- Clarence 'Laddie' Jobe



Thanks to the generosity of many ALHS alumni and friends, the ALHS Alumni Foundation, a **Dollars for Scholars** Chapter, awards a wide variety of scholarships to deserving Lincoln Seniors each year. **In 2019, the Foundation awarded \$112,500 in scholarships.**

The following scholarships are available through the ALHS Alumni Foundation Dollars for Scholars Chapter in 2020:

ALHS Alumni Association Scholarship

The Alumni Association offers annual scholarships in the amount of \$1,000 each. Our Scholarship Committee awards these scholarships based on the **GPA**, **financial need** and **community service** of the applicants. A minimum GPA of 2.5 is required. The number of scholarships awarded varies yearly based on the interest earned on the Foundation Endowment. We will award fifteen (15) Association scholarships in 2020.

ALHS Class of 1963 Memorial Scholarship

Established in memory of their 1963 classmates in 2018, and increased in 2019, one \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually. The scholarship will be awarded based on **GPA**, **financial need** and **community service** of the applicants.

ALHS Classes of 1959 60th Reunion Scholarship

Established by the Classes of 1959, at their 60th Class Reunion, one \$1,200 scholarship will be awarded in 2020. The scholarship will be awarded based on **GPA, financial need** and **community service** of the applicants.

BLH Bevington Scholarship

Build Lincoln Higher Club (BLH Club) established an endowed scholarship in memory of Erna Bevington, a former language arts teacher and department head at Lincoln. The amount of the scholarship is \$1,000. The number of scholarships awarded varies yearly based on the interest earned on the endowment. Applicants must be related to a current member of the BLH Club who joined by January 31st of the applicant's year of graduation, have a minimum **GPA** of 2.5, and have been accepted to a post-secondary institution.

Carole Jones Memorial Nursing Scholarship
Established by Todd Kincheloe '79, Alan Kincheloe '80,
Janette Kincheloe Brenner '82, and Mark Kincheloe,
to honor the memory of their mother and her lifetime of
service as a nurse in recovery rooms and nephrology clinics,
a \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually beginning
in 2019 to a student who plans to major in nursing. A
minimum GPA of 3.0 is required.

Class of 1964 Memorial Scholarship

The Class of 1964 Memorial Scholarship was established in 2019 by members of the ALHS Class of 1964 in memory of their former classmates. A \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually to a student who demonstrates solid academic performance, community service, leadership and financial need. Acceptance at an accredited institution and a minimum GPA of 2.5 are required.

Class of 1979 Scholarship

Established by the Class of 1979, at its 40th Class reunion, one \$500 scholarship will be awarded in 2020. The scholarship will be awarded based on **GPA**, **financial need** and **community service** of the applicants.

The Clayle, Milva, Maxhn, and Janine McCaw Scholarship Fund

Established in 2012 by **Dr. John '35 McCaw** and his wife **Maxine** in honor of their children, all of whom graduated from ALHS, four (4) \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded annually to students who demonstrate a **solid academic performance, community service** and **financial need**. Acceptance at an accredited institution and a minimum **GPA** of 3.0 are required.

Coralie Cherry Memorial Scholarship

Established in memory of Coralie Cherry '47, by her family and friends, one \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually beginning in 2015 to a student who attended either Morris Elementary (formerly Mann-Watrous) or McCombs Middle School, is actively involved in Lincoln activities, and who demonstrates service to the south Des Moines community. Coralie was a lifetime South Sider, a true supporter of Lincoln and south Des Moines. She worked in the Lincoln feeder schools, was very active in the Alumni Foundation and worked hard to keep the history of Fort Des Moines alive.

Dan Smoot Memorial Scholarship
Established by Jeni Weldon Van Wyk '91 in memory
of her friend Dan Smoot '90, one \$500 scholarship
will be awarded annually beginning in 2016 to a
student who is accepted to a trade school program.
Preference will be given to applicants who participated
in band or choir at Lincoln.

The Dave Mills Scholarship

Dave Mills '50, dedicated his retirement years to community service. To honor Dave's work, one \$500 scholarship will be awarded annually to a student who has shown leadership, commitment and passion for volunteer service to improve the community. The student should be recognized by established service organizations for demonstrating strong organizational, leadership and communications skills to accomplish stated goals and benefit others through volunteer efforts.

The Dave Ostrem Family Scholarship
Established in 2015 by Dave Ostrem '49, up to five
(5) \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded to students
who plan to declare a major course of study in math
or science. The GPA, financial need and community
service of the applicants will also be considered.
Preference will be given to students who plan to attend
college in Iowa.

Dr. John W. Green, Jr. Family Scholarship Established in 2012 by the late **Virginia Green** in honor of her family, two (2) \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded to students who demonstrate **financial need** and **solid academic performance**. A minimum **GPA** of 2.5 is required.

Dr. Patricia K. Tice Scholarship

Established in honor of Dr. Tice, long time ALHS award-winning Senior Guidance Counselor & Scholarship Chair who retired in 2013, one \$1,000.00 scholarship will be awarded to an ALHS senior who has a strong academic record, high morals, demonstrates financial need, and has been accepted to attend Iowa State University in the fall.

Under Dr. Tice's leadership, the ALHS College Bound Rails Wall was created. Dr. Tice's advocacy and tireless efforts for students resulted in ALHS students earning more than \$30M in scholarships, including a DMPS record of \$8.2M for the Class of 2010. Dr. Tice encouraged and motivated Lincoln students to be the best they can be, no matter what their field of endeavor might be.

The Erickson Family Foundation Scholarship
Established in 2015 by Miriam Erickson Brown '80
and Warren Erickson '86, one \$1,000 scholarship will
be awarded annually beginning in 2016 to a student
seeking advanced education in the field of business. A
minimum GPA of 2.5 is required. The financial need of
the applicants will also be considered.

Fuse DSM, Your Chamber of Commerce Scholarship
Established by the Des Moines East and South
Chamber of Commerce, one \$1,000 scholarship will
be awarded annually beginning in 2014 to a student
who has worked or volunteered on the south side
of Des Moines. The GPA and financial need of the
student will also be considered.

George "Skip" Timmons Memorial Scholarship Skip '53 was a lifelong advocate of Lincoln High School and "Southside Pride." He established the ALHS Alumni Foundation in 1991 with Bill Backstrom '48 and Marge White '39; and served as President of the Alumni Association from 2001 - 2003. They created the endowment fund that provides scholarships to Lincoln graduates to this day.

Established in 2019 by Marlene Timmons and family, two \$500 scholarships will be awarded to students who plan to major in nursing. A minimum **GPA** of 2.5 is required.

The Gloria Gray Scholarship

Established in 2015 by ALHS Alumni Foundation Past President **Gloria Gray '66**, two scholarships up to \$1,000 each will be awarded beginning in 2015, to students who plan to attend a **DMACC Workforce Training Academic Vocational Training Program**.

The career areas include: Business/Information Technology, Health Care, and Manufacturing/ Industrial Technology. The scholarship may be used for tuition, books and/or supplies. A minimum **GPA** of 2.5 is required. The **financial need** of the applicants will also be considered.

Howard Wayne Foust Memorial Scholarship
Established by Brenda Foust Mahannah '57 and
Stephen Mahannah '57 in memory of Brenda's father,
Howard Foust '37, one \$1,000 scholarship will be
awarded annually beginning in 2018 to a student who
excelled at sports at Lincoln. The financial need of the
applicants will also be considered. A minimum GPA of
2.5 is required.

Hugh Kent Memorial Science Scholarship
Established in 2011 in memory of Hugh Kent,
a former Biology teacher at Lincoln, one \$1,000
scholarship will be awarded annually to a student who
demonstrates a passion to learn about science and
intends to major in science at the college or university
of his/her choice. A minimum GPA of 2.0, a statement
of interest in science, and a written recommendation
from a teacher who has observed the student's growth
and interest in science are required.

The Jerry, Linda, Katelyn, Erin and Conor Crawford Scholarship

Established by Jerry '67 and Linda Crawford in honor of their children Katelyn '02, Erin '05 and Conor '08, one \$5,000 scholarship will be awarded to a student who attends Macalaster College, Skidmore College, Columbia University, Creighton University or Yale

University. The **GPA**, **financial need** and **community service** of the applicants will also be considered.

Jim & Ralph Wilson Memorial Scholarship
Established in 2009 by alumni Jim '45 and Ralph '48
Wilson, one \$1,000 scholarship is awarded annually based
on the GPA and financial need of the applicants. The
scholarship was changed to a memorial scholarship in 2018.

Leo Bridal Memorial Scholarship
Established in memory of Leo Bridal '41, by Mary Vaught,
a lifetime friend, in accordance with Leo's wishes, one \$1,000
scholarship will be awarded annually starting in 2016.
The GPA, financial need and community service of the
applicants will be considered.

The Meline Family Swimming Scholarship
Established by Matt Meline '86, one \$1,000 scholarship
will be awarded annually beginning in 2015 to a qualified
participant of the boys or girls Lincoln High swim team that
has demonstrated leadership, team support and consistent
participation on the team. A letter of recommendation from
the swim team coach is required. The financial need, academic
performance and extracurricular activities of the applicants
will also be considered. The intention to swim during one's
post-secondary education is not required.

The Myrna Newbury Agan Memorial Scholarship
Established in 2017 in memory of Myrna Newbury Agan,
Class of January, 1955, by her children; Earl Agan, Jr. '76,
Thomas S. Agan '80, and Barbara Agan Timmins, '86; one
\$500 scholarship will be awarded annually to students who
plan to pursue a degree in Education. A minimum GPA of
2.5 is required.

Nicholas J. Mancuso Scholarship

Established in 2012 by **Nicholas Mancuso '48**, and increased in 2019, one \$1,500 scholarship will be awarded annually to a student who intends to declare a major course of study in **business**. The **financial need** and **community service** of the applicants will also be considered.

Ray "Monk" and Erma Wilson Family Scholarship Established to honor the parents of Jim '45, Vivian '44, Ralph '48, and Ray '46, one \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually beginning in 2018. The scholarship will be awarded based on GPA and financial need of the applicants.

Raymond and Shirley Phillips Memorial Scholarship
Established by Raymond "Skip" Phillips '68, Pam Phillips
Brennan '66, Shirley Phillips Kunkle '68, Kirk Phillips
'71 and Candy Phillips Conlan '65, one \$1,000 scholarship
will be awarded annually beginning in 2015 to a student who
plans to pursue a major course of study in music. The GPA,
financial need and community service of the applicants will
also be considered.

Richard Hurd Scholarship

Established in 2019 by **Richard Hurd '70**, one \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually to a student who intends to major in **business**. The **career goals, financial need** and **community service** of the applicants will also be considered

Rolland Geil & Ruth Johnson Nichols Memorial Scholarship

Established in 2009 by **Ruth Johnson Nichols '42**, one scholarship has been awarded annually to benefit a student who demonstrates **great financial need**. Ruth's family is continuing this \$1,000 scholarship in memory of both Ruth and their father, **Rolland Geil '40**.

Sarg Fontanini Memorial Scholarship

Established in 2012 by the Fontanini family to honor the memory of **Sarg Fontanini '33**, one \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually to a student who demonstrates **exceptional character, solid academic performance** and **financial need**. A minimum **GPA** of 2.5 is required.

South Des Moines Sculpture Park Scholarship
Established by Phil Barber '68 and Chuck Mettler '61, one
\$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually beginning in
2015 to a student seeking advanced education in the field
of art. Applicants must submit a letter outlining why the
student is pursuing a career in art and two examples of his/her
artwork (drawing, painting or sculpture) to the Lincoln High
School art department. The South Des Moines Sculpture Park
Board of Directors will judge the submissions.

Studebaker Elementary School Scholarship

One scholarship of at least \$500 is awarded annually to a student who attended **Studebaker Elementary** for at least three years. The **GPA** and **financial need** of the applicants is also considered.

William "Bill" McKibben Memorial Scholarship
Established in 2011 in memory of Bill McKibben '53, by
his wife Shirley McKibben, one \$1,000 scholarship will
be awarded based on the GPA, community service and
financial need of the applicants.

Wolfe Family Scholarship

Established in 2012, and increased in 2019, one \$1,500 scholarship will be awarded annually based on the **GPA**, **community service** and **financial need** of the applicants. A minimum **GPA** of 2.5 is required.

Zac Bales-Henry Scholarship

Established in 2016 by **Zac Bales-Henry '05**, one \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded annually to a student with a documented learning disability who plans to pursue post-secondary education. A letter of recommendation from a teacher or staff member who has observed the student's efforts to overcome challenges is required.

As I write this message, Lincoln High School has closed our doors to students and the community for the remainder of the school year. We are working hard (as is the rest of DMPS) to prepare to deliver instruction to our students online for grades K-12. This is a tremendous undertaking, yet exceptionally important to the health and

safety of our students, staff, and community members.

As you know, we brought back the 9th graders to the main building this year. Whereas we are a bit more crowded, the desired effect of better mentoring opportunities has been fruitful. 2020 ALUMNI HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

With the 2020 Alumni Hall of Fame inductees, we now have 117 members. If you would like to nominate an accomplished alumnus for the Alumni Hall of Fame, please submit your written nomination to Gloria Gray, ALHS Alumni Foundation, 2600 SW 9th Street, Des Moines, IA 50315. Please include a detailed description of what the nominee has accomplished since graduating from Lincoln, including career successes, community service, and service to Lincoln High.

The 2020 Alumni Hall of Fame inductees are all graduates of the ALHS Class of 1964:



Douglas J. Barakat went to Simpson College where he majored in Business, and graduated in 1968. He worked at American Republic Insurance Company for 38 years, retiring as Senior Vice President, Chief Operating Officer of ARS, a subsidiary of American Republic. He

currently has his own consulting firm in Colorado.

While at Simpson, Doug was a member of Alpha Tau Omega Fraternity, and served as its president. He was later presented with the fraternity's Loyalty award in 1994, and was placed on the Wall of Fame in 2018. Doug lettered in football and was named captain of the team his senior year. Doug and his wife Mary received the Simpson Alumni Loyalty Award and served as National Alumni Chairpersons in the "Secure the Promise for Simpson" campaign, the most successful fundraising campaign in the college's history.

Doug first served on the Simpson Board of Trustees when he was an ex-officio trustee by virtue of his office as President of the Alumni Association Board of Directors 1990-92. He was then elected an alumni representative to the board 1997-2003, being elected a regular trustee in May 2003. Fellow trustees elected him treasurer of the board in 2001 and he served in that capacity until 2007. Doug's committee work for the board was extensive during his seventeen years as a trustee - business and finance, audit, academic affairs, executive, investment, audit and compliance, and resource management, and chairing audit and compliance for six years.

Doug has become a Lifetime Honorary Member of the Simpson College Board of Trustees.

Doug has been involved with and supported United Way. He was also active at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Des Moines and served on its board of governors for many years.



Clarence "Laddie" Jobe joined the Navy after high school. After his Navy service, he joined the Des Moines Police Department. During his 33-year career with the Des Moines Police Department, he moved up through the ranks, spending much time in working on crimes against persons.

Laddie attended and graduated from the FBI Academy, Quantico, Virginia, after which he continued to work on homicide cases, and additionally took on recruiting and training new officers at the Des Moines Regional Police Academy. His ongoing homicide work included solving some of the highest profile cases of his time: the murder of three teen boys who were shot and killed while cleaning a downtown building; the Drake Diner killings; the torture and murder of two elderly women; and the case of a murdered infant found in a garbage can. A 1995 *CITYVIEW* headline stated that Des Moines homicide cops rank among the nation's best when it comes to finding solutions.

Jobe spoke to many community groups about being safe, from crime and drugs, and to parent groups about drugs on the street. His last role at DMPD was a Lieutenant in the Narcotics and Vice Department. He received many

accolades from the Drug Enforcement Agency, FBI, U.S. Attorney, U.S. Marshall, and U.S. Postal Inspectors, for his integrity and leadership, and reflecting a career of protecting and serving his community.

In retirement he serves on several police boards and committees, continuing to serve his community.



Judy Lewis went on to graduate from University of Iowa with a BS in Sociology and with Honors and High Distinction, and where she was Class President. She graduated from Yale with a master's degree in Sociology. She then began her life's work in Community Medicine and Pediatrics at

the University of Connecticut School of Medicine, where she is now Emeritus Professor.

Judy has always been passionate about improving health and services to low income and vulnerable communities in the United States and around the world. She created one of the first models for school health programs in the country, providing health and dental care to children in Hartford, CT one of the country's poorest cities. The model expanded to the entire public school system serving 24,000 children for a period of 35 years.

Judy began working in global health in 1984, beginning in Sri Lanka where she spent a sabbatical year learning about women's reproductive health and access to family planning. Judy has worked in more than 50 countries conducting research, training and evaluation. She helped develop the Global Health Program at the medical school and directed it for 10 years. Her longest commitment has been to Haiti where she has worked continuously for 30 years. In Haiti, she has worked to address maternal and child health, pneumonia, post-disaster (earthquake and hurricanes) needs, cholera and breast cancer.

Judy has held many leadership positions at the university, in Hartford, the state of Connecticut, nationally and internationally.



R. Michael Williams, MD graduated from Yale with a BA in Culture and Behavior, from Yale with a master's degree in Microbiology, from Harvard Medical School with an MD, and from Harvard Graduate School with a PhD in Immunology.

Mike's career began in his pre-doctoral training as a research associate, assistant and fellow, at the University of Iowa, Yale, and Harvard. Mike's employment has represented a growing and expanding knowledge of neurology and medical oncology, with over 46 years of diverse experience, in hospital and medical school settings, in private practice and as a consultant. He has developed affiliations with many hospitals and cancer centers, including Doctors Medical Center, Memorial Medical Center, and Oak Valley District Hospital. He also cooperates with other doctors and physicians in medical groups. For the past decade, Mike has been the Medical Oncologist for the Northern California Cancer Center, and Director of Northern California Cancer Center and Research Institute. He is

Mike has been principal investigator in many grants for cancer related studies, has served on many boards and review panels, is a member of many professional medical oriented organizations, and has been published numerous times. He has been a professor, a medical director and chief medical director, and a medical oncologist, and has received many honors and awards, from Yale, Harvard, the American Cancer Society, and from other organizations. Over the past several decades, Mike has dedicated his life to help people survive and heal.

The 2020 Athletic Hall of Fame inductees are:



Lowell Reed

Lowell Reed grew up in Guthrie Center, Iowa. In 1953 he graduated from Simpson College with a degree in math and physical education. Lowell was active in sports at Simpson lettering in football, basketball and track; and excelled in track, winning Iowa Conference championships in

both the 100 and 220 yard dashes. He later earned a Masters Degree from Truman State University, Maryville, Missouri. In 1953 Lowell started a 39-year career in secondary education as a math teacher, coach, and athletic director. He joined Lincoln High School in 1964 where his career spanned 28 years. He taught math and was on the football and basketball coaching staffs for six years. In 1970 he was appointed Athletic Director and held that position for 19 years. One of the most significant improvements in our athletic program occurred in the late 1970s when a full slate of sports for girls was added which included cross country, volleyball, basketball, gymnastics, track and softball. Prior to this time girls sports were limited to golf, tennis, and swimming. He was an early member of the Iowa High School Athletic Directors Association. He served as Central District Director of

the IHSADA from 1985-1987 and was Central District Athletic Director of the Year 1987-88. He was later inducted into the IHSADA Hall of Fame.



Josh Kline '99

When Josh graduated from Lincoln, he had finished a five-year stretch as one of the most accomplished, record-setting baseball players in the history of Lincoln. Josh was a member of the 1998 State Championship team and the starting pitcher in the final game, pitching five 1/3 innings. During his time on the

Lincoln baseball team, Josh was 1997 2nd Team All-Conference, 1998 Super Team All-State, 1999 1st Team All-State and member of the IBCA All Star Team. He also played Football for three years and Basketball for two years. After high school Josh attended and played baseball at Indian Hills College. In 2015 Josh joined Lincoln as a campus monitor and was recently named Head Baseball Coach for the Railsplitters. Josh's parents are **Joyce** and **George**, a 20-year baseball coach at Lincoln.
