FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK **Paul Williamson**



Greetings ALHS Alumni,

We continue to build on the successes of our programs at Lincoln High School. Due to our new Rails Time program where we provide real-time interventions for our students in every class, we experienced an all-time low for class failures this past semester compared to the previous five years! This result should mean a higher graduation

rate, more upper level course offerings, and more success in college for our students.

Our AVID program (Advancement Via Individual Determination) is also experiencing a lot of success. This is our first year to have a senior class in AVID. Currently we have 252 total students in the program. As of the writing of this letter, 38 of the 40 senior students have been accepted to one or more four-year colleges, 100% of them will graduate, and they have been awarded over \$1 million in scholarships! This college prep program aimed at serving students "in the middle" is proving to be a success as they have also eliminated the achievement gap within the program.

In February I looked at the enrollment of our current student body. We are once again the largest high school in DMPS. We currently have 2,241 students which includes 620 in the 9th grade. We should remain the largest school in DMPS this coming school year as well. Although we continue to grow, we are forced to reduce our staff at Lincoln for this upcoming year by six. This reduction, as experienced by all the high schools in DMPS, is a result of the lack of funding from the state. As always, we will approach these cuts with the priority of improving student achievement in mind. This will be difficult for us to do, however, we will persevere!

There are a lot of activities happening at Lincoln on a daily basis. I encourage you to visit our website often as the calendar and other information is constantly being updated.

Shauna Agan-Bamaskas '07 recently graduated law school at American University Washington College of Law. She and her husbnd currently reside in Washington, DC where Shauna is an ERISA Attorney practicing labor law. Shauna is the daughter of Earl Agan '76 and Paula Steinbach Agan '78. Shauna was one of our first ALHS students to receive the Elizabeth C. Vencil Chandler Memorial Scholarship, established

by the late Everett Chandler in 2007.

Jack Evans '43 has led an interesting life. A couple months after graduation, he joined the Army. Upon completion of Infantry Basic Training in Texas, he was sent to England two weeks before D-Day, and landed on Utah Beach a few days after D-Day. When the war ended, he was (in his words) "in Hitler's Bavarian Retreat at Berchtesgaden." He was wounded twice, and received two Purple Hearts, the Bronze Star, the Distinguished Service Cross (second only to the Medal of Honor) and the French Legion of Honor. He graduated from Iowa State University in 1950 with a degree in Chemistry. He worked three years in the Atomic Energy Commission Laboratory at Iowa State, met his wife, Lois, and they were married in 1953. In 1955 he joined 3M Company's corporate laboratories in St. Paul, Minnesota. In 1986 he retired as a Division Scientist. He and Lois reside in the Phoenix. Arizona, area where they enjoy their daughter's family -agranddaughter and two great granddaughters.



ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT: MICHAEL METCALF '91 BY JENI WELDON VANWYK '91



Since he was a part of the Des Moines-Kofu, Japan, exchange as a student at Watrous Elementary, travel has been a consistent theme for Michael Metcalf '91. He has traveled to more than 70 countries on five continents. From adventures in disputed Russian territories, to visiting World Heritage sites, to trekking with gorillas in Rwanda, Michael sees travel as an invigorating

and humbling experience: "Traveling to places where people are less fortunate, where I leave my comfort and culture behind, helps me appreciate how lucky we are as Americans, and it develops empathy for others."

Michael attended Washington University in St. Louis, majoring in Economics and Anthropology. After college graduation, he spent two years as a Peace Corps volunteer in Cameroon in Central Africa. Upon his return to the U.S., Michael moved to Washington, D.C., and spent a few years working in non-profits that battled corruption in emerging markets.

Before long, Michael found himself looking for a new perspective. He moved to New York and started the MBA program at NYU Stern School of Business. While interning at a wearable technology startup in New York City, Michael discovered a new passion and shifted his career from international development to the bubbling technology scene. Before graduating, he decided to study for a semester abroad at London School of Economics. His flight from New York departed on September 10, 2001.

After completing his MBA in 2002, Michael moved back to D.C. for a role at In-O-Tel, the CIA's venture capital arm. Although Michael loves creating new digital products, he's proudest of his recent analog creations: daughter Lorraine, born in March, 2013, and son, Robert born in May, 2015. Michael admitted that "I did most of the work, but it was nice having Sarah there to help."

Recently, Michael accepted an offer to become Director of Product Management with BCG Digital Ventures in Berlin, Germany. Besides raising a young family in Germany, Michael will be working with European corporations to help launch technology startups. Michael says, "It's a great opportunity for my kids to be exposed to new cultures and learn new languages. Sarah and I look forward to seeing Europe through their eyes."

Thanks to the generosity of many ALHS alumni and friends, the ALHS Alumni Foundation, a Dollars for Scholars Chapter, awards a wide variety of scholarships to deserving Lincoln Seniors each year. In 2015, the Foundation awarded \$75,500 in scholarships to 2015 ALHS graduates.

The following scholarships are available through the ALHS Alumni Foundation Dollars for Scholars Chapter in 2016:

ALHS Alumni Association Scholarship

The Alumni Association offers annual scholarships in the amount of \$1,000 each. Our Scholarship Committee awards these scholarships based on the GPA, financial need and community service of the applicants. A minimum GPA of 2.50 is required. The number of scholarships awarded varies yearly based on the interest earned on the Foundation Endowment. We hope to award at least fifteen (15) Association scholarships in 2016.

ALHS Class of 1955 Scholarship

Established by the ALHS Class of 1955, two \$500 scholarships will be awarded in 2016. The GPA, financial **need** and **community service** of the applicants will be considered.

Bill Backstrom Memorial Scholarship

Established by Nicholas Mancuso ('48) in memory of Alumni Foundation co-founder Bill Backstrom ('48), one \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually to a student who intends to major in business. The financial need and **community service** of the applicants will also be considered.

The Clayle, Milva, Maxhn, and Janine McCaw Scholarship Fund

Established by Dr. John ('35) McCaw and his wife Maxine in honor of their children, all of whom graduated from ALHS, one \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually to a student who demonstrates a solid academic performance, community service and financial need. Acceptance at an accredited institution and a minimum GPA of 3.0 are required.

Coralie Cherry Memorial Scholarship

Established in memory of Coralie Cherry ('47), by her family and friends, one \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually beginning in 2015 to a student who attended either Morris Elementary (formerly Mann-Watrous) or McCombs Middle School, is actively involved in Lincoln activities, and who demonstrates service to the south Des

Moines community. Coralie was a lifetime South Sider, a true supporter of Lincoln and south Des Moines. She worked in the Lincoln feeder schools, was very active in the Alumni Foundation and worked hard to keep the history of Fort Des Moines alive.

The Dave Mills Scholarship

Dave Mills ('50), dedicated his retirement years to community service. To honor Dave's work, one \$500 scholarship will be awarded annually to a student who has shown leadership, commitment and passion for volunteer service to improve the community. The student should be recognized by established service organizations for demonstrating strong organizational, leadership and **communications skills** to accomplish stated goals and benefit others through volunteer efforts.

The Dave Ostrem Family Scholarship

Established by Dave Ostrem ('49), up to five (5) \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded to students who plan to declare a major course of study in **math** or **science**. The GPA, financial need and community service of the applicants will also be considered. Preference will be given to students who plan to attend college in Iowa.

Des Moines East & South Chamber of Commerce Scholarship

Established by the Des Moines East and South Chamber of Commerce, one \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually beginning in 2014 to a student who has worked or volunteered on the south side of Des Moines. The GPA and financial need of the student will also be considered.

Dr. John W. Green, Jr. Family Scholarship

Established by the late Virginia Green in honor of her family, five (5) \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded annually for six years, beginning in 2012, to students who demonstrate **financial need** and **solid academic** performance. A minimum GPA of 2.5 is required.

Dr. Patricia K. Tice Scholarship

Established in honor of Dr. Tice, long time ALHS award-winning Senior Guidance Counselor & Scholarship Chair who retired in 2013, one \$2,000.00 scholarship will be awarded to an ALHS senior who has a strong academic record, high morals, demonstrates financial need, and has been accepted to attend Iowa State University in the fall. Under Dr. Tice's leadership, the ALHS College Bound Rails Wall was created. Dr. Tice's advocacy and tireless efforts for students resulted in ALHS students earning more than \$30M in scholarships, including a DMPS record of \$8.2M for the Class of 2010. Dr. Tice encouraged and motivated Lincoln students to be the best they can be, no matter what their field of endeavor might be.

The Erickson Family Foundation Scholarship

Established in 2015 by Miriam Erickson Brown ('80) and Warren Erickson (²86), one \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually beginning in 2016 to a student seeking advanced education in the field of **business**. A minimum GPA of 2.5 is required. The financial need of the applicants will also be considered.

The Gloria Gray Scholarship

Sara Brookhart '97: Sara played basketball and softball while at Lincoln In softball she was a three-time 1st Team All-Conference selection and a two-time 1st Team All-State honoree. In basketball she was a 1st Team All-Conference selection.

Basketball Iowa 1977.

John Thorup '75: John played football and basketball for the Railsplitters from 1972 to 1975. He started his sophomore and junior years in football and started all three years for the basketball team. During his sophomore basketball season he was the only sophomore starter in the Metro.

Wayne Franklin '71: Wayne specialized in the 120 yard high hurdles and the 180 yard low hurdles. He was City and District Champion his junior and senior years.
