

One scholarship of at least \$500 is awarded annually to a student who attended Studebaker Elementary School for at least three years. The financial need of the applicants is also considered.

Veridian Credit Union Scholarship

One \$500 scholarship is awarded based on the applicant's financial need and community service. Veridian has renewed the scholarship for 2010.

SOUTH SIDE HOMECOMING PARADE 2010


