Hello Railsplitter Alumn,

School is back in session! Currently Lincoln High School has 2,391 students enrolled. The demographics of Abraham Lincoln High School has changed significantly over the years. Currently 52% of our students are a part of our minority population (25% Hispanic, 12% Black/ African American, and 9%

Asian). The percentage of students who qualify for free/reduced lunch dropped a bit and rests at 67%. Lincoln now has over 300 students as part of our ELL program which serves many different nations. Such diversity at Lincoln!

This past summer we changed up the building at the main campus. The Main Office has now been relocated to the Commons/Cafeteria level. Our Student Services teams (VPs, Counselors) have also been moved to the same area. The new Chandler Room (formerly Alumni Room) is now just behind the new main offices which provide much more room for alumni meetings, booster club meetings, and more. I invite you to come in any time to take a look around... after you sign in. Other changes we have made are the elimination of the front side walk that led up to the front doors on SW 9th. The purpose of this change was to encourage students to use the crosswalks when leaving school. There are new sidewalks now in place to help

guide students in this direction. Finally, the entrance on SW 9th Street is no longer a public or student entrance. All visitors and students now enter from the northwest side of the building which is in the back by the parking lot.

On September 1st we honored our military veterans at the varsity football game. There were thousands in attendance and everyone I visited with at the game was very appreciative of our efforts. On top of a great evening to recognize their service to our country, we sent them on their way with a 20 point victory over the East High Scarlets! I hope you consider coming back to the football stadium this fall season. We have several more home games remaining with homecoming scheduled for October 6 at 7:00PM.

Finally, our music and theater departments will join forces to put on a musical November 2-4. This year's performance will be "Little Shop of Horrors!" There are many more events for you to attend. I encourage you to take a look at our website and follow us on a variety of social media outlets:

ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT:

JUDY LEWIS '64 BY NICOLE GRAZIANO '86



Judy Lewis graduated in the Class of 1964 as a Rosenfeld Memorial Scholarship Recipient from ALHS. She was active in many groups at Lincoln and was elected Class Secretary. Judy remembers her teachers and the excellent quality of education she received. She remains close to many of her classmates who have stayed in contact all these years. Judy attended the University of Iowa where she received other scholarships and was elected Class President. She graduated in 1968 with a BS

with Honors in Sociology and High Distinction. Judy then attended Yale University on a Public Health Service Fellowship, receiving an M.Phil. in Sociology in 1973. She then began her life's work as a faculty member in the Departments of Community Medicine and Pediatrics at the University of Connecticut School of Medicine, where she is now an Emeritus Professor.

Judy has always been passionate about improving health and services to low income and vulnerable communities in the United States and around the world. She created one of the first models for school health programs in the country, providing health and dental care to children in Hartford, CT one of the country's poorest cities. The model expanded to the entire public school system serving 24,000 children for a period of 35 years.

Her educational focus in the medical school was on developing curricula to help future doctors learn about the resources and needs of communities—to see their patients in the context of their families and environment, not just as a patient in a gown with a specific health problem. She developed the Community Based Education Program

and worked with over 300 local agencies to provide an innovative four-year curriculum.

Judy began working in global health in 1984 and immediately saw the linkages between global and local health issues. There is so much to be learned in many low resource countries and how they approach critical health problems. Her work began in Sri Lanka and she spent a sabbatical year there learning about women's reproductive health and access to family planning. She married her husband, Stuart Sakovich, there in 1987 and they had an elephant as chief guest! Judy continued her work in Sri Lanka until the civil war made it impossible, but now that it is over the university is reconnecting. Judy has worked in more than 50 countries conducting research, training and evaluation. She helped develop the Global Health Program at the medical school and directed it for 10 years. She has worked with hundreds of students. Her longest commitment has been to Haiti where she has worked continuously for 30 years. Her work is always directed toward understanding people's perspectives and using this information to improve health. In Haiti, she has worked to address maternal and child health, pneumonia, postdisaster (earthquake and hurricanes) needs, cholera and breast cancer.

Judy has held many leadership positions at the university, in Hartford, the state of Connecticut, nationally and internationally. Her commitment to public service began at Lincoln and continues today. "We all have been given so much—it is really important to give back." She loves learning and her career has given her the opportunity to do this in many different settings. In addition to her love of travel, she is an accomplished cook. She spends her free time reading fiction with a global influence and attending theater and many types of music events.

Thanks to the generosity of many ALHS alumni and friends, the ALHS Alumni Foundation awards scholarships to deserving Lincoln seniors each year. We are pleased to announce five new scholarships:

Howard Wayne Foust Memorial Scholarship

Established by Brenda Foust Mahannah '57 and Stephen Mahannah '57 in memory of Brenda's father, Howard Foust '37, one \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually beginning in 2018 to a student who excelled at sports at Lincoln. The financial need of the applicants will also be considered. A minimum GPA of 2.5 is required.

George "Skip" Timmons Memorial Scholarship

Skip '53 was a lifelong advocate of Lincoln High School and "Southside Pride." He established the ALHS Alumni Foundation in 1991 with Bill Backstrom '48 and Marge White '39; and served as President of the Alumni Association from 2001 - 2003. They created the endowment fund that provides scholarships to Lincoln graduates to this day.

To honor the exceptional medical care Skip received from the nursing staff at Methodist Hospital during his life time; two \$500 scholarships will be awarded in 2018 to students who plan to major in nursing. A minimum GPA of 2.5 is required.

ALHS Class of 1963 Memorial Scholarship

Established in memory of their 1963 classmates, one \$500 scholarship will be awarded annually beginning in 2018. The scholarships will be awarded based on GPA, financial need and community service of the applicants.

ALHS Class of 1967 Scholarship

Established by the Class of 1967, in recognition of their 50th Class Reunion, two \$750 scholarships will be awarded in 2018. The scholarships will be awarded to one male and one female and will be based on GPA, financial need and community service of the applicants.

Tom Akers Scholarship




