# KERRY BIONDI-MORLAN '91

Kerry Biondi graduated from Lincoln in the Spring of 1991. That fall, she headed to Cedar Falls with the intention of majoring in Special Education at the University of Northern Iowa (UNI). During her first semester of college, she became interested in speech pathology after hearing a friend talk about touring the university's speech and hearing clinic. By second semester of her freshman year, Kerry had changed her major; she went on to earn her BA in Communicative Disorders in 1995 and her MA in Speech Pathology in 1997, both from UNI.

After graduation, Kerry moved back to Des Moines. In the fall of 1997,

she married her high school sweetheart, Luke Morlan '92, and they settled into a home near Roosevelt High School. For those reading this from the classes of 1951, 1952, 1972, or 1973, the last name may sound familiar. Luke's grandparents are Dick and Mamie (Corcoran) Morlan, and his parents are Rick Morlan, and Pam Jury.

Kerry's first professional job as a speech pathologist was at Mercy Hospital. While she enjoyed working with people of all ages, it was her time working with children she found to be the most rewarding. As a result, after four years at Mercy, she followed her passion, and accepted a job as a speech pathologist with the Des Moines Public Schools (DMPS), serving several schools. Currently she serves two elementary buildings on the south side -Lovejoy and South Union (formerly Granger Elementary).

With both sets of parents on the south side, she and her husband made the move back to Des Moines' southeast side in 2001. A year later, they received the exciting news that they were expecting their first child.

In the spring of 2003, Kerry and her husband found themselves doing the types of things all expectant parents do...they washed tiny clothes, put them on tiny hangers,

and hung them in the closet of their newly decorated nursery. But then the unimaginable happened: their first child, a daughter, Grace Biondi, was still born at 32

In the weeks and months that followed losing her daughter, Kerry met four women who all lost daughters to stillbirth or infant death within months of one another. At first, they simply shared their stories of grief and found comfort in knowing they were not alone. However, it didn't take long before those stories turned into a mission and the non-profit, Healthy Birth Day, was born. Their mission is to prevent stillbirth and infant death through education, advocacy, and support.

Healthy Birth Day's primary initiative is a public health campaign called Count the Kicks. Count the Kicks teaches expectant parents about monitoring their baby's movements in the last trimester of pregnancy. It launched in 2009 and since then, Iowa's stillbirth rate has dropped 26%, taking Iowa from the 33rd worst in the country to the 3rd lowest stillbirth rate. The organization's latest focus is on the racial disparities in stillbirth.

Focusing on stillbirth and infant death prevention helped Kerry heal. She smiles when she says that the time and efforts she puts into the organization are when she gets to be Grace's mother. And while a portion of the pain is always there, she has found happiness again.

Seventeen years after starting with Des Moines Public Schools, Kerry still loves working with the students and families at her schools – especially South Union, where she attended elementary school when it was still Granger. She and her husband, Luke, have remained on the southside and are the proud parents of three healthy children: 13 year-old twins, Adam and Addeline, who are in 8th grade, and 12 year-old, Truman, who is in 6th grade. Both boys swim at Lincoln for the South Side Seahawks.

The BLH Club held its annual Chicken Bowl on August 16th and it was a success! We sold 375 chicken dinners. All the fall sports teams were recognized.




